




Boonion Station Is Back at Union Station LA

The fiendishly fun event will be held on Saturday, Oct. 30, and Sunday, Oct. 31, from 11 a.m. - 5 p.m. with two spirited sessions each day from 11 a.m. -2 p.m. and 2 p.m. - 5 p.m. Free advance general admission tickets are required and available at Eventbrite. Walk-ins will be welcomed on a first-come, first-served basis.

Boonion Station will transform the

downtown destination into a Halloween village featuring delightfully devilish activities for families including a fun and fuzzy spider forest, Halloween crafts, tarantula tattoos and mad scientist slime sessions to keep little monsters entertained.







The 21st Annual Dia de Los Muertos Family Festival (https://www.mainstreetcanogapark.la/) Canoga Park is November 7 from 10 a.m. – 5 p.m. featuring Aztec dancers, Mariachis, altars, a classic car show, arts, crafts, licensed food trucks, specialty food carts and beautiful altars.

The 22nd Annual Dia de Los Muertos at Hollywood Forever Cemetery (https://www.la-dayofthedead.com/event-info/) rocks on October 30, with two celebrations. "Dia de Los Muertos" 9 a.m. – 3 p.m. featuring art exhibits a children's plaza, arts and crafts vendors,

cultural performances, altars and culinary vendors. And "Noche de Los Muertos," 5 p.m. to midnight with altars, arts and crafts, Aztec, folkloric dancers and Mariachis, and cuisine vendors. Daytime tickets \$40 to \$150. Nighttime tickets \$50 to \$200.

INSIGHT: HOW WE EXPERIENCE HALLOWEEN (AND ALL ENTERTAINMENT) POST COVID.

SoCal's Halloween events are varied and all adhere to COVID protocols.

Outside – The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health, to enhance safety and lower the risk of transmission at large outdoor events, recommends that unvaccinated attendees wear masks when they are in crowded outdoor settings and when they are in sustained close contact with others whose vaccination status is not known. Outdoor events including the Ventura County Fear Grounds, Nights Of The Jack, pumpkin patches and Dia de Los Muertos celebrations follow county protocols with social distancing and masking for non-vaccinated.

Safe Together – The San Fernando Valley Halloween Drive-in movie night and Temecula Carriage Rides keep families together, with masks required when outside your vehicle. Outdoor Canoga Park Dia de Los Muertos requires only non-vaccinated guests to wear masks per county regulations and this year booked only licensed food trucks.

Double Check – Always carry a COVID mask. And check event guidelines before you go. Rules can change and differ between events. For example, Shawn's Pumpkin Patch, Sylmar's Discovery Cube Los Angeles and the USS Iowa Museum require everyone to wear masks. However, The Bowers Museum requires only non-vaccinated guests to mask-up.



DOWNTOWN SANTA MONICA HOSTS DÍA DE LOS MUERTOS COMMUNITY CELEBRATION

owntown Santa Monica, Inc. (DTSM) is honoring Día de los Muertos, highlighting the traditional Mexican cultural celebration of life and death, with a mix of live entertainment, art installations and family-friendly activities on the Third Street Promenade, Saturday, October 30 from 5 - 10 pm. Festivities include papel picado arts and crafts and face painting by Lil' Bitter Pixie, in addition to booths with goods from over 30 local BIPOC vendors with Angel City Market and Ballet Folklórico who provide a traditional

Market Exchange, a collaboration between Santa Monica artisans Ines Garcia, Laura Hernandez, Carmela Morales and Cogonate Collective, initiated by the 18th Street Arts Center.

A diverse lineup of performances begin at 5:30 pm on the Promenade Main Stage (located at the 1300 block of Third Street Promenade near Arizona Avenue) hosted by Normz la Oaxaqueña of Cumbiatón LA and will feature appearances from Santa Monica

Sculptures by Los Angeles-based artist Ricardo Soltero of La Catrina, one of Día de los Muertos' most recognizable figures created by Mexican illustrator Jose Guadalupe Posada, will be viewable throughout three blocks of the Promenade beginning Friday, October 29 through November 2. Altars created by local organizations and artists will also be on display beginning October 30 through November 2.

Soltero's iconic La Catrina sculptures range up to 14 feet in height and welcome guests to the Promenade in brightly colored traditional Mexican attire inspired by Day of the Dead traditions, Mexican icons and embroidery. La Catrina was first born out of Mexican social satire and has become a well-known figure in celebration of the holiday.

The Día de los Muertos Community Celebration is on Saturday, October 30 from 5 – 10 pm. La Catrina sculptures will be on display daily from 10 am to 8 pm, October 29 through November 2. Community altars will be on view October 30 through November 2.

The community celebration, altars and La Catrina sculptures will take place along the Third Street Promenade with performances on the Promenade Main Stage (located at the 1300 block of Third Street Promenade near Arizona Avenue).

NOTIME TO DE

n No Time to Die, Daniel Craig's swan song as MI6 agent James Bond, Craig gives his run as 007 a poetic finale. No Time to Die forces the titular character to reconcile with the past, embrace the present, and struggle with moving forward. Where previous Bond movies either leaned heavily into darker or more campy tones, Craig's final film as Bond merges both elements.

Accompanied by returning cast members like Jeffrey Wright, Naomie Harris, Léa Seydoux, Ben Whishaw, Ralph Fiennes, and Christoph Waltz, and newcomers Lashana Lynch, Ana de Armas, Billy Magnussen, and Rami Malek, this Bond chapter is solid.

Bond and Madeleine Swann (Seydoux) have escaped to a romantic life in Italy. The honeymoon phase is cut short when the sins of Swann's and Bond's pasts come back to haunt them. Bond is forced to end his retirement and team back up with MI6 and CIA operatives to eliminate a mastermind threat, Lyutsifer Safin (Malek). All the while, he must question and risk relationships he holds dear, wrestle with

being replaced by the new 007 (Lynch), and learn how to move forward.

In the 25th Bond movie, director/writer Cary Joji Fukunaga, actor/writer Phoebe Waller-Bridge and team, take a deeper look into the legacy that Bond leaves behind. Previous Bonds have shown him as the charming, handsome, and polished playboy super spy. Craig's turn brought to life a gem of an agent not yet polished. Him being rough around the edges added depth that opened ground for who Bond could be.

Craig's Bond brought arrogance, grit, and emotion to the role that bring new life to a character that's constantly reinvented. After five films, we see a fully realized agent who still seems to struggle with his personal and professional life.

Living in the past seems to be the common theme. What does it mean to be at peace with sins of the past and what do you do when they come back to haunt you? Not everyone has the answer and when they do, it still leads to catastrophe. Nevertheless, while returners deal with that question, newcomers navigate the path that the legacy of agents of old leave behind.



De Armas is an overload of charm as CIA agent Paloma. Partnered with Bond you can't help, but focus on her as she charmingly navigates her first "big mission". Lynch takes on the role of Nomi, the successor of the 007 moniker. She captivates as the ambitious, rising star of MI6, projecting Nomi's strong sense of self and fierce determination into each scene. Nomi is the polished 007 with the credentials to prove it.

Beyond the constellation of characters, there's always a menacing villain. We find this in Malek's Lyutsifer Safin, sort of. Malek is known

for providing a sense of eeriness to his characters, but here the creepiness borders on unpleasant. Malek's character lacks charisma and exchanges it for an awkwardness that resonates heavily on film.

The film shines in giving new perspectives on what Bond films can bring. Women characters designed solely to fawn over Bond, are traded in for women characters with fully developed storylines. A charming 007 is exchanged for an emotionally fraught Bond. The thrills, cool, and camp still make their way, taking a new dive into what this espionage franchise could become.

HALLOWEEN KILLS

alloween Kills is a dark chapter in the story of Laurie Strode and Michael Myers, with a somber tone and even more gruesome murders. It finds fulfilling ways to expand the world of Carpenter's original with a larger focus on the town of Haddonfield and characters from the 1978 classic, while unfortunately suffering from feeling incomplete.

The film starts with a flashback to the end of the original Halloween, expanding the role of Deputy Frank Hawkins (Will Patton) to show us what really happened when Michael was finally caught. Director David Gordon-Green and cinematographer Michael Simmonds recreate the look of Carpenter's original down to the film grain, and even find shockingly faithful ways to bring back old characters. Halloween Kills feels more closely indebted to the first film than the 2018 reboot/sequel did. There are nods to everything from Michael's gruesome disposal of a dog in the original movie, to Easter eggs to the entire franchise in addition to the returns of several

fan-favorite characters. The nods and cameos are more than just fan service; they enhance the franchise as a whole, connecting the trauma of the past with the resurgence of The Shape in the present.

The main story takes place immediately following the events of the 2018 Halloween, with Jamie Lee Curtis' Laurie Strode, Judy Greer's Karen, and Andi Matichak's Allyson leaving Laurie's burning home, believing Michael to be dead. Of course, evil never truly dies, and the Boogeyman comes home. This time, the cast expands to include more than the Strode women and innocent bystanders. Several characters from the 1978 original return, including Tommy Doyle (Anthony Michael Hall), Lindsey Wallace (Kyle Richards), Lonnie Elam (Robert Longstreet), and even former sheriff Leigh Brackett (Charles Cyphers).

The townspeople of Haddonfield form a mob and hunt down The Shape. This is unique for a slasher movie, and one that Halloween Kills doesn't really know what to do with.



Michael Myers is in no way the underdog. This is a much angrier, darker, and more violent film, and it includes shocking and disturbing kills. Halloween Kills fully displays Michael's brutal butchering

The shock value is exemplified when Halloween Kills gives us our first proper look at Michael's sadistic artistic expression via his grandiose and campy staging of mutilated corpses. Even John Carpenter's score is darker, slower, and more dramatic, building up to what can best be described as the Empire Strikes Back of the Halloween franchise.

That's not to say that Halloween Kills is completely devoid of fun. It still knows when to balance the scares with moments of levity, including two new comic relief characters, played by Scott MacArthur and Michael McDonald.

Most problems come from it being the second chapter in a trilogy. Some characters sit out the action for no reason, while themes and reveals are introduced and then dropped, including allusions to The Curse of Michael Myers. Much of Halloween Kills is just table setting for the final confrontation.

nowing how to clean your computer's storage is vital. You likely don't need to keep all of the files on your machine, and they could even be slowing it down!

The ones that you do need, well, they need to be well-organized.

Delete Unnecessary Files

Include Recovery Time In Your Exercise Plan

ive words or less - When you think about getting in shape, you might flash back to '80s movie montages of jogging up stairs, hitting punching bags and practicing martial arts moves. But if the movies had it right, they'd also show the hero kicking back with a glass of chocolate milk when it comes to getting in shape or improving performance, recovery time is just as important as working out. Exercise creates micro-tears in muscle fibers. The body repairs those muscles, making

them stronger than they were before the workout. But muscle repair takes time. If you exercise before your muscles recover, you increase the damage. Over a period of time, you'll actually sabotage your performance by repeatedly breaking down muscle without giving it a chance to rebuild.

The faster your body can recover after exercise, the stronger you'll get, because you'll be able to exercise at a higher level more frequently. Here are some tips for improving



muscle recovery for better performance:

* Fuel your muscles. Muscle recovery starts right after a



workout, so you should give your body the nutrients it needs to rebuild muscle as soon as possible. Drink water and electrolytes immediately after exercise.

Exercise uses up muscles' glycogen energy stores, so replenish them with simple carbohydrates. Make sure to eat protein within two hours after working out. In one study, those who drank chocolate milk after exercise recovered more quickly than those who drank a sports beverage, probably due to milk's balance of minerals, carbohydrates and protein.

* Increase circulation. The more blood going to your

legs, the better. Stretching and massage can help your muscles release toxins. You may also want to try a pain-relieving liquid, such as Absorbine, Jr. (www.absorbinejr.com). The natural herbal formula provides temporary relief from muscle aches by improving circulation and reducing pain, so you can speed up your recovery time and get back to your sport.

* Rest. Getting a full eight hours of sleep will help your body recover. On a similar note, give your body time to rebuild between workouts. Most athletes include one or two recovery days in their training programs, when they will either not exercise or will perform a low-intensity activity, such as walking.

GABRIEL FEITOSA DOG GROOMER WITH A CAUSE

Gabriel Feitosa, world-renowned dog groomer and star
contestant of ABC's hit competition show "Pooch Perfect," has
been revolutionizing the dog
grooming world from a necessity
to an art form. But his talent for
color and sculpture is more than
just a job for him – it was a lifeline
when he was growing up in the
favelas of Brazil.

Gabriel is outspoken about the importance of diversity, both as a Brazilian and a member of the LGBT community, and the impact that can have as the artistry of dog grooming finally finds its way into the spotlight.

"My final design on Pooch Perfect was inspired by my life journey," Gabriel explains.
"Throughout the show, I wanted to draw on my own beautiful, rich culture, and create something that honors where I came from. It is so rare to see LGBT Latino men make it as far as I did in reality shows, and becoming the Brazilian that went the furthest on American reality TV makes me incredibly grateful for having that opportunity. It was an amazing experience."

Dog grooming was both a passion and a necessity for Gabriel when he first started. The poverty-stricken favelas in Sao Paulo, where he grew up, are known for being some of the poorest, and most dangerous, communities in the world. At the age of eleven, Gabriel's family structure crumbled when his parents divorced, placing him and his two older sisters on a tricky situation.

This is when Gabriel found his first job at a dog grooming salon.

His talent was immediately clear, and he was able to build a career that took him to international dog shows and earned him awards in 4 different countries. He has styled for magazines, ad campaigns, and television – including Pooch Perfect, which he starred in last spring.

"There aren't a lot of opportunities where I came from, so a lot of kids turn to crime. It's hard to build a life that way, but people are just trying to survive. When I had the chance to learn something that was not only productive, but creative and fun, I really dedicated myself. I knew it would help keep me safe – and I became so



fascinated by the craft that kept me out of trouble," Gabriel says.

Despite the adversity he faced growing up, Gabriel is close to his Brazilian heritage. It's something that inspires him and adds an extra edge to his work. His colorful, highly-stylized designs make him something of a Keith Haring in the dog grooming world, but with a flavor all his own.

In San Diego,
Gabriel runs a salon
catering to clients
looking for a
high-end cut for their
dog. He's proud to be
a Latino business
owner, and he is even
prouder of the team
of dog groomers he
has built. Clients rely


on them for classic, well-groomed looks for their pooch on a regular basis. However, Gabriel is known for working with them on colorful, bright designs when they crave something to truly make their pup stand out.

Through it all, he has always stayed in touch with his roots. He works closely with Fight for a Kid, a Brazilian nonprofit that works on the ground within the favelas of Rio de Janeiro to teach kids martial arts. 

NEWS OF THE WEIRD

Timothy Wolfe of Lake City, Florida, arrived at the Lake City Chrysler Dodge Jeep dealership on Sept. 20 to buy a new car, WTLV-TV reported. And, bonus, he had a trade-in. But when employees checked the VIN of the trade, they found it was a car that had been stolen from that dealership just a few days earlier. Police were called, and Wolfe admitted to the theft, which had been captured on a surveillance camera. He was charged with grand theft and dealing in stolen property, among other crimes.

Two men in Byram, Mississippi, couldn't believe their luck on Sept. 19 when they came across an Acura with keys in the ignition and a "free car" sign, People.com reported. They drove the car to a family member's home and started to check it out, and that's when they found a surprise in the trunk: the body of 34-year-old Anthony McCrillis. The body had been there at least 24 hours, noted Copiah County Coroner Ellis Stuart. The men called 911 and waited for authorities; the car was registered to McCrillis, and his death is a mystery: He had "no visible signs of trauma," Stuart said. An autopsy is underway.

Betty Reid Soskin, a ranger at the Rosie the Riveter/World War II Home Front National Historical Park in Richmond, California, has been on the job for 15 years, but that's not what she was celebrated for on Sept. 22. Soskin, whose tours are some of the most popular at the park, according to People.com, turned 100 years old that day. She is the oldest active ranger in the National Park Service. In 2015, she said she is not "a trained historian — my tours are necessarily a way to share my oral history with the public. I tell the story of the African American workers."

In Summit County, Colorado, schools are struggling to find bus drivers, but Josh Smith, 12, has a solution. Smith, who lives with his parents in Silverthorne, approached them about kayaking to school across Lake Dillon, rather than having them drive him the long way. "I have a 12-year-old who wants to be adventurous, wants to do something none of his buddies would do, and how can I say no to that?" said Jason, Josh's dad. 
