

PSYCHEDELIC ART FOCUS OF CAL LUTHERAN EXHIBIT

Works include Huichol yarn painting and Yes album cover

California Lutheran University's largest-ever exhibit features two centuries of international psychedelic art ranging from famous album covers to religious paintings.

"The Otherworld," curated by Cal Lutheran art professor Michael Pearce of Thousand Oaks, is on display in the William Rolland Gallery of Fine Art through Feb. 3.


All of the art depicts alternative visions of the world. Some of the visions were brought on by drugs like peyote, marijuana and LSD; others were spiritual or religious visualizations.

Included are a Japanese woodblock print from the 1800s, hallucinogenic-influenced art from the mid-20th century, and digital prints representing a new frontier for contemporary artists. While links to drugs

once stifled appreciation for psychedelic art, changing laws and societal norms have increased interest today.

"Visionary art has come of age," Pearce

The exhibit offers visitors a rare opportunity to see many of these pieces. While the fantasy landscapes like "Relayer" by Roger Dean are the most well-known because they were used for popular 1970s album covers. the last time his original painting "Blue Desert" went on display was a decade ago in Seoul. A 2016 collaborative painting, "Bicycle Day" by Mars-1 and Alex Grey, leaders of a new chapter in the movement called psy-fi, has never been exhibited before.



beeswax to create images inspired by his participation in traditional ceremonies and pilgrimages as a temple official. The late Thomas Akawie, a member of the California visionary artists group of the 1970s, produced otherworldly spaces in airbrushed acrylics. The late Rick Griffin designed many of the iconic images of the hippie era for his rock concert posters. Featured digital artists include Cal Lutheran multimedia


professor and alumnus Tim Hengst of Thousand Oaks; and Kirsten Zirngibl, a San Diego resident who makes prints on smooth cloth.



IT'S NO SNOW JOB - HANDFUL OF REDWOODS ARE RARE ALBINOS

A GREAT ROAD TRIP TO BOND WITH NATURE

he 30-foot tall Christmas Tree in Humboldt Redwoods State Park is one of only dozens of known albino redwoods in the world. At first sight, you may not quite believe your eyes.

From a distance, these trees look like young redwoods flocked with snow or frost. Yet as you get closer, you realize that the white tint is not snow, but that the tree itself is white.

These white redwood trees are rare albinos, also called "ghost trees." One of the

biggest, a 30-footer that is one of the easier specimens to find, is called the "Christmas Tree." It's also one of the

Albino redwoods do not have pigmentation, similar to albino wildlife. So their needles are white, not green.

About 50 albino redwoods are believed to exist, from trees that resemble little clumps to 70-footers. No other albino conifers are believed to have been found that have survived into maturity. Other trees

do spawn an albino specimen, but it's rare and does not survive long.

These unusual redwoods weave their

root systems into that of other redwoods and tap into their food supply. They cannot provide their own food since they lack chlorophyll that converts sunlight and water into food, but they have adapted to take what they need from other redwoods.

That is why they are always found growing next to a host. Other trees, such as an apple tree, on the other hand, do not have the ability to interlink their root systems with

Six albinos are located in Humboldt Redwoods State Park in the Redwood Empire on the Northern California coast near Highway 101 in Humboldt County.

To see the Christmas Tree, take 101 north from San Francisco about 225 miles (about 41/2 hours) to the exit for Weott/Visitors Center. Take that exit ramp to Newton Road. Turn left and drive a quarter mile to Avenue of the Giants. Turn right and go 2.3 miles and look for a sign marking the parking area for the California Federation of humboldtredwoods.org Women's Clubs Grove (if you cross the bridge, you have gone too far). Turn left and

From the parking area, walk on the

entrance road (about 40 yards from the entrance gate) to the sign that says "No Camping." Stand in front of the sign and

look to the right for an unsigned path. Walk 20 yards on that path to a downed log. At the log, turn left and walk on a path that is parallel to the direction of the downed log for 15 yards to a large redwood tree. A path

leads directly around that large redwood tree to an albino redwood tree, the Christmas or "Ghost Tree."

The gate to the grove closes for the season Oct. 22. If closed, you can still park at the gate and walk in.

Also, the Avenue of the Giants provides a 30-mile driving route through Humboldt Redwoods State Park, site of the largest remaining stand of old-growth redwoods in the world.


Silent Night

ust in time for the holidays comes a film about the end of the world. "Silent Night" offers a Christmas story about family, friends, and the wonders of childhood, but writer/director Camille Griffin isn't in the mood to be precious with the details of a special reunion. Instead, she's constructing a s dark tale of finality, using the cloak of yuletide excitement to explore how relationships react to the news that everything on Earth will be dead in a matter of days. It's not exactly a cheerful tale of celebration, but bleakness is what makes "Silent Night" periodically riveting.

It's Christmas, and married couple Nell (Keira Knightley) and Simon (Matthew Goode) are organizing a party for friends and family, welcoming them to a rural estate owned by Nell's mother. Arriving for the festivities are Sandra (Annabelle Wallis) and Tony (Rufus Jones), Bella (Lucy Punch) and Alex (Kirby Howell-Baptiste), and James (Sope Dirisu) and Sophie (Lily-Rose Depp), who are ready for a night

of food, fun, and holiday connecting. The gang is doing their best to ignore the situation, with a toxic storm overtaking the planet, representing Mother Earth's final stand to get rid of humanity and all the ecological destruction it's caused. The British government has prepared suicide pills, but young Art (Roman Griffin Davis) isn't ready to say goodbye, pleading with his parents, Nell and Simon, to stick out the storm, refusing to end his life. As the night carries on, the festivities turn deadly serious, with the group beginning to share dark thoughts and practice denial.

"Silent Night" commences with traditional acts of holiday filmmaking, tracking different characters, with everyone bopping along to Christmas tunes. Griffin introduces these different personalities, including Sandra, a completely vain person trying to work up enthusiasm for her dull husband, Tony. Sophie is on edge about the whole plan, pushing back on James and his efforts to present calmness to



others. And Nell and Simon are managing the household, working to prepare a feast and make sure Art doesn't lose control of himself. Griffin liberally shovels in profanity, which provides an effective warning that while Christmas is here, the atmosphere isn't sharply sentimental.

Earth is fed up, creating a greenish cloud of death that's passing over continents, with news of utter bodily destruction after exposure to the gas. England is prepared, equipping the population with "Exit Pills," taking pain out of the equation,

but the end of human life can't be avoided, forcing the guests to do their best to ignore the developing horror. However, stress isn't magically eliminated, with Sophie struggling with cheer and Art acutely aware of danger.

"Silent Night" has characters and an apocalypse to keep track of, and Griffin gets a little too hysterical at times. She's better with broken minds, as the night encourages the reveal of unfinished business, secrets, and lost desire, giving the cast ideas to work with.

The Tender Bar

The Tender Bar" is George Clooney's directorial project. Adapted from J.R. Moehringer's Pulitzer-Prize-winning memoir, it's the story of how a young man came to be a writer.

We're introduced to the young man, J.R. (Daniel Ranieri), circa 1973, riding with his mom, Dorothy (Lily Rabe). They're headed to his grandpa's (Christopher Lloyd) house in Long Island, New York.

Grandpa's house is like the Weasely family's in "Harry Potter" minus magic. Or TV's "Shameless" family—always packed to the rafters with family and friends. There's always hubbub happening, with grandpa sitting in the middle of it all.

Ben Affleck, the, titular bartender—Tender Bar, bar-tender—is J.R.'s Uncle Charlie, the most stable male figure in J.R.'s life.

J.R's dad (Max Martini) is a no-good, narcissistic alcoholic known as "The Voice," a radio DJ who ran out on J.R.'s mom, and

he does stuff like call his son out of the blue, say he's got baseball tickets, and never show.

The best scene involving father and son is funny and tragic: Cool, chain-smoking, gangsta-leaning dad picks up J.R. in his Toronado (J.R. stands for "Junior"), and proceeds to go for a spin. Except it eventually dawns that Senior is continuously making right turns, and they're back at the house, having driven around the block.

Uncle Charlie notices that the kid's got talent with words. He tells the kid that he doesn't think sports are his thing and that he should stick to books, whereupon he introduces J.R. to a closet full of books and tells J.R. to read 'em all. Uncle Charlie's a closet bookworm, literally.

But the business of hewing to the working class while being exceedingly well-read fits Affleck like a glove.

The actual Tender Bar where Charlie tends bar is named "The Dickens." It's got a mural of Charles Dickens on the wall and is lined



with books, beer pitchers and baskets of peanuts. This becomes J.R.'s adolescent world.

Yale comes into view in the second half, with Tye Sheridan as the collegiate J.R., who's goal in life is to become a lawyer quickly subjugated by a romantic obsession with a young woman (Briana Middleton) who genuinely likes him but toys with him.

She's already got a better-looking, financially more well-off boyfriend, and J.R. is too young and naive to recognize that he can't compete with all that nest-building material, with mere bookish dreams of being a writer. She dumps him.

Does J.R. get the girl? Does he get hired at The New York Times? Does he get to stay? Does he, à la "Good Will Hunting," get in a car and drive away in search of his destiny?

Now that Ben Affleck is middle-aged, has publicly beat alcohol, and is back with the love of his life, Jennifer Lopez, he's bringing new gravitas to his work. It looks good on him.

Singing Revolution' inspires with love story set against historical events "Lift it up, lift it up: we can sing our country free!" Twenty triple-threat performers and a five-piece band will bring an inspirational new musical based on historical events to life this January. Presented by Dreamtone Productions in association with NewYorkRep, the world premiere of Singing Revolution: The Musical sets a tale of star-crossed lovers against the beautiful, moving and timeless true story of Estonia's 1987 song-filled, peaceful uprising against the Soviet Union. Featuring a crowd-pleasing Europop score by Tony Spinosa, who also directs; book and lyrics by Spinosa and James Bearhart; music direction by Brent Crayon; and choreography by Tracey Benson, opening night is set for Saturday, January 15 on the Main Stage at Hollywood's Broadwater Theatre, where performances will

continue through February 20.

Set in Tallinn, Estonia and spanning four decades, Singing Revolution is inspired by the actual events that led to Estonian independence from the Soviet Union in 1991. The tiny country's journey to freedom through the power of song acts as a reminder to us all that the power of peaceful resistance can change the world.

"When I first learned about Estonia's 'Singing Revolution,' a light bulb went off in my head," says Spinosa. "People literally singing as a shield against Soviet attacks is a story I knew I needed to tell."

"Once word got out that I was working on this musical, TV shows began to approach me for interviews," he continues. "I was introduced to the Estonian consul in New York City, who connected me with Estonia's minister of culture in Tallinn. I was able to interview many of the leaders of the Singing Revolution, most of whom are still alive and still living in Estonia. With their help, I began to discover the passion and integrity of the Estonian culture and the heart of this musical's story."

In the play, Estonian student Taavi Tamm, who will later become a leader of the Estonian resistance (James Everts, seen in Chicago for Plan-B Entertainment and Newsies at Candlelight Pavilion), falls in love with Sofia, daughter of a Soviet officer (Bella Hicks: Sweet Charity for Reprise 2.0, American Idiot at La Mirada). Meanwhile, Taavi's teacher Leena (Krista Feallock: All Shook Up at San Diego Musical Theatre, Allegory at La Jolla Playhouse WOW Fest) and her Russian colleague, Viktor (Lucas Alifano, recently seen in Death of a Salesman at the Ruskin Group Theater) find themselves similarly drawn to one another. Michael Scott Harris (Ragtime with Musical Theatre West, Shooting Star at the Hudson) plays Sofia's father, Soviet commander Nikolai Solokov. Renée Wylder (The Last Five Years at Cupcake Theater, Little Women: The Musical and Daddy Long Legs at PCPA in Santa Maria) and Adam Wylie (Into the Woods on Broadway, Wicked at the Pantages, Brad Langford on Gilmore Girls) portray the parents of Taavi, with Wylie doubling as Joseph Stalin—alongside Anthony Marciona (Broadway/national touring productions of Gypsy, Zorba, Tommy, Starlight Express, Bronco Billy and Ballroom) as Vladimir Lenin and Peter Van Norden (2019 Ovation award for best actor in The Hothouse at the Antaeus, 2020 Ovation nomination for best featured actor in Red Ink at Playwright's Arena) as Mikhail Gorbachev.

Performances of Singing Revolution: The Musical take place Fridays and Saturdays at 8 p.m. and Sundays at 3 p.m., January 15 through February 20. There will be two preview performances on Thursday, Jan. 13 and Friday, Jan. 14, each at 8 p.m. All tickets are \$40, except previews, which are \$30. The Broadwater Theatre Main Stage is located at 6320 Santa Monica Blvd, Los Angeles, CA 90038. Proof of vaccination is required for admission. Masks must be worn throughout the performance. WHY DO WE DRINK BUBBLY ON NEW YEAR'S EVE?

ome midnight on December 31, the soundtrack of your life will likely feature at least one of the following: fireworks exploding, noisemakers bleating, champagne corks popping.

One can only assume that a special place in hell is occupied by the inventor of the New Year's Eve noisemaker. One can also assume that a comfortable alcove in heaven is occupied by Dom Pérignon, or whomever it was who invented champagne some three centuries ago.

But why champagne, and why New Year's Eve?

Credit is hard to assign, but let us start with Julius Caesar. Before him, pagans celebrated the vernal equinox, the moment



winter tipped into spring, when people actually had something to look forward to other than frostbite followed by slush. The early Romans celebrated likewise, until Caesar added two months to an admittedly sloppy pagan calendar, and decreed that

Roman consuls begin heir terms at the start of newly created January, named after the god Janus, who had two faces and could look both forward and back.

Celebrating the arrival of this new year took root across Europe, then was brought

by European settlers to the Americas. By 1800 it was common to remain awake until midnight, when church bells tolled and firearms fired. In some cities, it became tradition to roam from house to house, with the full expectation you'd be invited in for a drink. Doing so spanned the social ladder: American residents from George Washington to FDR traditionally opened the doors of the White House to anyone dressed decently and with a letter of introduction, feting them with midnight punch and snacks.

Elsewhere, servants and slaves would pound on doors and demand midnight drinks.

One 1852 account of New Year's festivities noted that taverns served "villainous compounds," the clergy served Arrack punch and the mayor served lemonade. The air was also reportedly filled with the sounds of "guns and pistols from evening till morning, and with champagne corks from morning till evening."

Champagne was then just one of many drinks served, but it soon began its ascent toward ubiquity. Champagne is one of civilization's great examples of a flaw evolving into a feature. It started when French wine was bottled before being fully fermented; the yeast got busy and the wine got fizzy. For years, the fizz was assumed to mask poor-quality wine, but after a century of fine-tuning, producers perfected the making of crisp, delicate champagnes. Royalty clamored for it, followed by nobility, followed by the rising merchant class that thought of itself as both royal and noble. Think: aspirational drinking.

"One observer noted in 1881 that the increased use of champagne at festive gatherings was 'a charming fashion that is beginning to be more common," writes Kolleen Guy in When Champagne Became French: Wine and the Making of a National Identity. Producers started to market it as a drink to celebrate a special occasion with family. As the Industrial Revolution minted a new middle class, sales of sparkling wine soared from 6 million bottles in 1850 to 28

million by 1900. And what better occasion to pull out all stops and flaunt your aspirations than New Year's Eve?

One could make an argument that champagne's New Year's high point occurred in the first decade of the 20th century at Cafe New Year's Eve party in France, 1937 Martin's in New York City. This French restaurant was among the first rank of "lobster palaces," where the cream of society went to entertain themselves. On New Year's Eve, guests could order anything they wanted to drink, as long as they wanted champagne—it was reputedly the first place to go "champagne only" after 9 p.m. on New Year's Eve. "To get a table at all on New Year's Eve is difficult." wrote a visitor in 1910, "when you get one you must drink what you are told."

Martin's list featured some 200 champagnes-although the distinction between "champagne" and "Champagne" (a protected designation, like Roquefort and Cognac) had not yet been embraced in the United States. And the flow of champagne at Martin's wasn't necessarily driven by consumer demand; "everyone got a piece of the action, including the waiters who saved the corks, receiving a kickback from the wine importers for each bottle they popped," wrote the 1910 guest. Champagne, like all adult beverages, suffered under the tyranny of Prohibition and was unsteady in its return to the New Year's Eve table. (In 1967, the winner of the LeMans was evidently the first to celebrate by shaking and spraying a bottle of champagne, ushering in an era in which athletes celebrate by pouring one of civilization's most sublime discoveries over the heads of sweaty fellow combatants.)

Champagne is back today, the finer brands still sought by royalty and nobility and the growing bourgeoisie. The rest of us, in the meantime, have been finding less-expensive sparkling wines to greet the New Year, like cava and prosecco.

Which, of course, is fine. The important part of New Year's Eve is the popping of the cork—and, yes, I'm aware that the buzzkills say that sparkling wine should never be popped. But the pop! marks a moment in one's personal chronology, after which everything will be different ... at least until morning. When you hear that sound you can see Janus smiling, both forward and back.

For dinner fare, they offer several salad options including the Quinoa & Arugula





JUST BREATHING DIAPHRAGMATIC BREATHING EXERCISES FOR COPU

Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) refers to a group of diseases, such as emphysema and chronic bronchitis, that cause airflow blockages and breathing-related problems, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

When you have COPD, there are a few things you can do to help manage or reduce your symptoms. Diaphragmatic breathing exercises, among other practices, can help make breathing a little easier.

What are the risk factors for COPD?

According to the American Lung Association (ALA), the main cause of COPD is smoking, although nonsmokers can get it as well. COPD can also be caused by pollution and irritants in the environment. According to the CDC, nearly 15.7 million Americans (6.4% of the population) reported that they had been diagnosed with COPD, but more than half of adults with low pulmonary function were not aware that they had COPD.

Symptoms of COPD include:

- · Frequent coughing or wheezing
- · Shortness of breath
- · Trouble taking a deep breath
- · Excess phlegm or mucus

Although COPD was previously suspected to be more common in men, since 2000, more women in the United States have died from COPD than men, according to the CDC. Women tend to be diagnosed later than men, and may also be more vulnerable to the effects of tobacco and other substances that can cause COPD, such as air pollution.

Other groups that were more likely to report COPD include:

- · American Indians/Alaska natives
- · Multiracial non-Hispanics
- People who are retired, unemployed or unable to work
 - · People with a history of asthma

How can diaphragmatic breathing exercises help COPD?

The diaphragm is a muscle at the base of the chest, below the heart and lungs, that helps you inhale and exhale. According to the ALA, over time the lungs of people with COPD lose "springiness," which can cause air to get trapped. Stale air builds up and the diaphragm has less room to contract and bring in fresh oxygen.

To compensate for the diaphragm not working at full capacity, the body uses other muscles in the neck, back and chest for breathing. However, this leads to lower oxygen levels and less oxygen reserves for exercise and physical activity.

By practicing breathing exercises regularly, you can help rid your lungs of stale air and increase your oxygen levels.

Breathing exercises for COPD

There are a few breathing exercises known to help ease the symptoms of COPD.

The first is called belly breathing or diaphragmatic breathing. Start by inhaling through your nose. Then, breathe out through your mouth for two to three times as long as you inhaled. You may want to put your hands on your stomach so you can be sure that it is rising and falling.

This method of breathing will help retrain your diaphragm to fill and empty your lungs, according to the ALA. It may take practice to get this technique just right, and you might feel tired at first. Start off slow and increase the amount of time you spend doing this exercise as you get more comfortable.

Another breathing exercise that can help with COPD is called pursed lip breathing. Keeping your mouth closed, breathe in through your nose and count to two. Next, purse your lips together as if you are about to whistle or blow out birthday candles. Slowly breathe out through your lips while counting to four.

Other ways to help with COPD



Beyond breathing exercises, there are a few other ways to help manage or slow COPD. If you smoke, the most effective action you can take to manage COPD is to quit smoking. You can speak with your doctor if you need help quitting smoking.

Another helpful way to manage COPD is to try improving the air quality in your home. Irritants in the air can make breathing difficult for people with COPD. Limit the use of household chemicals or buy an air filtration system to keep your air clean.

Although there isn't a cure for COPD, using breathing exercises or limiting your exposure to air pollution and irritants can help you manage your symptoms.



Bowling will have you carrying and swinging a heavy ball, and


you need to be flexible. This will prevent your muscles, ligaments, and tendons from tearing.

KEEP YOUR PETS SAFE DURING THE HOLIDAYS

PET BEHAVIOR AND HOLIDAY GUESTS

- Though the excitement of a party may overwhelm some pets, keep your pets inside during cold weather and provide plenty of toys to keep them busy.
- If needed, provide your cat or dog with a quiet room or crate during holiday parties and/or prepare ahead of time to discourage barking.
- Inform your visitors ahead of time that you have a pet. SKIP THE TABLE SCRAP SNACKS: FOODS NOT TO FEED PETS
- Bones: Bones easily splinter and can cause serious health problems (even death) for your pet.
- Candy: Particularly chocolate—which is toxic to dogs, cats and ferrets—and any candy containing the toxic sweetener Xylitol.
 - · Chives
- Citrus and pits: Keep foods containing citric acid away from your pets. Foods such as cherry pits, peach pits and apple seeds contain essential oils that have the ability to cause irritations, blockages and even central nervous system depression if a significant amount is ingested.
- Coffee: Grounds, beans and chocolate-covered espresso beans.
 - · Eggs (raw or undercooked)
 - Fish (raw or undercooked)
 - Garlic
- Grapes and raisins: These can cause kidney problems.
- Leaves and stems: From vegetables such as tomatoes.
 - Meat (raw or undercooked)
 - Nuts
- Onions, as well as onion flakes and powder
 - Salt

- Trash: Pets who engage in trash-digging can accidentally eat foods that are potentially poisonous to them. Keep trash in tightly sealed containers or hidden somewhere your pet can't access.

 DECK THE HALLS:
- Christmas trees and holiday greens: Make sure your dogs or cats do not chew on limbs or droppings from the tree. Ingested pine needles could get lodged in the intestinal tract, puncturing the lining or bunching together and causing an intestinal obstruction.

HOLIDAY DECORATIONS AND PETS

• Water base: The water base of a Christmas tree may contain dangerous chemicals that could harm your pet.

- Christmas lights and tinsel: Position your tree's lights and tinsel away from the bottom of the tree where pets can reach them. Some pets climb up or into trees and can even knock them
- Candles: Don't leave candles unattended. Pets may accidentally knock them over and spill wax or start a fire.
- Firestarter logs: Dogs that enjoy chewing should steer clear; these logs contain sawdust and paraffin which can cause an irritated stomach or even intestinal blockage when ingested.
- Plants: A number of seasonal plants are poisonous to pets if nibbled or eaten, including ivy, holly, mistletoe and poinsettias.



Some news items just catapult themselves to the lead story position. On a Delta airlines flight in November from Syracuse, New York, to Atlanta, the woman sitting in 13A allegedly tried to breastfeed her hairless cat, much to the cat's (and other passengers') distress. 5 TIPS FOR LEARNING DURING THE HOLIDAY BREAK

Brain drain during the holiday

We all know it, and we've been there. Taking a break from a school routine can cause a vacation fog. Repetition works and habits are like repetition, but what happens when your child is on a long break? After a significant amount of time not in a routine, a child will struggle to get back in the saddle. 4. Write twenty minutes a day. Keep a writing journal. Ask your child to write to someone or write about a topic of interest in the journal. Even better, have them write about their vacation, their plans, and their goals. Check out



5. Focus on a specific learning idea. Identify your child's challenge areas in learning and create exercises to strengthen their

skills set. If they struggle with math facts; make a game out of flash cards. Do they struggle with reading fluency or comprehension? Have them read aloud in the car or while you cook. Ask them questions such as "who, what, when, where, and why?" about what they have read aloud. If they make a statement about something they've seen on tv; ask them their opinion and encourage them to research the topic.

Over the break, students and parents who practice the above suggestions can see improvement and reduce digression in their child's learning. 
