Trevor Noah Malcolm Gladwell Dr. Sanjay Gupta Share The Distinguished Speaker Series Stage

he Distinguished Speakers Series has lined up an all-star array of live presenters for the upcoming 2024-25 season. This season's speakers include Trevor Noah, Malcolm Gladwell, Dr. Sanjay Gupta, Zanny Minton Beddoes, Emily Chang and the duo of Pete McBride & Kevin Fedarko.

"Our mission is to offer audiences inspiration and connection. Our events spark engaging conversations, new ways to look at things and discussion.," said co-owner Kathy Winterhalder.

The series kicks off October 15 in T.O., and October 16 in Pasadena with Trevor Noah, the Emmy Award-winning Host of The Daily Show, comedian & best-selling author. Noah's accomplishments include two sold-out stand-up comedy tours, a bestselling autobiography and Microsoft's Chief Question Officer. Noah will join the Series for a rare, intimate evening of conversation that will span his upbringing in South Africa, his career and his new book, Into the Uncut Grass.

Malcolm Gladwell, world-renowned observer and thinker, will take the stage on November 19, 2024 in T.O. and November 20, 2024 in Pasadena. Gladwell has spent his career searching for the counterintuitive in what we take to be the mundane. Thanks to his best-selling books, ordinary subjects help readers grasp complex ideas. Gladwell will take the stage to discuss his new book and his findings that topple popular understanding of bias, crime, food, marketing, race, consumers and intelligence.

Dr. Sanjay Gupta, the multi-Emmy Award-winning CNN Chief Medical Correspondent will join the Series on January 14, 2025 in T.O. and January 15, 2025 in Pasadena. Shaped by his experience as a practicing neurosurgeon and dedicated global journalist, Dr. Gupta will bring a unique perspective on the future of Global Health.

On February 11, 2025 in T.O. and February 12, 2025 in Pasadena, National Geographic's Adventurers of the Year, photographer and filmmaker Pete McBride and writer Kevin Fedarko, will take



audiences on an epic quest, on foot, through the entire length of the Grand Canyon—not "rim to rim" as has been tackled by many—but 750 miles "end to end."

Zanny Minton Beddoes, the first female Editor-in-Chief of The Economist, will offer unmatched insights and global perspective on the new developments that impact business and industry from emerging markets and a precarious European Union to corporate America and the latest twists in U.S. politics on April 21, 2025 in Pasadena and April 22, 2025 in T.O.

The Series will conclude with Emmy Award-winning journalist, Emily Chang, whose reporting on global technology and media companies, startups, and the future of business had Business Insider calling her "the star Bloomberg anchor that everyone in tech needs to know." When she joins the Series on May 6, 2025 in T.O. and May 7, 2025 in Pasadena, she will deliver an eye-opening talk.

Audience members have the opportunity to interact and exchange ideas with each speaker during a question and answer session.

The Distinguished Speaker Series of Thousand Oaks will be held at the Bank of America Performing Arts Center, 2100 Thousand Oaks Blvd, Thousand Oaks and the Pasadena Series takes place at the Civic Auditorium, 300 E. Green St. Each program takes place at 7:30pm. The Series is open in subscription packages. Tickets range from \$210 to premier seating at \$600 for all six evenings. cheduling a movie's release date is an imperfect science. While most are open to experimentation in what audiences want and when, there's also an unwritten rule that it's best to leave big superhero movie weekends clear of competition. But whoever thought to open "The Fabulous Four" alongside "Deadpool & Wolverine" deserves a raise. Because if any audience is being underserved on the opening weekend of an oxygen-sucking, violent and self-referential superhero mashup, it's women over 60.

So, what better way to escape with a mouth than a trip to Key West with Bette



Midler, Susan Sarandon, Sheryl Lee Ralph and Megan Mullally?

"The Fabulous Four" may not be a great movie, but it's better than it looks. Although it strains for raucousness with edibles and a parasailing expedition gone wrong, there is something admirably sane about it even if you don't believe a single moment. It begins with a somewhat tortured explanation of why these women became friends. Though it nods at a slight age difference between college peers Lou (Sarandon) and Marilyn (Midler) and the two gals they met in New York, Alice (Mullally) and Kitty (Ralph), it's better to not do the math.

The interesting question is not why four single girls in the same building became friends, but rather how they maintained that closeness. This big life mystery goes largely unexplored, instead focusing on the 40-year estrangement between Lou (now a heart surgeon) and Marilyn. It's a drama that for utterly incomprehensible reasons

Alice (a rock star, seriously) and Kitty (a cannabis entrepreneur grandma) are still entangled in.

Marilyn, recently widowed, is newly engaged and desperately wants Lou to be at her wedding. Alice and Kitty lure Lou to Key West under false pretenses, telling her that she's won a polydactyl (six-toed) cat and can visit the Hemingway House. They don't have anything more elaborate in store in this lie. Their plan, it seems, is just to roll up to Marilyn's house and surprise their unwitting hostage. This seems misguided at best but becomes retroactively cruel when the cause of the fallout is finally revealed. Why meddle now?

The movie was directed by Jocelyn Moorhouse, the Australian filmmaker behind great and varied female-focused films like "How to Make an American Quilt," "The Dressmaker" and "Muriel's Wedding," and written by Jenna Milly and Ann Marie Allison. And it never quite harmonizes. These characters, fabulous as they may be individually or on paper, aren't greater together somehow.

As Marilyn and Lou dance around this ancient feud, you start to feel bad for Alice (mostly there to be a quip machine) and Kitty, who would have much more fun ditching them and going off on their own adventure. Midler plays Marilyn so big and broad that she's more parody than person, although there is a grain of intrigue in the 70-something who gets engaged two months after her beloved husband dies and becomes obsessed with creating TikToks. Sarandon's Lou is the most thoughtfully developed character, as a rule-abiding woman whose life is in desperate need of a shakeup. She has some cringey moments too (the aforementioned edibles), but also several charming flirtations with the bachelors of Key West (Bruce Greenwood and Timothy V. Murphy)

This is a movie that should have probably leaned far less on wild hijinks with diminishing returns and more into the smaller moments of what it means to be friends for 40 years. But it's not without its charms, either. I'm not going to argue with them breaking into song out of nowhere. That kind of break from reality, especially with this cast, is always welcome.



it's that its titular hero understands his place in the world — well, in our world.

The irreverent and raunchy mutant is sure to belabor his awareness of the context in which he lives — namely an over-saturated, increasingly labyrinthine multibillion-dollar Marvel multiverse.



The "Deadpool" franchise has prided itself a subversive, self-aware anti-superhero superhero movie, making fun of everything from comic books to Hollywood.

It's no surprise then that the long-anticipated "Deadpool & Wolverine" further embraces its self-awareness — even as it looks increasingly and more earnestly like the superhero movie it loves to exploit. That tension — the fact that "Deadpool" has called out comic book movie tropes despite being, in fact, a comic book movie — is somehow remedied in "Deadpool & Wolverine," which leans into its genre more than the franchise's first two movies.

Perhaps this gives viewers more clarity. After all, someone who hates superhero films isn't going to be won over because of self-deprecating jokes about lazy writing, budgets for A-list cameos and the overused "superhero landing".

But this time around, director Shawn Levy seems to have found a sweet spot. Levy is helped by the fact that the film has a bigger budget, more hype and, of course, a brooding, eventually shirtless, Hugh Jackman as Wolverine — who has been teased as someone Deadpool has, er, complicated feelings toward.

That anticipation makes their relationship, packed with hatred, fandom and homoeroticism, all the more enticing. Their fight scenes are just as compelling as their moments of self-sacrificial partnership.

Speaking of worlds, there is one important development in our own to be aware of ahead of time. The first two "Deadpool" films were distributed by 20th Century Fox, whose \$71.3 billion acquisition by the Walt Disney Co. in 2019 opened the door for the franchise to join the Marvel Cinematic Universe.

Perhaps unsurprisingly, "Deadpool & Wolverine" takes full advantage of that vast playground, which now includes more than 30 films and a host of television shows. The acquisition is also a recurring target of Deadpool's sarcasm.

Although steeped in references and cameos, "Deadpool & Wolverine" is easy to follow for



the casual Marvel viewer, though it wouldn't hurt to have seen the first "Deadpool" and Jackman's 2017 "Logan," a harbinger of the increasing appetite for R-rated superhero violence. The Disney+ series "Loki" also gives helpful context.

A defining feature has been its R rating and violent action scenes. These scenes are much more visually appealing.

But "Deadpool & Wolverine" does succumb to some of the deus ex machina writing that often plagues superhero movies. Wade Wilson's relationship with his ex (?) Vanessa is particularly underdeveloped.

The plot feels aimless at points. One cameo-saturated battle scene in particular is resolved in a way that leaves its audience wanting. While there are a few impressive stars who make an appearance, audiences may be disappointed by the amount of MCU characters referenced who don't make it in.

The bloody but comedic final fight scene, however, is enough to perk viewers back up, solidifying the film's identity as a fun, generally well-made summer movie.

The sole MCU release of 2024, "Deadpool & Wolverine" proves it's not the source material that's causing so-called superhero fatigue. It also suggests, that increased attention given to making a movie will ultimately help the final product.

The Blues Remind Me

elly's Lot celebrates thirty years with a new album, The Blues Remind Me. While this is only the band's third Blues collection, they have included Blues tracks on all previous sixteen albums and have played that genre since the first night they hit the stage at The Roxy in Hollywood.

Paced by the strong rhythm section of Mike Sauer on drums and Matt McFadden on bass. The Blues Remind Me has a solid foundation to present this all-original selection of songs. Past Grammy nominee, keyboard player for 2014's Don't Give My Blues Away.



Mo Beeks adds his magical touch, playing on the majority of the tracks and singing a duet with Kelly's Lot front-person, vocalist Kelly Z. Longtime band member and sax player Bill Johnston arranged the horns, as he did

Paulie Cerra on saxophone and Tomislav Goluban on harp, bring their "Special Guest" best while Didier Reyes, Chip Tingle and Aviva Maloney, who also plays flute, round out the recording's horn section with Bill and Paulie. Band-mates Rob Zucca, Gary Bivona, and Frank Hinojosa added guitar, flugel horn and harp to complete the recording of songs written by both Zirbes and Perry Robertson, the latter who joined Kelly's Lot in 1996 as guitarist and soundman, started writing songs with Kelly, and has recorded and produced all the band's music since. Adding mixer to his credits for the first time with their 2021 live album Where And When, Robertson staved at the mixing board for The Blues Remind Me.

Kelly's Lot was formed in 1994 by Kelly Zirbes, a folk singer/songwriter with a heart for the blues. With sixteen CDs and lots of touring in the USA and Europe, the band celebrates thirty years since the first night the band hit the stage at the Roxy in Hollywood. Kelly Z met Texas guitar player and sound-man, Perry Robertson in 1996, who

soon after produced Kelly's Lot - Live at the Troubadour. Within a year he joined the band, started writing songs with Kelly Z and added the Southern rock and Texas Blues influences that have helped shape the Kelly's Lot sound.

In the last ten years Kelly's Lot have played festivals like BeachLife Ranch, Waterfront Blues Festival, Happy Face Music Festival, Simi Valley Cajun and Blues Festival, Nuits de Sologne and Lavaudieu Music Festival. Their songs have been heard in both movies and television and covered by other artists. Perry has recorded and produced most of the band's music including 2019 release Can't Take My Soul which brought the duo back to it's Americana roots. They recorded two more albums during the Covid pandemic: Another Sky, which features a variety of genres including the folk song 'Foolish Try,' which was placed in the new Ghostbusters movie Afterlife; plus Where And When, which took the duo back to the blues in a live and acoustic fashion. They'll return to Europe in July and August this Summer.

Highways That Charge EVs While You Drive

'WENDY'S PETER PAN' BRINGS NEVERLAND TO LIFE AT THEATRICUM BOTANICUM

Calling all young-at-heart: Will Geer Theatricum Botanicum has transformed its uniquely beautiful outdoor amphitheater into the imaginary isle of Neverland for a magical production of Wendy's Peter Pan. Theatricum artistic director Ellen Geer directs her "retelling" of the 1904 play by J.M. Barrie, with performances running June 22 through October 4.

"This beloved, classic fairytale of a boy who refuses to grow up was written 120 years ago," notes Geer. "Like Shakespeare, the adventures in Neverland will remain in our vocabulary and hearts forever. May our next generation never lose the innocence of belief in other worlds and other ways."

All the familiar characters are present as now grown-up Wendy (Willow Geer) recounts her marvelous childhood adventure to her own children. The tale comes to life on Theatricum's wooded stage as Wendy recalls how she and her brothers (Quinnlyn Scheppner as young Wendy, Jaz Bennassar as John, Julius Geer-Polin as Michael) flew off to Neverland with Peter Pan (Gabbi Beauvais), cared for the Lost Boys (Cole Dechant, Emelie Dechant, Asher Edwards, Logan Filippi, Luther Geer-Polin, Schroeder Shelby-Szyszk, Aster Laine Smith, Georgiana Swanson, Aralyn Clare Wilson, Elliott Grey Wilson), and crossed paths with Tiger Lily (Ianthe Marini), a mermaid (Robyn Cohen), Captain Hook (Lynn Robert Berg), the pirates (Hunter James, Craig "Linc" Lincoln, John Ellsworth Phillips, Kevin Rauch, Adam Roberts, Sky Wahl) and, of course... Tinkerbell.

The creative team includes composer and musical arranger Marshall McDaniel, choreographer Lexi Pearl, and fight choreographer Cavin (CR) Mohrhardt. Costume design is by Tracy Wahl, lighting design is by Zach Moore, and sound design is by Grant Escandón. Ian Geatz is the prop

master and Beth Eslick is the wardrobe supervisor. The assistant director is Hannah Froman. The production stage manager is Kim Cameron, assisted by Alex Penner.

Wendy's Peter Pan will run in rotation every weekend with Shakespeare's The Winter's Tale and A Midsummer Night's Dream, each of which open earlier in the season. Unlike most theaters in the L.A. area that stage continuous runs of a single play, Theatricum will perform all five plays in repertory, making it possible them all in a single weekend once the, all up and running.

Other events taking place at Theatricum this season include comedy improv with Theatricum's resident troupe Off the Grid at the end of each month (June 28, July 25, Aug. 30, Sept. 26); the Under the Oaks salon series on Fridays in September, and Theatricum's fourth annual Holiday Family Faire on Saturday, Dec. 14.





This truce lasted for a month before and after the games, during which all conflicts and wars were temporarily suspended. The truce allowed participants to travel safely across hostile territories.

Events and Competitions

The Ancient Olympic Games featured a variety of events that differed significantly from the modern Olympics. The original and only event for the first 13 games was the stadion race, a short sprint of about 192 meters. Over time, more events were added, including the diaulos (a double-stadion race), the dolichos (a long-distance race), wrestling, boxing, pankration (a no-holds-barred combat sport), and the pentathlon, which included running, long jump, discus throw, javelin throw, and wrestling.

No Second Place

In the Ancient Olympic Games, there were no silver or bronze medals.

Only the first-place winner was honored and celebrated, receiving a wreath made from olive leaves, known as a "kotinos." Victors gained immense prestige and often substantial material rewards from their home city-states, including cash prizes, free meals, and front-row seats at public events.

Ancient Greek athletes competed in the nude, a practice known as "gymnos" (from which the word gymnasium is derived). This was intended to celebrate the human body and its capabilities, and it also served as a tribute to the gods. Competing naked was believed to display an athlete's physical perfection and allowed for greater freedom of movement.



Remarkably, two brothers out fishing off the coast of Rye, New Hampshire, on July 23 caught a once-in-a-lifetime experience on video: A 30-foot-long humpback whale breached nearby, throwing itself onto the back of a boat where Ryland Kenney, 44, and Greg Paguette, 54, were fishing. As the front of the boat rose into the air, Kenney and Paquette were thrown into the water. "As it collapsed onto the boat, the mouth closed and smashed the top of the motor and I heard a big crunch," Kenney told The New York Times. "I had three seconds to act. I wasn't scared, I didn't have time to be scared." Colin Yager, 16, who took the video, and his brother, Wyatt, rushed over to pull the men, who were unhurt, out of the water. Kenney said he'll take some time away from the water to work on his boat, which will include a radar system that can detect nearby whales.

Gizmodo reported on July 19 that a few days before in Portoviejo, Ecuador, doctors removed an obstruction from a 24-year-old woman's stomach that had caused her pain, vomiting and difficulty eating. The object was a 16-inch-long hairball that weighed 2 pounds, Verdi Cevallos Balda General Hospital announced. The mass was so large it could be detected "by touch from the outside," said lead surgeon Pedro Lovato. It had started to move into her intestines, but doctors said it had not caused serious injury to her stomach and she would recover. The hairball was likely caused by trichophagia, a form of disordered eating where people swallow their hair. The patient is receiving comprehensive treatment.

On July 16, Talanye Carter, 41, returned to a St. Louis Jack in the Box restaurant she had visited three days earlier to complain that she'd been shorted one chicken strip, Yahoo! News reported. The store manager replaced the chicken strip, but that didn't satisfy Carter; she spit in the manager's face over the lack of adequate ranch dressing. When Carter went to her vehicle, the manager took photos of her license plate, and Carter noticed. She put the car in reverse and ran into the woman, knocking her to the ground and injuring her foot and ankle, then left the scene. She was charged the next day with second-degree and fourth-degree assault. [Yahoo! News, 7/22/2024]

Florida

The Walton County Sheriff's Office had to remind Floridians on July 18 not to "approach black bears at any time," United Press International reported. The bear in question was hanging out near Highway 98 in Santa Rosa Beach, looking "depressed," and onlookers were getting too close for comfort trying to take a selfie with it. Deputies borrowed a song title, "If Not Friend, Why Friend Shaped?" to discourage residents from cozying up to the sad-looking guy. A Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission biologist visited the scene, but the bear wandered back into the woods.
