# HAWAIAN-BASED JEWELRY COMPANY DEPO MARKET PROMOTING INDEPENDENT LIFESTYLE CHOICES FOR ADULTS WITH AUTISM AND OTHER DISABILITIES

Depo Market CEO Tiffany Chou (pictured, right) is joined by her brother Chris (left) in amplifying a message of hope, determination, and empowerment to adults with disabilities who are seeking viable employment opportunities.

Depo Market, a notable Hawaiian-based jewelry and accessories line staffing several adults with disabilities, is resonating in the hearts and minds of countless TikTok users as many of their videos have been averaging over 1 million views, totaling 4.5 million overall likes on their popular page.

Sought-after jewelry designer Tiffany Chou founded Depo Market with the intention of providing a better, more independent life for her adopted brother Chris-- who is autistic-- and other determined adults like him. Another way she has empowered his independence is by investing in the Amazon Alexa product, and she shares how the device has assisted with managing his daily routines

Family serves as the foundation of Depo Market and the primary reason for its existence. Chou, a prominent jewelry designer whose eclectic work has been featured internationally in Vogue, Cosmopolitan, and Sports Illustrated Swimsuit Edition, retired from her lucrative career in New York to join her brother Chris in conceptualizing the family-operated business. Chou and Chris, both adopted from South Korea and Cambodia respectively, prioritize their connectivity in translating their mission- providing outlets for independence to adults with disabilities.



"The goal of Depo Market is to provide as many jobs as possible to other adults in the community that are in similar situations as my brother," said Chou, founder of Depo Market. "He wants to work but hasn't been given the same opportunities as everyone else. This is a chance for people like Chris to be front and center and show everyone that just because they might do things a little differently doesn't mean they can't do it."

When asked about her motivation, Chou explains, "The largest minority group in the world is people with disabilities. No matter where someone falls on the spectrum of abilities, if they have a disability, it usually makes it a lot harder to find employment. I want to show our community and other businesses how important including people with disabilities is. Learning from someone that is different from you can only make you a better person, and in turn make your business stronger."


Though National Autism Awareness
Month was observed in April 2023, Chou is
committed to spreading the word about the
invaluable benefits of professionals with
disabilities and those on the spectrum and
encourages other companies to embrace a
more socially responsible mission to add them
to their teams. "Chris and I have always had a

special bond, and I am so proud of his accomplishments and impressed by all the ideas he adds to our family business," said Chou. "We hope to inspire others to visit our online store, peruse our unique jewelry designs within our diverse product line, and show others that there is always hope and anything is possible."

Chou is also pleased to announce plans to open the brand's official storefront location in Wailuku, Maui within the next few months. She and Chris have been working tirelessly to conceptualize the floor layout and product inventory in time to open the doors at the request of residents. She also states that hiring adults with disabilities will become a mainstay team-building element of this family-owned business.



estival at-a-glance: Weekend One presents headliner and 5x Grammy Winner, Dianne Reeves, one of the pre-eminent jazz vocalists in the world. Choreographer and tap prodigy Caleb Teicher joins piano virtuoso Conrad Tao creating magic onstage in "Counterpoint," their second national tour exploring the intersections between their artistic worlds. Mark O'Connor, a musical genius considered by many to be "the most influential fiddle player ever" is joined by his wife Maggie O'Connor is what promises to be a memorable close to the weekend.

"Song of the Year" honors from Billboard magazine, the All-Stars again move the musical bar and paint a vivid portrait of their musical journey with all the colors and moods that have come to define one of the genre's most lasting and relevant bands. 

## The Little Mermaid

t's not Rob Marshall's fault that Disney's latest live-action retread doesn't really sing. "The Little Mermaid," a drab undertaking with sparks of bioluminescence, suffers from the same issues that plagued "The Lion King," "Aladdin" and "Beauty and the Beast." Halle Bailey might be a lovely presence and possesses a superb voice, but photorealistic fins, animals and environments do not make Disney fairy tales more enchanting.

The essential problem is that the live-action films have prioritized nostalgia over visual storytelling. They try to recreate shots from animated predecessors, ignoring the possibility that musical sequences and choices were enchanting because they were animated.

There was, in the 1989 film, a sparkling awe. The underwater castle. The mermaids. Eric's ship. Even Ariel's bright red hair. Combined with wonderful songs and lyrics by Alan Menken and Howard Ashman, it's not hard to understand why it fueled a Disney Animation renaissance.

Anyone who has gone through Disney's live-action library would be right to approach "The Little Mermaid" with caution. Still, there's excitement as the camera takes us underwater — even after



a ominous quote from Hans Christian Anderson that begins the movie. You can't help but be hopeful. Flounder (Jacob Tremblay, who also voiced Luca) doesn't have this problem as much, mainly because once they go out of the water he's essentially hidden under the surface. Daveed Digg's Sebastian gets off easy, looking the most pleasantly cartoonish. But then there's that Jamaican accent that they decided to carry over (and this in a movie that adds a line about consent to "Kiss the Girl").

Visibility is a problem for more than just Flounder, too. Sometimes "The Little Mermaid's" underwater sequences just look too underwater. Things are cloudy and dull and hard to see, once again probably in the name of authenticity, but straining to see what Marshall and the scores of VFX teams have labored on for years is not a pleasant experience. This could be a projection issue -I wasn't in an especially high-tech theater with color enhancing upgrades. But that also means anyone without access to things like Dolby Vision around the world will have this issue, too. When Sebastian brings out the most colorful fish he can find for the "Under the Sea" number, you even start to empathize with Ariel a little bit. It is the exact opposite of the "Avatar: The Way of Water" experience.

# Spider-Man Across the Spider-Verse

et's get this upfront: "Spider-Man: Into the Spider-Verse" was the best comic-book film of the last decade.

With animation straight from the pages of comics, "Into the Spider-Verse" took a supercollider to the superhero movie. Solemnity was out. Gone was the chosen one. Spider-Man could be anyone, including a graffiti-tagging kid from Brooklyn. The possibilities were limitless.

So a lot to live up to. Yet the Spider-verse is still expanding. "Spider-Man: Across the Spider-Verse" is the rare sequel that dazzles as much as the original. Colors drip, invert and splatter in a pop-art swirl.

If "Into the Spider-Verse" reveled in the collision of universes, "Across the Spider-Verse" turns the multiverse blender up a notch. Worlds bump into each other like shoppers in a bodega. Spider-Men and Spider-Women tumble like



unloaded clown cars. This frenetic, freewheeling thing dares you keep up with it.

But despite all that, "Across the Spider-Verse" is grounded as a coming-of-age tale. The flair of writers-producers Phil Lord and Christopher Miller,

who penned the script with David Callaham, lies in how they detonate convention.

The directing team has been swapped out. Joaquim Dos Santos, Kemp Powers and Justin K. Thompson take the reins, which finds Miles Morales (Shameik Moore) now a 15-year-old with a handle on his powers. He's less adept, though, at communicating with his parents, Jefferson (Brian Tyree Henry) and Rio (Luna Lauren Vélez), who don't know their

son's secret identity and are growing concerned about his strange behavior.

Similar issues bedevil Gwen Stacy (Hailee Steinfeld), who by revealing to her father (Shea Whigham) that she's Spider-Woman has caused a huge rift.

When Miles and Gwen, stuck apart, meet again and swing in tandem through New York, they're less romantically linked than they are a couple of teenagers whose parents

don't understand. When they sit together, on a ledge on the Williamsburgh Savings Bank Tower, gazing at Manhattan, hazy and blue, the lingering image encapsulates a downside-up movie franchise.

In its chaotic way, "Across the Spider-Verse" keeps playing with these notions. Miles and Gwen, rightly, feel exceptional — that their problems are

unique. But the movie reinforced that, yes, they're supremely talented, but, no, they're far from alone. "T'm Spider-Woman," Gwen says when a pregnant superhero (Issa Rae) peels in. "Me, too," she replies.

This being a "Spider-Verse" movie, though, there more than just a few Spider-Men lurking. There are actually gobs of them, each from some parallel world. The portals start opening thanks to The Spot (Jason Schwartzman), a supervillain-in-training. But Spot's powers grow, bringing the attention of the Spider-Society. Some of them are cool — Daniel Kahunya's Spider-Punk. Others, like Miguel O'Hara (Oscar Isaac), are more serious.

When worlds start colliding, storylines get upset. Anything goes in these multiverse, but, there is Canon that needs to be obeyed. Certain foundational narrative beats must occur, in some form, for every Spider-Man.

When Miles tests these tenets, he brings about a battle across the Spider-Verse. The danger in all these crisscrossing dimensions is that no reality seems to mean that much. By multiplying worlds and Spider-Men, "Across the Spider-Verse" risks making itself dizzy. Yet it surprisingly, stays true to the teenage emotions at its core. It's the first Marvel movie that I felt in the theater a palpable disappointment that it was over.

## **Aerosmith Announces Farewell Tour** Starting In September

"We're opening up Pandora's Box one last time to present our fans with the Peace Out tour," Tyler

#### THE DIRTY SHIRLY

If you find yourself craving a cocktail with a nostalgic twist, the Dirty Shirley may be the way to go. It is an alcoholic version of the iconic Shirley Temple mocktail, and a perfect sweet treat during the summertime.

The Shirley Temple is a childhood staple, with its pink color and ultra-sweet flavor. It has been appealing to anyone with a sweet tooth for nearly a century, reports USA Today. Better Homes and Gardens states that the rising popularity of the Dirty Shirley cocktail may be thanks to Millennial and Gen Z drinkers wanting to put a grown-up spin on a childhood classic now that they are adults.

Though the original drink is heavily sweetened, Better Homes and Gardens states that the addition of alcohol in the cocktail may help cut down on the overall sweetness, making it a more enjoyable drink for those who would prefer to cut back on the sugar.

The Shirley Temple — named for the child actress of the early 1900s — was created when the star desired an upscale nonalcoholic drink on par with cocktails that the adults around her were drinking on her birthday party that took place in 1932, reports Make Me a Cocktail. She was presented with a mix of ginger ale and grenadine, topped with a cherry. Though she reportedly did not enjoy it much and later filed lawsuits against a company wanting to bottle it using her name, the moniker stuck and so did the iconic drink (via TIME).

Though the origins of the Dirty Shirley are a bit unclear, reports InsideHook, it is undoubtedly linked to the mocktail. The publication states that Chasen's, formerly of West Hollywood, laid claim to the original

mocktail, though Shirley Temple herself cited it as the Brown Derby restaurant in Hollywood. As the drink grew in popularity, bartenders experimented by adding an alcoholic twist for the adult crowd, but it has not been definitively pinpointed as to which specific bar invented the actual Dirty Shirley.

How to make a Dirty Shirley

A traditional Shirley Temple is typically made using lemon-lime soda, lime juice, and grenadine to give it that iconic red color (via Delish). Some recipes swap the lemon-lime soda for ginger ale, while others even include orange juice, reports Savor the Flavour. To finish it off, maraschino cherries are used as a garnish and for some added sweetness.

A Dirty Shirley is the alcoholic version of this, adding into the recipe vodka (via New York Times Cooking). Mix the vodka with a splash of grenadine over ice, and then mix it all in with the soda. Of course, you should still top it with that iconic maraschino cherry, which pairs well with liquor. To add an extra

dimension of flavor, try adding a splash of a different fruit juice for a fresh burst.

Any way you choose to customize it, the Dirty Shirley is a throwback to a childhood classic.

#### TO NAME A FEW MORE...

There is more to a cocktail than just a twist of an orange peel or a tiny paper umbrella. Many of the most popular cocktails in the world have a story behind them. These beloved cocktails have a social scene and they have become a part of today's culture. Here are the origin stories of some of the most favorite summer cocktails:

#### PIÑA COLADA

The origins of Piña Colada are hotly debated. It's origins date back to the 1800s. The oldest claim is linked to pirate Roberto Cofresí in Puerto Rican. Supposedly, he served his crew a cocktail of rum, pineapple, and coconut to boost morale. However, the most popular and widely accepted origin story of this cocktail comes from the Caribe Hilton's Beachcomber Bar located in San Juan. It is said that in 1954, the head bartender of the hotel was asked to create a drink to satisfy the appetites of visiting Hollywood

celebrities and hence, Piña Colada was made.

#### OTILOM

Unlike other summer cocktails, the origins of mojito are not in dispute. It was first crafted in Havana, Cuba. The recipe mixes soda water, lime juice, mint, sugar cane juice, and white rum. The recipe may have evolved from the practice of local South American Indians that involves using ingredients as healing frequencies and healing drink. The restaurant La Bodeguita del Medio claims to have made the new popular recipe.

#### MAITAI

The legendary cocktail Mai Tai was created in 1944 by Trader Vic and its original recipe is still used even today. The origin of the drink's name is also well-known.

According to Vic, he created the cocktail to highlight an aged Jamaican rum and served it to his couple of friends visiting from Tahiti. Upon drinking it, one of them described it as "mai tai". It is a Tahitian slang that simply refers to the expression "awesome".

## Cheese Wisdom and The Legendary California Cheese Trail.

When cheese is aged by the professionals, the process looks quite different. The aging of Parmigiano Reggiano, for instance, "takes place under the strict supervision of the producer who regulates humidity and temperature," explains Robuschi. After 12 months, the Consortium's experts test each wheel, tapping it with a hammer and listening for defects that could compromise the quality if it were aged further.

The oldest Parmigiano you'll find in the U.S. market is five years, and that's rare. Two- or three-year wheels are more

common, but still hard to find.

In Wisconsin, cheesemakers sometimes go even further in aging their products. "We like a very slow cure to bring out the flavors," says Tony Hook, cheesemaker and co-owner with wife Julie of Hook's Cheese Company in Mineral Point. Hook's just released a 20-year cheddar, retailing at \$209 per pound. Though the company's 20-year batch is rare — less than 1 percent of production — Hook's regularly sells 10-, 12-, and 15-year cheddars.

To age its cheese, Hook's vacuum seals it and then puts it in a cardboard box with a

wooden liner. It stays at about 38 degrees throughout the aging process. "I test one block along the way to make sure it's developing the flavor like I want," says Hook. The company's older cheddars have less acidity, and fruitier, nuttier flavors. Texturally, they are both smooth and crunchy, flecked with calcium lactate crystals from the aging process.

"Most people, especially restaurants, prefer the price of a younger cheddar," says Hook, who has been making cheese for 50 years. "Once or twice in a lifetime, they're willing to spend the kind of money for a very aged cheese."

Is very aged cheese worth the price? Perhaps. There is something special about tasting something that old. The flavors of Hook's 20-Year Cheddar are exaggerated, and the texture is both cartoonishly crunchy and surprisingly smooth. Age is never the ultimate indicator of quality, but special cheese is special cheese.



\*15 - 30 seconds of rest in between movements depending on your recovery time. If the length of time is too much for any of the movements, do the best you can do for as long as you see fit.

HIIT - This high intensity interval workout means that you should be working as hard as you can during each movement in order to get your heart rate up.

#### Circuit 1

High Knees - 1 Minute
Butt Kicks - 1 Minute
Tuck Jumps - 1 Minute
Jumping Jacks - 1 Minute
Water Walk - 1 minute (break
time - grab water if you need it)

\*Repeat circuit 2 times.

#### Circuit 2

Side Shuffle Right - 30 Seconds Side Shuffle Left - 30 Seconds Tread Water Legs Only - 1 Minute (if you don't know how to tread water, substitute squat jumps instead)

Chest Flys - 1 Minute (arms under water - perform the chest fly exercise using just the resistance of the water)

Water Walk - 1 minute (break time - grab water if you need it)

\*Repeat circuit 2 times.

#### Circuit 3

Squats (as quick as you can) - 1 Minute

Water Run - 1 Minute Water Walking Lunges - 1 Minute

Water High Knee Skip - 1 Minute Water Walk - 1 Minute (break time - grab water if you need it) \*Repeat circuit 2 times.

Warm Down - Water jog - 2 minutes, Water walk - 2 to 5 minutes depending on how long it takes to bring your heart rate down.

The sculpture is on display at Mars Wrigley UK's headquarters in Slough.

A visitor at Wonderland amusement park in Toronto, Ontario, was filled with more than wonder as he rode the Leviathan roller coaster on May 16, the Toronto Sun reported. Hubert Hsu of Toronto said as his coaster car neared the top of one of the ride's loops, it collided with a bird -- possibly a pigeon. "I looked down and saw blood on my hands and my face," Hsu said. The bridge crosses over CSX railroad tracks, which require a minimum of 23 feet of vertical clearance, and it was built 1 1/2 inches too short. CSX has halted the remaining construction to complete the bridge, according to a Maryland Department of Transportation engineer. "I understand you get hiccups, but ... this is not a hiccup. This is a mistake. Somebody needs to be held accountable and it needs to be taken care of," said resident Desiree Collins, "You have engineers. This should not have happened." The State Highway Administration now estimates completion in late 2023 or early

## The **Importance** Of Baby Sign Language

naby sign language, a gesture-based communication designed to interact with newborns, has grown in popularity. It assists babies in expressing their wants and desires. Specialists think that by removing the barrier between a child's way of communicating, outbursts may be prevented.

Toddlers as young as five to six months may acquire the fundamental signals that includes items



or ideas like "hunger," "milk," "drinking," "tired," "warm." "cool." "play." "bathroom." and "soft toy."

The skill to express simple things creates a link to spoken words. It can aid in the development of spoken and textual modes of interaction. Advantages of Sign Language for Infants

The following are advantages of teaching your children signing: The higher capability of grasping verbal language, particularly between the ages of one and two; Faster usage of verbal communication; Early usage of sentence form: Reduction in toddlers screaming; Improved parent-child relationship; IQ boost; Signing enhances learning experience.

Most sign language using families claimed young children could express more throughout key periods, even feelings. Every parent understands. It can be tough to know why the kid is acting like they do. Gestures allow the kid to convey themselves.

#### The Best Way to Teach Toddler Sign Language

Create the sign every time you utter a phrase. The secret is dedication and perseverance: Utter the phrase "milk" and make the "milk" gesture each time you offer milk.

Specialists advise whichever gestures parents choose to introduce must be utilized in

combination with talking loudly. It is essential to display the gesture and utter the word.

Never get disheartened if the infant does not replicate a gesture immediately. You'll have to show it several times over several days.

#### Tips To Help You Teach Faster

Start by displaying a few symbols: It will be simple for parents to recall when to show gestures and execute those regularly. Begin with words you believe are beneficial, such as "eating," "drinking," or "sleeping."

Consistently speak the words that the gesture represents: Gestures should serve as a link to spoken communication. Use the gesture whenever you say that term it represents.

Don't be too fast: Toddlers acquire by repeating. When you're questioning the kid whether he's thirsty, use the "drink" gesture as well as the phrase the query in a unique manner: "Do you want anything to eat?" "Would you like to have food?" etc. When creating a gesture for a thing, indicate it, state the location, and do the procedure thrice more.

After several weeks of focusing the initial signals, broaden the toddler's vocabulary using gestures of items that excite him. Kids take quickly and like making gestures for items or people they adore, like books, toys, dolls, caps, even pets.

# Modern Child **Prodigies**

ost of us aspire to reach excellence. Some reach the peak during adulthood, but some are so talented during childhood that they are comparable or even superior to adults. Mikaela Fudolig

Mikaela Irene Fudolig entered the University of the Philippines at 11 years old. She graduated summa cum laude in Bachelor of Science in Physics at age 16, and she was the valedictorian of her graduating class. She is currently a PhD student and professor at the same university—with interest in econophysics, mathematical modeling of behavior in systems, and biological systems. Akrit Pran Jaswal

India's Akrit Pran Jaswal became known when he performed his first surgery—at seven years old. Though he wasn't a doctor, he was considered a medical genius. The surgery was on the hands of an eight-year-old burn victim, and Akrit separated the fingers. He entered medical university at age 12, and by age 17 he was working on an Master's Degree in Applied Chemistry.

Today, he is working on finding a cure for cancer. **Taylor Wilson** 

Taylor Ramon Wilson is the youngest person to build a working fusor: a device designed to create nuclear fusion. He built a bomb at age 10 and the fusor at age 14. In 2011, he won the Intel International Science and Engineering Fair for his radiation detector. In 2013, he spoke at the TED 2013 conference about his ideas on self-contained underground nuclear fission reactors. He designed a compact nuclear reactor that would generate 50 megawatts of power and would need to be refueled only once every 30 years.

#### Cameron Thompson

Cameron Thompson is a math prodigy from Wales. When he was four, he corrected his teacher about her claim that zero is the lowest number, saying she forgot negative numbers. He began studying his degree in mathematics at the Open University at age 11. And at the same age, he passed two GCSEs in math and GCE Advanced Level math, and was featured in BBC's "The Growing Pains of a Teenage Genius." Cameron is a mathematical genius.

#### **Jacob Barnett**

Jacob Barnett is an American mathematician. When he was two, he was diagnosed with autism. Doctors said that he might not talk, read, or become independent. Jacob proved doctors wrong when he was able to recite the alphabet forwards and backwards-at three. At the same age, while visiting a planetarium, Jacob answered the presenter's question of why the moons of Mars are oddly shaped. He enrolled at Indiana University-Purdue University Indianapolis at 10. He has asserted that he might one day disprove Einstein's Theory of Relativity. He is working on his PhD in Quantum Physics. March Tian Boedihardjogo

March Tian Boedihardjogo was born in Hong Kong and is the youngest person to enroll at Hong Kong university at nine years. He finished his A-levels, maintaining A's in advanced mathematics courses and a B in Statistics. He also gained eight GCSE's, which he took at the same time as his A-levels. He participated in a specially-designed double-degree program, Bachelor of Science in Mathematical Science and Master of Philosophy in Mathematics, which he completed in 2011—one year earlier than the designed curriculum. He is currently studying for a PhD in Mathematics. Priyanshi Somani

Priyanshi Somani is a mental calculator from India. She started mental calculation at the age of six, and by age 11 she was the youngest participant at the Mental Calculation World Cup of 2010-which she won. She bested 36 other competitors from 16 countries. She won first place by solving the square root of 10 six-digit numbers in a record-breaking 6 minutes 51 seconds. To top it off, she was the only participant to have 100 percent accuracy in addition, multiplication, and square roots in the history of the competition. She became the new world-record holder in mental square roots on January 2012 when she calculated the square root of

10 six-digit numbers in 2 minutes 43 seconds.



#### Akim Camara

Akim Camara is a violinist prodigy in Berlin. He began playing at the age of two and displayed a remarkable memory in the music he heard while still in diapers. His instructor noted his natural "ear for music" and began teaching the two-year-old twice a

week. He learned to play exceptionally quickly after only six months, and made his debut performance in 2003—at the age of three—at a Christmas concert. **Ethan Bortnick** 

KIDS FORUM

Ethan Bortnick is a musician, songwriter, and actor. When he was three, he began playing the keyboard and at age five, he began composing music. His debut was on The Tonight Show with Jay Leno in 2007, and he has had numerous performances. He is a Guiness World Record holder as the world's youngest solo musician to headline his own tour. He is also the youngest headliner to ever play Las Vegas. Matthew Abraham

Matthew Abraham is among the youngest members of Mensa, which he joined when he was four. He showed genius at four months, when he began browsing childrens books and answering questions about them. Upon entering Mensa, he scored a high 99.9 percentile on the standardized IQ test. At five years old, he finished math courses offered by Stanford University's Education Program for Gifted Youth in six months. He is already taking high school and college courses and has maintained a grade point average of 4.0 in all of his college courses and was inducted in the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society. He also publishes essays on NASA's Lunar Science website.
