## **BLACKLIST: THE HOLLYWOOD RED SCARE**

# AT THE SKIRBALL CULTURAL CENTER BEGINNING MAY 4TH

In October 1947, the House Un-American Activities Committee (HUAC) called Hollywood figures to testify about allegations of communist propaganda in American films. Although the committee never found evidence of Communist propaganda, ten of the writers and directors called to testify were held in contempt of Congress, fined and sentenced to prison. Hollywood's power players responded to the proceedings by creating a self-imposed blacklist of those "Hollywood Ten" and others implicated in the proceedings. With that, the film industry became the first mass-employer to adopt a blacklist as a policy to be used against employees whose political beliefs

ran counter to prevailing orthodoxies.

Blacklist: Hollywood's Red Scare sparks reflection, conversation and engagement regarding civil liberties and patriotism in the 21st

Century using the counterpoint of a time in which art, artistic expression and speech were no longer protected.

Blacklist: The Hollywood Red Scare is a multi-sensory exhibit that explores the intersection of politics, art, economics, and the social dynamics that impacted the American First Amendment rights of speech, religion, and assembly during Hollywood's Red Scare. Through personal

narratives of those who were blacklisted, members of House Un-American Activities Committee or HUAC, and film executives, Blacklist examines the shifting definition of what it meant and means to be a patriotic American. Explore the history and impact of the Hollywood Red Scare and its contemporary implications for civil liberties, propaganda, and shifting definitions of American patriotism.

Now making its West Coast debut at the Skirball Cultural Center with newly added artifacts, Blacklist: The Hollywood Red Scare shines a spotlight on the proceedings, investigations, motives, and choices of those caught in the crosshairs—including the many Jewish creatives and executives who suffered under and enforced the blacklist.

The result is an emotionally complex and compelling exhibition that demonstrates how the

politics of Hollywood can shape the entire country.

Blacklist: The Hollywood Red Scare was originally curated by Jewish Museum Milwaukee and was on display at the Museum 2018-2019.

New last month! Casa Madera (https://thecasamadera.com/) wows with dreamy views atop the Mondrian West Hollywood Hotel, in a coastal-casual setting and bold Mexican Riviera cuisine with French and Japanese influences. Think Mayan Hummus, with chickpea, tahini, lemon, olive tapenade and Aleppo pepper. Yucatan Chop salad of romaine, white bean, sweet corn, jicama, Campari tomato, queso fresco, chile shallot vinaigrette and crispy tortilla strips. And mains like Pacifico Striped Bass, with

fennel citrus salad, salsa trio and corn tortillas, or Fire Grilled Ribeye of 10 oz wagyu ribeye, parsnip puree, roasted garlic, potato pave, red wine jus and bone marrow. Hours 5-10:30 p.m., Sunday to Wednesday. 5 p.m. -12:30 a.m., Thursday to Saturday.

End with Loria's Flower Pressed Shortbread Cookies made in Montecito with handpicked edible flowers and herbs pressed into vanilla shortbread. 



# ON SCREEN

# John Wick

trip to Paris should be on everyone's bucket list, even John Wick. The un-retired assassin does dive into the City of Lights in "John Wick: Chapter 4."

When we last saw Wick, he was half dead in the gutter after being shot and tumbling several stories off the Hotel Continental in New York. He was on the blacklist with a \$14 million price on his head.

Wick, as always played with monosyllabic and brooding intensity by Keanu Reeves, leaves his trail of death, but there's a shift. So often the prey, Wick is on the offense, taking his demands to The High Table, the group of crime lords that keep order.

The Table's sadistic frontman is a dandy called the Marquis, played by Bill Skarsgård, who spouts things like: "Second chances are the refuge of men who fail." But he's a secret coward.

Wick wants to end his nightmare by killing everyone. His frenemy, Ian McShane's Winston, challenges him to think differently: "Have you learned nothing?" he asks. "You'll run out of bullets before they run out of heads."

Writer Shay Hatten, along with co-writer Michael Finch, have come up with a solution for Wick: Win an old-fashioned duel with the Marquis.

Not so fast. Wick must handle the blind martial arts master Caine, played by Donnie Yen, bringing humor and verve to a fighter who is tasked with slaving his friend or have his daughter killed.

There's also Killa, a card shark played by martial arts star Scott Adkins, and The Tracker, a talented bounty hunter played by Shamier Anderson. Don't forget a swarm of Paris-based amateur bounty-hunters and armored ninjas.

All the touches you expect from a Wick flick are here — a dog, hand-to-hand combat, candles and Christian iconography, horses, metal swords and a new way to hurt someone, in this case, a playing card. We visit Germany, Japan and end in France.

Director Chad Stahelski loves combining neon with gloom and now has the budget to rent space in the Louvre. Of the 14 action sequences — a few are truly mind-blowing, like a fight in the middle of the traffic circle



around the Arc de Triomphe and a drone capturing a complicated set piece.

If there was a slog through would-be assassins in "John Wick: Chapter 3" there is none here. One sequence on outdoor stairs in Paris is almost riotously funny as knives and guns blast away, while the filmmakers add water and fire to a nightchub scene.

A shout-out to costume designer Paco Delgado, who has outfitted the baddie gunmen in light-colored three-piece suits and combat boots.

How does this all end? On something of a deflating note. Earlier in the film, Wick's friend Shimazu — played by Hiroyuki Sanada — had asked a question that hangs over this franchise: "Have you given any thought to how this ends?"

This chapter ends in death, of course. But that's also how it lives.

# Moving On

he pairing of Jane Fonda and Lily Tomlin is not a novelty. Seven seasons of "Grace and Frankie" and the movie "80 for Brady" has spoiled us a little. And, unfortunately, second-act movies with Hollywood legends have a very hit or miss track record.

But don't let those facts dissuade you from "Moving On," which was written and directed by Paul Weitz. This is one of those films that balances a darkly comedic conceit with emotional resonance, allowing Fonda, Tomlin and co-stars Malcolm McDowell and Richard Roundtree to actually act.

It begins with a funeral. We never meet the deceased, but it brings the main characters back together. Fonda is Claire, a devoted dog mom and grandmother, who travels from Ohio to California to say goodbye to her college

friend. But she has something else cooking. When she arrives and greets the widower (McDowell), she doesn't offer sympathies, but instead says, "Howard, I'm going to kill you. I'm going to do it this weekend."

Something happened many years ago with Howard and Claire, while his wife was out of town. It's not spelled out until an emotional scene near the end, but you know it is long before then. She only ever told Evvie (Tomlin). The police would have just wondered why she was alone with her best friend's husband. And she knew that telling her friend would have ruined her life. So, she did nothing.

Tomlin spins gold out of every line. Her entrance involves stumbling into the chapel, onto the stage where Howard is delivering a eulogy for his wife.



"Everyone, this is Evelyn. Evelyn was Joyce's college roommate, believe it or not," he says.

"Why wouldn't they believe it," Tomlin deadpans.

Everyone is lying to themselves and each other and the death of someone they were close to has given way to secrets and truths. Evvie has her own confession, but maybe one that's better saved for her to reveal.

There is a natural queasiness to any film that tries to mine laughs out of revenge murders but

"Moving On" handles this. It's never too arch or silly and it is, ultimately, about an event that ruined Claire's life.

McDowell is great as a grouchy, unrepentant jerk who has deluded himself that things that Evelyn or Claire is telling him could possibly have any truth. It would be easy to play Howard as simply evil, but McDowell keeps his feet on the ground and

allows for some humanity, in spite of everything.

"Moving On" is certainly not perfect, but it's sincerely trying to be something more than your standard octogenarian farce. You might even be surprised by your own emotional investment in this rather trim film.

Hopefully performances like these will remind screenwriters, directors and those who make the decision about what gets made to give our living legends good roles while we still have them. The actors are still game, and hopefully audiences are too.

## **Kendra & The Bunnies**

If you are looking for a unique sound then look no further than the musical stylings of Kendra & The Bunnies. Founding member Kendra Muecke, rocks with vocals, rhythm guitar, piano, and of course, her creative songwriting. The band also includes Bill Scott and Trent Berry on lead guitar, Troy Berry, Blake Ritterman, Garrett Morris on drums, Giuseppe Pinto on the keyboard, and Derrick Elliott on bass. Kendra & the Bunnies can be described as pop-forward rock music inspired by psychedelic folk.

Kendra always knew she wanted to be a star. She started in the performing arts at the tender age of four when she auditioned to be part of her local theatre troupe. Multiple times a week you could find her performing with the company, singing, dancing, and attending acting and vocal classes – anything creative. She left home to go to college and found her way to Pepperdine University where she further honed her craft.

In 2019 Kendra began performing as Kendra & The Bunnies. The name evolved from a few different things. Firstly, Kendra's favorite film growing up was Disney's Alice in Wonderland. She loved the idea of the white rabbit as a character. "He was so stressed out, with 'Oh my God I'm late, I'm late," she explains. "As a person with anxiety, I've always resonated

with that. But actually, he's not late – he's on time – because that's what starts the movie."

Secondly, Kendra loves 1960s music. One of her favorite bands is Jefferson Airplane and their breakout song was called "White Rabbit." "It's hypnotic and poetic," she says. "It's also very powerful — and that made me fall in love with the idea of bunnies."

Reality TV was also a factor. The Girls

Next Door, a show featuring Playboy bunny Kendra Wilkinson was popular at the time. In calling her group Kendra & The Bunnies, Kendra reclaims her name paired with bunnies

in a tongue-in-cheek sense.

Kendra & The Bunnies began with Kendra as a solo artist. She would pick up her guitar and go to local bars, and lounges. It was during one of these shows she caught the eye of promoter Troy Berry. Her promoter became her friend, who became her drummer and also became a mentor for her. He then

introduced her to her guitarist and original bassist.

Kendra plays acoustic guitar, electric guitar, piano, and the ukulele and she is a songwriter and singer. What inspires Kendra's songs? "It depends," she explains. "Whatever I am going through at the time – I write songs about it. Or a catchy melody comes to my head and I'm like I need to write that down."

Her influences include classic rock like the Grateful Dead, jam band music like Phish, pop icons such as Britney Spears, and hip-hop rockers like A Tribe Called Quest. Her biggest accomplishment is being featured in People Magazine in 2023 and winning two Josie Music Awards for Artist of the Year in 2021 and 2022. She's released multiple singles, albums, and EPs and is also a voting member for The Grammy's where her music is considered each year.

Her favorite place to perform in Los Angeles is The Viper Room in Hollywood. She has also jammed at other venues including The Mint in Los Angeles and The House of Blues in Anaheim.

Kendra is releasing a new video featuring the song "Lucky Girl" from her new EP "Of All Time." The band will also be touring at various county fairs and music festivals this summer. New music is on the horizon as Kendra has already written her next album and plans to release it next Fall. "The inspiration for my new album is Amy Winehouse, Lana Del Rey, and other Jazz singers," she says. "And the songs are all about resilience and being strong." www.kendraandthebunnies.com

## WHY WE STILL PLAY RETRO GAMES

**Easier Control System**


Once you bought a game in the old days there was nothing more to pay. Today's games have become a money magnet where people are



to get Mario past the castle to rescue the princess.











## The Santa Clarita Cowboy Festival



heard is that the person is an introvert or an extrovert.


Regardless of your inborn traits building confidence and self-esteem is considered to be a part of your character. We build our character traits by learning and changing our behaviors.

## **Your Pets and Local Wildlife**

Wildlife/pet interactions create problems for everyone. It's far easier to manage the movement and behavior of pets than those of wild animals. Supervising pets and not allowing them to roam freely are the most effective ways to prevent pet/wildlife conflicts.

We've enjoyed a special bond with cats since domesticating them some 4000 years ago. Cats arrived in North America with the colonists, and since then, their numbers have swelled. Census figures showed 60 million owned cats in the U.S. in 1990, up from 30 million in 1970. If you think your cat doesn't hunt, you are wrong, it is their instinct.

Cats are non-native predators, and every year, free-roaming cats kill and orphan millions of birds and small mammals. Cat predation hurts many species of native birds, as well as the native predators that depend on them for food. Keeping pet cats indoors is clearly the right thing to do for wildlife.

Keeping cats indoors is also best for cats! Indoor cats live far longer, healthier lives than cats who are allowed to roam (17 years vs. less than 5 years, on average). Indoor cats are sheltered from the many dangers that shorten the lives of outdoor cats—cars, getting lost, parasites and diseases, as well as human and wildlife predators.

Check out the links below for tips on how to transition your cat to a happy, healthy indoor cat.

If your cat has caught an animal, bring the animal to a wildlife rehabilitator as soon as possible. Even if you do not see an injury, there are likely tiny puncture wounds from your cat's teeth, and bacteria from your cat's

mouth will kill the animal in a day or two if it does not receive treatment.

If you are not willing or able to transition your cat into an indoor cat, please consider purchasing a collar with bells. It reduces the number of birds and other small animals that your cat can catch and hurt.

DOGS

Whether she's a pitbull or a poodle, your dog still has many of her wolf ancestors' hard-wired predatory instincts. We often see adult squirrels, fawns, and other larger mammals that have been injured by dogs.

Sometimes pets become the



prey. Predatory species such as foxes, owls, coyotes, and bobcats, or omnivores such as raccoons and bears may kill cats, rabbits, small dogs, and other pets who are allowed to roam. It is devastating to lose a pet, and this often leads to the killing of the suspected wild animal. So, when unsupervised pets are allowed to roam, both the pet and the wild animal may lose in the end.

#### HABITUATION

Wild animals may be drawn into close proximity to humans when they eat pet food that has been left outside, or when they begin to prey on pets. Such animals may lose their normal fear of humans. Several problems can arise when wild animals begin to associate humans with easily acquired food. Read more about the side-effects of feeding wildlife.

In the case of large predators or large omnivores like bears, foxes, and coyotes, habituation may lead to human safety issues that will result in the animal being removed or destroyed. In the case of smaller animals, habituation may create "nuisance" animals. While one landowner may enjoy watching raccoons eating from the cat's dish on the porch, his neighbors may not be as tolerant. Again, the end result is often the removal and killing of the animal.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

 Turn your cat into an indoor cat or build an enclosure so your cat can be outside safely

•Do not put bird feeders in your yard if you have free roaming cats on your property

•When outside of a fenced yard or dog park, keep your dogs

•Feed pets inside, or if feeding outside, remove leftover food as soon as the pet has finished

eating

 Make sure that all outdoor caging for animals such as rabbits, chickens, and other pets is secure against predators. We recommend hardware cloth.



ealing with a tantrum is never easy. Remember the last time your child had a temper tantrum. Was your stress level high? Did you feel helpless? Most parents agree that these anger explosions happen when a child is told "NO." So, what's a parent to do? Adults respond out of anger and guilt. **Emotion Regulation** - It's important for kids to know that they are in control of their feelings. They must understand that they have the power to make choices on how they will respond to frustration.

Help Child Know Their Triggers - Parenting offers opportunities to teach your child. Many parents don't realize the benefits of understanding how the brain impacts behavior. Parents who teach their child how to recognize his or her amygdala-based threats and respond appropriately, will help move their child to a higher level of thinking.

Model Expected Behavior - Children do what you do and not what you say. One of the greatest gifts parents can give their children is being a positive role model.

Connect with Feeling's - If a person feels stuck, he or she will do whatever is necessary




to get unstuck. Children lack the vocabulary to express how they feel. This makes it critical that parents help children put words to feelings. Parents can say things like "you seem really happy; you seem very disappointed, you look excited, etc." The goal is for parents to put words to the emotion.

**Teach Healthy Conflict Resolution -** The goal is for children to identify their emotions

and learn to control how they express them. Feelings are a part of the human experience. Parents need to let children know that they have a right to their feelings. At the same time, they must control what they do to express those feelings. Specifically, when children are experiencing conflict, they need choices. When children have a clear choice, they are better able focus, calm down, and follow through.




