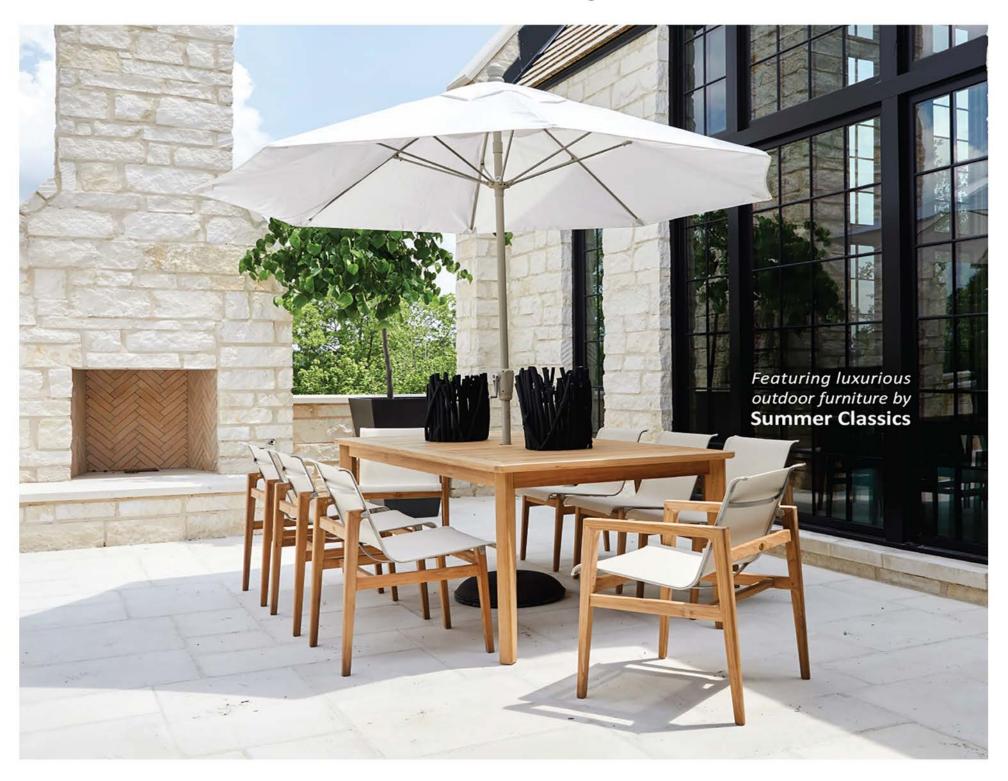

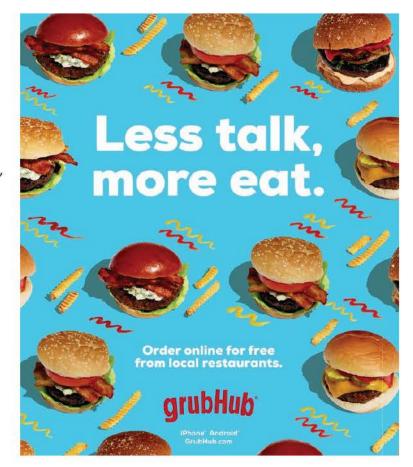

### AN EXPRESSIVE COLLECTION BY WALTER ERRA HUBERT

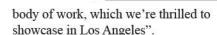

Walter Erra Hubert is a Pasadena-born, internationally-recognized artist working in the mediums of acrylic paintings, mono prints, resin and mixed media. Walter chose to self-isolate in 2018, two years before the international lockdown, resulting in his latest striking body of work Promising Skies, which reflects a world moving towards a new reality. The large-scale art works are realized in acrylic while the show will also feature his works that incorporate resin and mixed media. All of the art will be

showcased at Building Bridges Art Exchange's Santa Monica Gallery.

Born to Italian immigrant parents, Walter is heavily influenced by his U.S. and Italian roots and straddles both worlds. 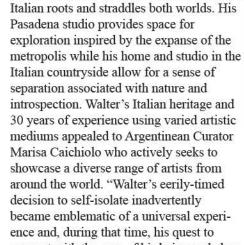

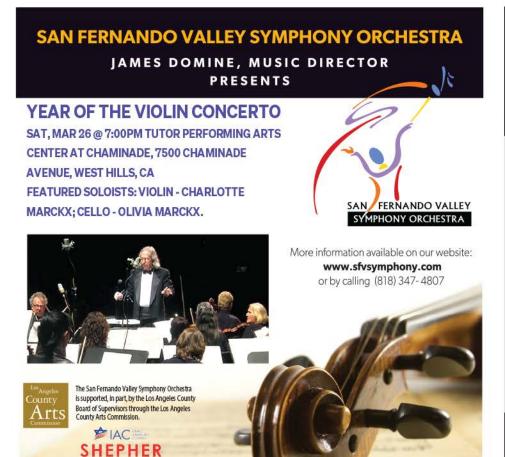

Make Spring Break a Family Affair to Remember!!

School is out. Yeah Baby!! You've got uninterrupted time to spend with your kids. So gather the family and break away from the ordinary. Go camping. Indulge in a

posh resort. Hit the beach, the slopes. Maybe a dude ranch. Explore the desert or Central California's crazy-cool wildlife. Most important of all -- laugh, love and together create unforgettable vacation memories.

Seaside Sensations

Cozy up to nature - and each other -- in an RV or tent. Carpinteria State Beach (http://www.californiasbestcamping.com/sb coast/carpinteria.html) (https://www.parks.ca.gov-/?page id=599) just south of Santa Barbara offers 191 picture-perfect ocean-front campsites and endless activities. Explore the terraced bluffs, sand dunes and tide pools with or without a park guide. Hike the Coastal Vista Trail. Visit the nearby seal preserve. Spot whales, the grays are migrating through April. Sun, swim, go surf-fishing on the mile-long beach. Surf at nearby El Capitan Beach and Rincon Point. Kayak the Santa Barbara coast. Maybe visit nearby Channel Islands Harbor and rent a boat or book a cruise to the Channel Islands. Camp-

ing is easy here, with amenities including a visitors' center, Kids' Tomol Interpretive Play area, grocery store, toilets and coin-operated showers, some with hot water! Or take your RV or tent south to the Newport Coast and set up camp on a scenic bluff with sweeping ocean views at Crystal Cove State Park (http://www.crystalcovestate-park.org/). Its Moro Campground has 27 RV and 30 tent

campsites, with coin-operated hot showers! Hike along 15 miles of trails across 2,400 acres of wilderness, one of OC's last remaining natural open spaces. Frolic on 3.2 miles of beautiful beach. Explore tide pools. Check the Crystal Cove visitors' center for guided hikes, tide pool



and birding walks and geology talks. For a more secluded experience, set up camp at one of the 32 "primitive" campsites, each a minimum of three miles farther into this coastal backcountry.

Treat the family to a luxurious fun-in-the-sun Spring Break at the ocean-view Laguna Cliffs Marriott Resort & Spa (https://www.marriott.com/en-us/hotels/snadp-laguna-cliffs-marriott-resort-and-spa/) in Dana Point. The posh property is offering special "Spring Break Family Activities" from March 11 through April 17. Rock out to live music on the resort's Del Mar Lawn, on Saturdays; Laguna Cliffs Movie Night, also on Saturdays; Poolside Kids'

activities on Fridays and Saturdays, and the Kahuna Laguna Kids' Club Lounge. Walk along the cliff-top paths for sweeping coastal views. Ride the resort bicycles down to picturesque Dana Point Harbor (https://danapointharbor.com/). Go paddle boarding, kayaking or whale watching (whales are spotted year-round here) and peruse the cute shops and waterfront cafes. Pop down to Doheny State Beach and challenge each other to beach volleyball.

Hit the Slopes

Breath in the crisp mountain air at Lake Big Bear (www.bigbear.com) snuggled in the San Bernardino National Forest three hours south of LA. Ski and snowboard at Snow Summit and Bear Mountain ski resorts, with more than 400 acres, 26 lifts and 55 ski runs. Go snow tubing at Grizzly Ridge Tube Park. Zip line through the trees. Take a Segway tour with Action Tours California. Try snowshoeing and sledding. Thrill to the Alpine Slide at Magic Mountain, SoCal's only authentic bobsled experience, and the after dark "Glo

Tubing" – under neon lights. Apre your snowy fun, head to Big Bear Village and ride the free trolley between the boutiques, restaurants and galleries. Have brunch at breakfast favorite Grizzly Manor Café. For accommodations, rent a cabin or book a hotel such as The Lodge at Big Bear Lake, a Holiday Inn Resort (https://www.thelodgeatbigbearlake.com/).

Add sophistication to your mountain high at Lake Arrowhead (https://lakearrowhead.com/), nicknamed "The Alps of California," a few peaks over in the San Bernardino Mountains. Pamper the family with spa treatments, fine-dining and s'mores roasted over an open fire under the stars on a lakeside patio at the upscale Lake Arrowhead Resort and Spa (https://www.lakearrowheadresort.com/). The resort is perfectly positioned on the lake adjacent to charming Lake Arrowhead Village, with 50 intriguing shops including Jurassic Fossils (you can buy real dino fossils!), river-front restaurants, outlets - Coach, here we come! - and wine-tasting rooms. Arrange a personally-guided cruise around the lake with just the family. Or join the fun on the Lake Arrowhead Queen paddlewheel sightseeing cruise. Ski, snowboard and tube in nearby Snow Valley. It boasts one SoCal's only lift snow tubing hills, accessed by SoCal's first and only High Speed, 6-passenger, detachable chair lift. Snowshoe through wintry pastures. Cross-country ski. If you prefer a forest accommodation, the historic Saddleback Inn and Grill (https://saddlebackinn.com/) is

Outdoor adventures at Cali Camp (www.calicamp.com) may already be your family tradition – it is with so many. If not, take this break time together to visit its beautiful 21-acre Big Rock Ranch location in Old Topanga Canyon amid oak groves and bamboo forests, during the open house

on March 20, and May 1 and 22 from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Enjoy a picnic, listen to music, play games, maybe shoot a bow and arrow and learn about all their summer day camp activities from rock climbing, music and art to gymnastics, adventure and equestrian. Founded in 1955, Cali Camp is one of SoCal's



oldest and best loved day camps for boys and girls age 3 to 15. This summer's camp begins June 13, 2022.

Ride into the sunset – literally – at the Alisal Ranch & Resort (https://alisal.com/), a lux dude ranch in the Santa Ynez Valley outside Santa Barbara. Whether you ride or not, the Alisal is a perfect family break. Beginner, intermediate and advanced riders from age 7 and up are welcome. Enjoy wrangler-guided rides across 10,500 acres of meadows, hills and forest. Sunset rides. Specialty rides like the Pancake Breakfast

ride (an hour each way) for a sumptuous breakfast under the sycamore trees.
Take riding lessons to learn and
improve. Learn roping and other skills
at wrangler workshops. Join the group
rides or arrange private rides perhaps
to a secluded picnic, Lake Alisal for
stand-up paddle boarding, or where
ever you like. In the evening, enjoy
family meals together in the ranch
dining room. The Western-chic
accommodations are totally family
friendly, with adjoining suites and

studios. All have wood-burning fireplaces and circle the barnyard, so you're never far from the horses! Choose guestrooms, suites or cottages that sleep 3, 5, 10 and 12 guests.

Share the glory of Yosemite National Park (https://www.nationalparks.org/connect/explore-parks/yosemite-national-park?), a six-hour drive from Los Angeles in California's Sierra Nevada Mountains. Marvel at California poppies. And epic waterfalls. Hike and bicycle along more than 800 miles of scenic trails and bike paths. Go water rafting on the wild Merced River. Camp or enjoy a hotel stay. Curry Village has both wood cabins and canvas tent accommodations, some with private baths hooray. Its prime location puts you in proximity to all the park landmarks, hiking trails and exhibits. Other camp choices include Wawona Campground, near the Pioneer Yosemite History Center; Upper Pines Campground and Hodgdon Meadow Campground both close to an in-park grocery store and showers. For a unique, family-fun hotel stay (and multiple rooms together), the rustic-style Yosemite Bug Rustic Mountain Resort (https://www.yosemitebug.com/) is a hoot. Balancing on rolling, forested hills, every room has a valley view and a unique theme - think Dia de los Muertos, Edwardian England. And the wide, wide variety of guestrooms includes

hillside cabins on stilts. Totally worth the 30-minute drive to Yosemite. If you want to be closer, the Yosemite View Lodge, (https://www.yosemiteresorts.com/yosemite-view-lodge/) is smack on the Merced River, with 335 rooms and outdoor spas, just steps from the park entrance. Do you love the Old West? Visit the town of Mariposa, 25 miles outside Yosemite. Go back in time to the 1849 Gold Rush at the Mariposa Museum & History Center, an award-winning small museum. Outside on Main Street, you'll think you're on a Wild West movie set, populated by family restaurants, shops and wine tasting rooms.

Snoopy, wild African animals and flesh-eating plants – true! Will have you all laughing and oohing and aahing in and around Santa Rosa (https://www.visitsantarosa.com), seven hours from LA and an hour north of San Francisco. Cheer the Peanuts gang inside the Charles M. Shulz Museum, showcasing changing galleries of original comic art, a re-creation of Schulz's studio, and lush gardens including a labyrinth in the shape of Snoopy's head! Remember Snoopy's ice skating shenanigans? Recreate



them yourselves at adjacent Snoopy's Home Ice skating arena, which Shulz himself opened in 1969. Then spend a wild day – and even overnight -- on an African safari open-jeep ride through Safari West (https://www.safariwest.com/), driving past free ranging (they have enclosures, we just don't see them) wildlife from bongo antelopes and cheetahs to Cape Buffalo, rhinos and Wildebeest. Dubbed the "Sonoma Serengeti," this 400-acre preserve is home to nearly 900 African animals and birds from 90 species. Extend the adventure with a stay in a Safari West tent cabin (with ensuite

bathroom) on the preserve. Enjoy a safari dinner in the main dining room and chat with the staff. Truly magical! Follow up with wild plants at California Carnivores (https://www.californiacarnivores.com/) in nearby Sebastopol. It's a unique nursery featuring only flesh eating plants – by the hundreds. DON'T stick your finger inside a six-inch tropical pitcher plant! Do take home a Venus Flytrap or African sundew. You'll never have insect problems again.

Desert Delights

If your teens are fashion-forward, follow my friend Dr. David Richardson and his teenage daughter, who loves vintage designer clothing, to Palm Springs (www.visitpalmsprings.com). Shop for retro Pucci, Dior, Chanel and more at Mitchells Palm Springs and The Frippery; fun '50s and '60s wear at Iconic Atomic and hunt-and-peck designer finds at Angel View and Revivals thrift stores. Add family fun like riding the Palm Springs Aerial Tramway for stunning valley views from 8,516 feet up Mount San Jacinto. A Desert Adventures-Red Jeep Tour along the San Andreas Fault Zone.

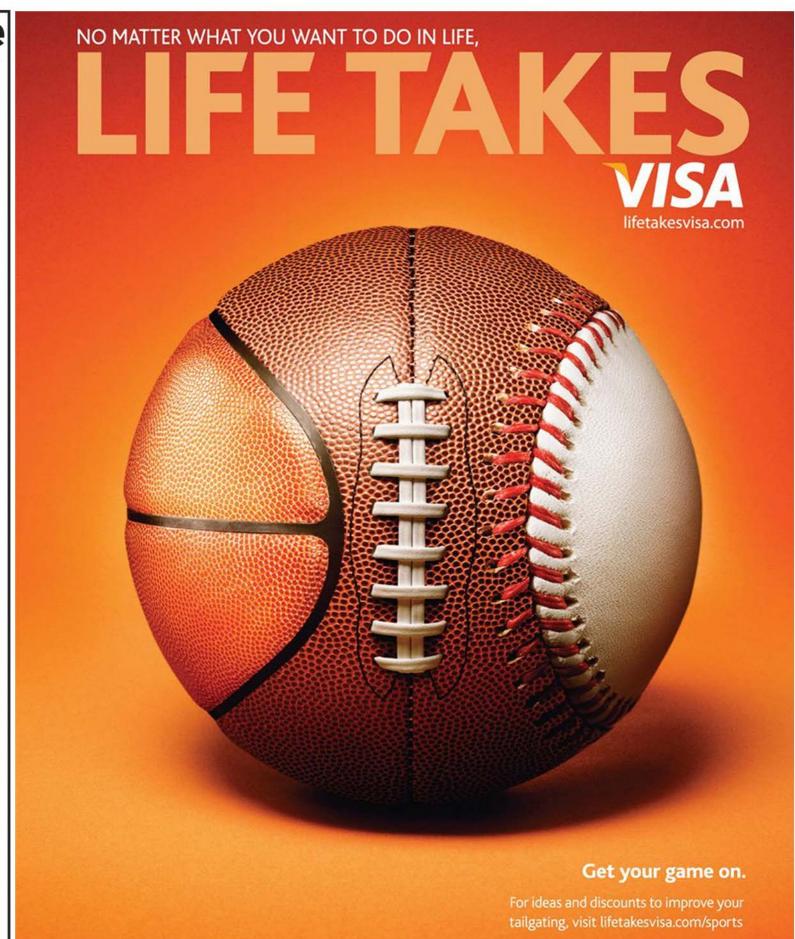

# DRIVING MISS DAISY LIVE AT ARTSPACE SIMI VALLEY

ctors' Repertory Theatre presents their production of Alfred Uhry's "Driving Miss Daisy," directed by David Ralphe, at ARTSpace Black Box Theater in Simi Valley.

The play is based on the award-winning film, which explores Alfred Uhry's delicate drama of the experience of aging, and evolving changes of race relations in the south through the lives of an elderly Jewish woman and the Black chauffeur her son hires for her.

Miss Daisy (Kathleen Silverman) is a stubborn, elderly, Jewish woman who lives alone in Atlanta, Georgia. When Miss Daisy drives her 1946 Chrysler Windsor into a neighbor's garage, her son Boolie (Brian Robert Harris) hires Hoke Colburn (Stan McConnell), a black chauffeur to drive her. Miss Daisy at first is resistant to anyone taking away her driving privileges, but Hoke convinces her to accept him through sheer determination. As the relationship between Miss Daisy and Hoke grows, she reciprocates by teaching him to read. And against all odds, Daisy's prejudices are broken down and Hoke becomes her best friend.

The story explores ever-evolving race relations in the south as well as anti-semi-



tism. After her synagogue is bombed, Miss Daisy sees that her people are just as much a victim of prejudice as black people are. But as the play progresses, it also explores how American society is changing, as evidenced when Miss Daisy attends a dinner where Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. is giving a speech.

Kathleen Silverman as Miss Daisy creates an enigmatic turn as a complicated woman who is navigating aging. We empathize with her and are amused by her, line after line. Kathleen's most recent role was Louise Seger in "Always Patsy Cline" at the Simi Valley Cultural Arts Center. Some other roles include Aunt Eller in "Oklahoma," Grandma in "Billy Elliot," and Yente in "Fiddler on the Roof."

Stan McConnell gives a sweet and authentic performance as Hoke, where through his acting we can explore the dynamic of a loving – if unlikely – friendship. He has performed in various shows in the Ventura area.

Brian Robert Harris creates a great showing as Boolie, who has to deal with a family member who can be both testy and loving. He offers a great dynamic between mother and son. He has played roles like Gordon in "Dead Man's Cell Phone" and Kenneth in "The Night Alive."

Director David Ralphe has been working in theatre, television, and film for over 50 years. He has been at the helm of several ART's produc-

tions including "Jesus Christ Superstar," "A Chorus Line," "Tommy," "Ragtime," "Little Women," "Hank Williams," "Lost Highway," and much more.

# TEXAS CHAINSAW MASSACRE

nticipating the inevitable guts and gore and murderous mayhem, I screened Netflix's new "Texas Chainsaw Massacre" in broad daylight, with sunlight streaming through the windows and the comforting din of traffic below, and with the remote in my hand throughout, ready to hit "pause."

But things dragged and I got complacent, and sure enough, that pause button was too far away when I really needed it — a truly shocking moment I did not see coming.

Despite that admirably executed shocker of a scene, though, the question does arise not long into this, the 10th movie in the "Chainsaw" ocuvre: Did we really need another? And sadly, given the lack of imagination, creativity or even basic attention to logic in a perfunctory and downright silly script, the answer seems a resounding "Nope."

Unless you just want to see a lot of chainsaw killing. Because, there is that.

The new installment, directed by David Blue Garcia with a screenplay by Chris Thomas Devlin, is billed as a direct sequel to the original, meaning we're supposed to forget the eight intervening movies. OK, done! The 1974 film, directed by Tobe Hooper, has been called disgusting and disturbing, but also a classic. The plot involved a group of young people who happened on the remote Texas property of a family of cannibals. Out came the chainsaw. Only a young woman named Sally survived.

From hippies... to hipsters. In 2022, we have a group of idealistic 20-something entrepreneurs, who decide that Harlow, Texas, essentially a ghost

town, is the ideal place to buy up and gentrify. They arrive to organize things just before a busload of their investors comes rolling in.

There's Dante (Jacob Latimore) and girlfriend Ruth (Nell Hudson). And then there are the two most fleshed-out characters in the film: Melody (Sarah Yarkin), Dante's partner in the venture, and her teen sister, Lila (Elsie Fisher) who we learn is the emotionally scarred survivor of a school shooting.

Things don't go smoothly. Upon arrival, they enter a building they've bought, an old orphanage, and discover its elderly, sick caretaker (Alice Krige) lives there with "her last boy" and refuses to leave. The hipsters call the cops to force her



out. Bad idea. The "last boy" is tall and scary and wears masks of human skin which is not his own.

Yup, it's Leatherface, now played by Mark Burnham. He's a lot older but still has the chainsaw — in fact, it's the original chainsaw from 1974. And he's angry. Also, Sally (Olwen Fouéré) is still alive. She, too, is angry. Alas, this is all you get in terms of plot — this, and some half-baked ideas that die after a few lines. Turns out — surprise! — a chainsaw is a durable instrument, and its efficacy in the hands of Leatherface doesn't seem to have changed.

Nor has much else. A half-century of social and technological development hasn't made much of a

> mark. Yes, there's a GPS in the car, and the young people have smartphones and Instagram. And that's about it.

All this may still be enough for diehard fans. In any case, at least the above-mentioned smartphones create the one, and the ONLY, funny moment of the movie. When the rampaging Leatherface appears with his blood-soaked chainsaw in front of a huge group of partying hipsters, said hipsters do not immediately scream or run — they take out their phones to livestream. One threatens to "cancel" Leatherface.

It's just a silly release of tension, before what is surely the goriest scene ever filmed on a party bus. But we'll take it (along with a blink-and-you-miss-it meta-joke from the director.) Still, if you're like me, don't let this loosen your grip on that remote. Soon enough, you'll need that pause button. You may want to do a little fast-forwarding, too.

# DOG

omething would have had to go very, very wrong for "Dog" not to work on a basic level. Pairing Channing Tatum, one of our most likable leading men, with a dog in a road trip two-hander is probably the closest you can get to a guaranteed win in Hollywood.

This is also a project that was born out of utter sincerity in the wreckage of a few years wasted on a squashed superhero movie. Tatum and his longtime producing partner Reid Carolin put their heads together to make something small, something meaningful, something they could do by themselves and something that they would want to see in a movie theater. And "Dog" was born, with both Tatum and Carolin making their directorial debuts.

In addition to directing, Tatum plays former U.S. Army Ranger Jackson Briggs, who is a lost soul when not in deployment. His day job making



sandwiches at a Subway-type fast casual restaurant isn't exactly giving him life. And all he wants is to get back overseas. There, he feels, he has a purpose. But though he has the motivation, he needs a recommendation, too, and his superior is not budging on that.

Then he gets an assignment: Take Lulu, a Belgian Malinois who Briggs served with,

from Washington to Arizona for her handler's funeral. If he can do this, maybe he'll get the recommendation and be back in the field. Lulu, who is played by three different dogs, is not doing well, though. She can't handle flying and she's prone to attacking people, so they have to drive the 1,600 miles to make the service.

The start is a little rough. Briggs sees Lulu as just a means to an end and basically a nuisance that he has to deal with. On their first stop, he leaves her trapped in his truck while he goes prowling for women in Portland — a fruitless endeavor. The film has several over-the-top gags, including one with a sadistic cannabis farmer and another where Briggs impersonates a blind man. All may theoretically work on their own, but they also don't quite mesh overall.

It's an interesting conundrum, because Tatum and Reid were not wrong to want to inject some humor and levity. But perhaps the issue is that Briggs is not your average Tatum character. He's selfish, he's got an ego and a temper and a young child who doesn't even recognize him when he comes to the door bearing a stuffed unicorn. Briggs is someone who doesn't even really know how broken he is.

The disjointedness starts to mesh after an illuminating stop in Los Angeles and the film gets back to its roots, which is Briggs and Lulu, without distractions. Together they have some genuinely moving breakthroughs and Tatum is allowed to flex his dramatic muscles more than usual.

Ultimately it does work, but "Dog" is a movie that is trying to do quite a bit, and perhaps bites off a little more than it can reasonably handle.

hether you're shopping for a casual get together or stocking your home bar, your goal on the liquor aisle is usually the same: Find quality alcohol at a price that won't break the bank.

To cut down your stress, look to the label for peace of mind when considering the quality level of spirits that fit your budget. Fancy packaging aside, the content provided on the label can be your best indication of the quality you can expect in the bottle.

Here are some tips to keep handy when navigating the booze aisle:

Tequila: The most important quality cue to look for when purchasing tequila is "100 percent agave tequila" on the label.

That's your guarantee the tequila you are drinking is made from 100 percent pure agave with no additives, added flavor or color. Tequila labeled "Oro," "Joven" or "Gold," by comparison, indicates designation as a mixto; a lesser-quality tequila made with equal parts agave and cane sugar distillates that can often lead to hangovers.

There are a handful of quality, affordable 100 percent agave tequilas on the





market today that sell for \$20 or less. Look for Familia Camarena Tequila (www.tequila-camarena.com), a widely available, popular-priced tequila produced by the respected Camarena family of Mexico. With tequila industry experience spanning six generations, Familia Camarena makes both 100 percent agave silver tequila (unaged) and reposado tequila (slightly aged) delicious for sipping or mixing.

Vodka: Stay away from vodka made from corn and other cheap sources of starch,

which often can taste harsh. Stick with vodkas made from pure, high-quality ingredients like potato, rye or wheat.

A great way to find affordable, high-quality vodka is to look for American-made vodka, which is often less expensive than higher-priced imports. Watch out for Blue Ice Vodka, a reliable and budget-friendly American potato vodka.

Whiskey: Remember that scotch, Irish whiskey and bourbon are all classified within the whiskey family, and all have great opportunities for budget-friendly bottlings.

Buy bottles at the lowest proof, or 80-proof (40 percent alcohol by volume). Distilleries often charge more for a higher proof, which can go as high as 160. Lower-proof bottles tend to be lighter and smoother in taste.

Instead of expensive single malts, pay attention to more economical blended whiskies, which blend malt whiskey with less-expensive neutral grain spirits. For superior-quality blended whiskies, look for those with a malt percentage that exceeds the grain percentage.

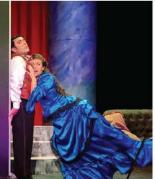

# **FOODS THAT CAN DISTRACT YOU** FROM A GOOD NIGHT SLEEP

2. Dried fruit

However, when consumed at night it can leave people feeling bloated and gassy. Like fresh fruit, they also contain high levels of sugar, which can give you an energetic high.

While cheese is generally thought of as comfort food, it is one of the worst to eat before bed. Amino acids are found in lots of strong and aged cheeses, and they cause us to feel awake and alert. Also known as tyramine, it causes our bodies to feel alert through the adrenal gland, which releases the 'fight or flight' hormone.

The same goes for preserved and cured meats such as bacon, ham, and pepperoni.

4. Curry

The chemical capsaicin is often found in spicy foods like curries and hot sauces. It elevates body temperature by interfering with the body's thermoregulation process. In turn, it can disrupt sleep, not to mention the high levels of energy required to digest spices.

#### 5. Sweets

No matter how tempting it is to have a sweet treat before bed, it's a bad idea for anyone, especially those struggling to sleep. Sugary foods, like ice cream, cakes and sweets send blood sugar levels spiking, followed by a crash. This crash in blood sugar alerts the adrenals that there is an emergency, which, in turn, increases cortisol levels, and wakes the body from slumber.

Those desperate for a sweet fix before bed should consider having a banana, as they promote sleep. If the banana isn't cutting it, mash it up and freeze it! It tastes surprisingly good.

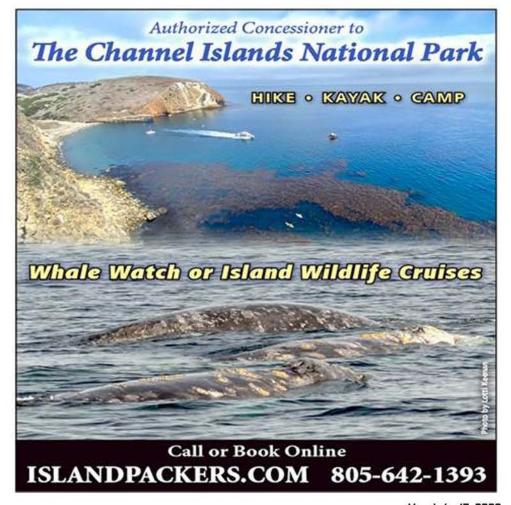

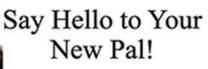

# NEWS OF THE WEIRD

Robin Folsom, 43, the former director of external affairs for the Georgia Vocational Rehabilitation Agency, was indicted on Feb. 10 for faking multiple pregnancies in order to get paid leave from her position, The Washington Post reported. Folsom reported her latest pregnancy to human resources in October 2020 and allegedly gave birth in May 2021. The "father" of the newborn, Bran Otmembebwe, emailed her bosses and said her doctor had called for seven weeks of leave following the birth, which she ordinarily would not have received. Pictures that Folsom shared with co-workers were found to be "inconsistent and depicted children with varying skin tones," the inspector general's report said. Co-workers also noticed that her baby bump seemed to be detached from her body. In addition, "a review of medical and insurance records found no indication that Folsom had ever delivered a child." Folsom resigned after an October 2021 interview with investigators and is due back in court in April.

It was sooooo cold in Beijing during the men's 50km cross-country skiing event. How cold was it, you ask? It was so cold (1.4 degrees Fahrenheit) that Finland's Remi Lindholm, who spent an hour and 16 minutes covering the course, suffered some painful frostbite to an unspeakably delicate body part that was not insulated enough by his thin suit and underlayer, The Guardian reported. Yes, that one. He endured a similar setback in Ruka, Finland, last year. Lindholm said he used a heat pack to thaw out the "appendage" after the Feb. 19 race but "the pain was unbearable. ... It was one of the worst competitions I've been in."

#### Police Report

Former Chadbourn (North Carolina) Police Chief Anthony Spivey, 36, was taken into custody in Conway, South Carolina, on Feb. 24, ending nearly a year of magnificent flouting of the law, WECT-TV reported. It all started in April 2021, when Spivey was charged with more than 70 offenses, mostly related to repeatedly raiding the department's evidence room and stealing narcotics, cash and firearms. In June, he allegedly embezzled \$8,000 meant for a family whose son was battling leukemia. North Carolina Wildlife officers contacted the Columbus

His total bond is set at \$1 million.
