# 2-YEAR-OLD PAINTER LAURENT SCHWARZ IS SELLING HIS COLORFUL ARTWORK FOR UP TO \$7,000



# FLY METO THE MOOK By Contributing Writer

Fly Me to the Moon" is better than it looks.

This is not a slam against the marketing campaign for the space race rom-com about a straight-laced NASA man and the Madison Avenue marketing savant brought in to sell the mission to the moon. It's more about moviegoing.

A film like this, with legitimate movie stars in Scarlett Johansson and Channing Tatum, a slick, glossy look, an original concept, and a sparkling title, is not a commonly



occurring phenomenon. We've been conditioned to see something like this and assume: It's the product of a high-spending streamer, or it's fake, like one of those movies-within-a-movie that's mostly there for laughs.

Both assumptions are on point, but the former is essentially true: This is an Apple production that like "Napoleon" and "Killers of the Flower Moon" is going to theaters first, through a traditional studio (Sony's Columbia Pictures). It's not just a gesture to theaters either — it's streaming date has yet to be announced.


The director is veteran Greg Berlanti, whose films include "Love, Simon" and "Life as We Know It." He seems to have taken a stylistic and tonal page from Peyton Reed's "Down with Love," that 1960s via 2003 Rock Hudson/Doris Day pastiche starring Renée Zellweger and Ewan McGregor. The script, by Rose Gilroy and story, by Bill Kirstein and Keenan Flynn, is lighthearted and breezy with a pleasing screwball energy, giving Johansson the opportunity to use the full wattage of her movie star power as the shrewd, self-made Kelly Jones. She's a female Don Draper minus the melancholy and dalliances, but with some secret baggage and the ability to charm.

If you make it past the opening, a cringey history lesson that has the depth and mance of a half-page, single-space elementary school report on the space race, you're in for a pleasant, if meandering, ride compliments of Johansson, who produced, Tatum and a talented roster of supporting actors (Woody Harrelson, Ray Romano, Jim Rash). Tatum might be a little miscast as the NASA launch director Cole Davis. Though he is a good match for Johansson and the bevy of knit sweaters he sports throughout, his portrayal makes Cole too instantly likeable for there to be any sort of dramatic stakes. Whether this was a miscalculation on the script. the direction or the casting is hard to say. But there is no will-they-won't-they, only when-will-they, which is not compelling storytelling.

This is a movie that is in no rush to get anywhere fast. In fact, the main selling point of the trailer, that Kelly has been hired to stage a fake moon landing in case anything goes wrong with Apollo 11, isn't even introduced until deep into the film. It's not the point of the story at all, just an aspect of it, which is a little disorienting during a first-time viewing. Rash, as a diva director-for-hire for this top-secret film project, makes these scenes very funny (although the recurring Kubrick jokes fall flat). Most attempts to reference the era beyond the great costuming and production design are also quite superficial - it's a kind of rose-colored-glasses version of the late 1960s in which racism and homophobia are practically nonexistent. Misogyny and former President Richard Nixon are punchlines and tolerable nuisances.

Another blunder was spending too much time with the Apollo 11 astronauts, down to the obligatory launch—a sequence that we've seen so many times and so much more effectively that there is little to be gained in clumsily shoehoming it in this kind of film. It's just an expensive distraction, grasping at grandeur that it didn't really need.

"Fly Me to the Moon" is best when it's not taking itself too seriously. And the most worthwhile concept it sold is the idea of Johansson and Tatum (which, by the way, is a great reminder to rewatch "Hail, Caesar!") as a modern Day and Hudson. They have the charm. They just need material that does it justice.



udge Reinhold is in a truck barreling down the highway chased by angry cops when he turns to Eddie Murphy at the wheel and says something we're all feeling, "God, I missed you, Axel."

We all really did, but we get the sarcastic and sweet Axel Foley once again in Netflix's "Beverly Hills Cop: Axel F," exactly 30 years since "1994's Beverly Hills Cop III." Is the new movie any good? Who cares?

The fourth outing brings back not just Murphy and Reinhold to the Axel Foley Cinematic Universe, but also long-time co-stars Paul Reiser, John Ashton and Bronson Pinchot. Kevin Bacon, Taylour Paige and Joseph Gordon-Levitt make their debuts.



The plot is pretty simple: Murphy's Foley is living his best cop life in Detroit — destroying things spectacularly — when he's asked to urgently return to Beverly Hills to help his estranged daughter, played with real grit by Taylour Paige. He then gets caught up in a murder case that has dirty cops and lets him make fun of snooty Beverly Hills.

Newcomers may be puzzled by the slow pace and '80s feel of Mark Molloy's directed sequel. It's not as funny as previous ones or ambitious in the way sequels for beloved franchises have gotten. But it has Murphy blowing stuff up and joking about it — all we need, really.

"Goddamn, Foley. Here we go again," says Ashton, playing the exasperated chief of police, and that sentiment runs through the fourth entry. All you need to make your Gen X friends happy is a montage of Murphy behind the wheel while "The Heat Is On" by Glenn Frey plays. ("Neutron Dance" by The Pointer Sisters also returns).

Speaking of music, the filmmakers seem to want to break some sort of record for Most Theme Song Plays in a Single Movie, as the instrumental tune "Axel F" by Harold Faltermeyer is cued up, by one rough count, approximately 5,000 times.

There are also a lot of vehicles commandeered in "Beverly Hills Cop: Axel F," perhaps a nod to the advanced age of the core group. There's a snowplow, a helicopter, a golf cart and trucks, none of which are returned in mint condition.

The screenwriters — Will Beall, Tom Gormican and Kevin Etten — leave plenty of places for Murphy to improvise but also craft some surprisingly strong dialogue between Foley and his 32-year-old daughter, both nursing hurt feelings.

"You didn't fight. I'm your daughter. The only thing you've ever fought for is your job," she tells him. "Look, we both messed this thing up. All right? Let's just call

thing up. All right? Let's just call it even." Come for the explosions, stay for the heart-to-hearts.

Murphy uses Mary J. Blige's "Family Affair" and proves it. In one scene, Foley is arrested while trying to drive away in a comically small cop car. One of the traffic cops is played

by Murphy's daughter, Bria, one of his 10 kids. Another cop who later tases him is a son-in-law.

A lot has changed in the three decades since Foley was breaking rules and skulls and there's the feeling of a requiem as these aged men go into battle again. "They don't want swashbucklers out there anymore. They want social workers," Reiser's detective says.

There are jokes about Wesley Snipes, small yappy dogs and Spirit airlines, a scary shootout on Wilshire Boulevard, way too much synth played and an inside joke about the last sequel, a stinker: Gordon-Levitt goes through all of Foley's brushes with the California police and says "'94, not your finest hour."

"Axel F" is not exactly Murphy's finest hour, either. But Murphy just saying "Jesus!" is funny. Let's hope we don't have to wait another 30 years for our next Axel Foley fix. God, we've missed him.

# **EMOTIONAL** SUPPORT AND SERVIC ANIMALS

he roles of service animals and emotional support animals (ESAs) have become increasingly prominent, offering support to individuals with various disabilities and mental health challenges. While both types of animals provide assistance, there are differences between them in terms of their roles. training, and legal protections they receive. Understanding these distinctions is essential for recognizing the contributions these animals make and ensuring they are treated appropriately.

What Are Service Animals? Service animals are trained to perform tasks for individuals with disabilities. According to the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), a service animal is defined as a dog that has been trained to do work or perform tasks for a person with a disability. This can include physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or other mental disabilities.

## Types of Service Animals

Guide Dogs: Assist individuals who are visually impaired by navigating obstacles and providing independence.

Hearing Dogs: Alert individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing to important sounds like alarms, doorbells, or approaching vehicles.

Mobility Assistance Dogs: Aid individuals with physical disabilities by opening doors, retrieving objects, and providing stability for walking.

Medical Alert Dogs: Detect medical conditions such as seizures, low blood sugar, or severe allergies and alert their handlers.

Psychiatric Service Dogs: Support individuals by performing tasks like interrupting self-harm, grounding during anxiety attacks, and reminding their handlers to take medication.

## Legal Protections for Service Animals

Service animals are granted extensive legal protections under the ADA. They are allowed to accompany their handlers in ublic places, including restaurants, hospitals, and stores. These animals must be under control at times, typically

through a harness, leash, other tether unless these interfere with the service

animal's work or the handler's disability prevents use of these

Emotional support animals provide comfort and support to individuals with mental health conditions. ESAs do not need specialized training to perform specific tasks; their primary role is to provide emotional stability.

> The Role of Emotional **Support Animals**

ESAs can be any type of animal, not just dogs. They offer therapeutic benefits by alleviating symptoms of condi-

devices. In such cases, the handler must maintain control through voice, signal, or other means.

Businesses are required to make accommodations for service animals and can only ask two questions: whether the animal is required because of a disability and what tasks the animal has been trained to perform. What Are Emotional Support

tions such as anxiety, depression, and post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). The mere presence of an ESA can provide significant comfort. **Legal Protections for Emotional Support Animals** 

While ESAs do not have the same legal protections as service animals, they are recognized under the Fair Housing Act (FHA) and the Air Carrier Access Act (ACAA).

Fair Housing Act: The FHA requires housing providers to make reasonable accommodations for individuals with ESAs. This ensures that people with mental health conditions can have the necessary emotional support. However, landlords can request documentation from a licensed mental health professional.

Air Carrier Access Act: The ACAA previously allowed ESAs to accompany their owners in the cabin of an aircraft without additional fees. However, as of January 2021, the U.S. Department of Transportation revised its regulations, allowing airlines to classify ESAs as pets rather than service animals. This change means airlines are no longer required to accommodate ESAs free of charge. Key Differences Between Service Animals and ESAs

Training: Service animals undergo rigorous training related to their handler's disability. ESAs do not require training.

Legal Protections: Service animals have legal rights to access public spaces, whereas ESAs have more limited protections.

Types of Animals: Service animals are typically dogs, while ESAs can be any type of animal.

While they serve different purposes and have distinct legal protections, both types of animals offer their handlers invaluable assistance and companionship. 


