



National Park Service Biologists Capture And Collar A Black Bear

In The Santa Monica Mountains

n April 23, National Park Service biologists captured and radio-collared a 210-pound black bear in the western Santa Monica Mountains south of the 101 Freeway.

The male bear, dubbed BB-12, is estimated to be about 3-4 years old. Biologists performed a full workup, including collecting biological samples, taking various body measurements, attaching an ear tag, conducting a physical exam, and fitting a GPS radio-collar around its neck.

Though there have been bear sightings over the years, this is the first time biologists have captured and radio-collared a bear in the Santa Monica Mountains. The nearest population of black bears is in the Santa Susana Mountains. Although bears have occasionally been documented in the Simi Hills, and even in the Santa Monica Mountains, there is no evidence of a breeding population in either area.

"He appears to be the only bear here in the Santa Monica Mountains, and he's likely been here for almost two years based on our remote camera data," said Jeff Sikich, the lead field biologist of the park's two-decade mountain lion study. "This seems to be our first resident bear in the 20 years we have conducted mountain lion research in the area. It will be interesting to see how he shares the landscape."

In July 2021, a young black bear was spotted lumbering along Reino Road in Newbury Park. Since then, images of a bear have been seen on wildlife trail cameras in half of the Santa Monica Mountains - from Malibu Creek State Park to the range's



western border in Point Mugu State Park. BB-12 may be the same bear.

Bears are omnivores and can live between 15 and 25 years. They will eat whatever is available, primarily fruits, nuts, roots, and insects. They will also eat small animals, up to and including deer, if they can get them, human food (such as in cars or at campsites), pet food, unsecured trash, and consume dead animals they find.

"As this bear gets older and is looking to mate, it might attempt to move back north and cross the freeway again," Sikich said. "There is no evidence of an existing population here in the Santa Monica Mountains, and therefore likely no females. With the radio-collar, we can track its movements and hopefully know where it may attempt to cross the freeway. This can help us better understand habitat connectivity for wildlife in the area."

Bear sightings have been rare in the Santa Monica Mountains. In the early 2000's, a bear carcass was discovered under a landslide in Malibu Creek State Park. In 2016, a bear was documented three times over three months on wildlife trail cameras in the central portion of the mountains but then never detected again.

Other black bears have occasionally been spotted through the years north of the 101 Freeway in the Simi Hills. Previous news reports include a bear spotted near Westlake High School in 2006 and one that was killed by a vehicle on the northbound 101 Freeway near Lindero Canyon Blvd.

The nearest population of black bears is in the Santa Susana Mountains. Grizzly bears formerly roamed the entire state but became extinct in the early 1900's. Black bears, however, are not native to Southern California.

In the 1930s, about 30 bears from Yosemite National Park were translocated into the San Gabriel and San Bernardino Mountains. From there, their population grew and expanded, biologists say.

Black bears rarely become aggressive when encountered, and attacks on people are uncommon. If you encounter a bear while hiking, keep a safe distance and slowly back away. Let the bear know you are there. Make yourself look bigger by lifting and waving your arms and making noise by yelling, clapping your hands, using noisemakers, or whistling.

DO NOT run and do not make eye contact. Let the bear leave the area on its own. If a bear makes contact, fight back.

NPS biologists say they are excited to add this bear, as a new species, to its wildlife study in the Santa Monica Mountains. They expect it will help provide new insights on how wildlife utilizes this urban, fragmented landscape.

Santa Monica Mountains National Recreation Area (SMMNRA) is the largest urban national park in the country, encompassing more than 150,000 acres of mountains and coastline in Ventura and Los Angeles counties. A unit of the National Park Service, it comprises a seamless network of local, state and federal parks interwoven with private lands and communities. As one of only five Mediterranean ecosystems in the world, SMMNRA preserves the rich biological diversity of more than 450 animal species and 26 distinct plant communities. What's Love Got to Do With It?


he romantic comedy may be on the endangered genres list in Hollywood, but thankfully our friends in England have continued to concoct and export enjoyable confections. Now we have "What's Love Got to Do With It?" starring Lily James as a documentary filmmaker, Zoe, who turns her lens to the arranged marriage of her childhood friend, Kaz (Shazad Latif).

Within a conventional rom-com, the ending of which isn't the slightest of mysteries, tropes are subverted, big questions are asked about love, and a warm spotlight is shined on Pakistani culture. Also Emma Thompson gets to drink and dance and say mildly offensive things to her daughter (James' Zoe) and her best friends.

The film, directed by Shekhar Kapur was written by Jemima Khan, a noted documentarian. She is also a generally glamorous woman about town who counted Princess Diana among her friends and had a high-profile marriage to Pakistani politician Imran Khan, with whom she shares two children. If not ripped from her own experiences, the film is a thoughtful distillation of her observations about arranged marriages and the misconception that they are akin to "a medieval chattel swap" or a forced marriage, as Zoe pitches to some bro-executives in an attempt to get the greenlight for her next project.

Zoe is straight from the playbook: Good at what she does professionally, bad at choosing partners. The filmmakers do give her the dignity of making her own choices.

But her mom is getting anxious about the ticking clock and, meanwhile Kaz, who was born in England to Pakistani immigrants, has thrown her for a loop when he decides to go the traditional route and have his parents involved in choosing a life partner who he doesn't meet in person until the wedding. While making the film, she starts to see some benefits in not starting with love but ending with it, especially as she sees some of the "love marriages" around her crumbling under affairs and disappointment. Latif and James have a subtle, but not insignificant, will-they-won't-they chemistry that is fun to follow.



Importantly, the script is self-aware about its "white lens." Also ample time is given to Kaz's mother (Shabana Azmi), who gets her own journey and arc with her children, one of whom is estranged for choosing a love marriage to a Caucasian.

The biggest liability is the film's name, which is a straightforward question about marriage but also a very famous Tina Turner song (which is not used) and name of a 1993 biopic starring Angela Bassett. At the very least, it's a little confusing.

And the conclusion is a kind of shrug, at least when it comes to arranged versus "love marriages." I guess it amounts to something along the lines of "follow your heart" and "don't push people away" but that's the sort of frustratingly vague advice that most have been trying to adhere to all along. The real takeaway, probably, is that no one should be turning to romantic comedies for life advice, just comfort and amusement, which this one has plenty of.

Guardians of the Galaxy Vol. 3

hen Peter "Star-Lord" Quill, while inspecting a murky extraterrestrial region, pressed play on Redbone's "Come and Get Your Love" in the first "Guardians of the Galaxy," it would have been hard to imagine that James Gunn's space opera would ultimately lead to something sincere, poignant and kinda comball as the trilogy-ending "Guardians of the Galaxy Vol. 3."

But the genetically spliced DNA of his chaotic, cartoonish cosmic vision is a double helix of opposites. Breezy '70s rock papers over extreme violence. Cynical exteriors cloak sentimental emotions. A ragtag group of outcasts talk a lot about "family" and "friends." Against the odds, "Come and get your love" has turned out to be a legit invitation.

"Vol. 3" is a messy finale. But you rarely question whether Gunn's heart is in it. Sometimes it spoils that effect by trying too hard to juxtapose extremes, and show off its brash juggling act. Yet

whatever this sweet, surreal sci-fi shamble is, everyone seems to believe in it. And for a movie that sends a golden-hued Will Poulter shooting through space to the tune of Heart's "Crazy on You," that belief goes a long way.

The song that kicks off "Guardians of the Galaxy Vol. 3" is not upbeat. Radiohead's "Creep" casts a sour mood over the Guardians, who we find in a state of disarray in the spaceport Knowhere following their 2017 "Empire Strikes Back"-esque second chapter.

Whether "Guardians of the Galaxy" is suited to strike these solemn notes, or reach for such last-chapter poignancy is debatable. I've always liked these films at their most cartoonish. Donning a degree of self-importance is probably the most Marvel thing about this "Guardians." Gunn's films — both written and directed by him — have always stood out for their distinct lack of



Marvel style. "Guardians 3," unfortunately, has contracted a touch of "Endgame" grandiosity.

The group — including Star-Lord (Chris Pratt), Drax the Destroyer (Dave Bautista), Nebula (Karen Gillan) and Groot (voiced by Vin Diesel) — is quickly sent into emergency mode. Adam Warlock (Poulter), an artificial being created by the High Priestess Ayesha (Elizabeth Debicki), comes careening into their lair, leaving Rocket (voiced by Bradley Cooper and played in motion capture an enhanced raccoon, the Guardians must resuscitate him with his original programming.

This means traveling to the lab he was created in before by the High Evolutionary (Chukwudi Iwuji, an all-time Marvel villain), who's been toiling to craft a "perfect" race of hybrid creatures. As the Guardians infiltrate his realm, "Vol. 3" flashes back to Rocket's experience with the High Evolutionary.

In this "Guardians" swan song Gunn centers on Rocket. These are epics of orphandom about distinctly un-superhuman characters. Mother and father figures float in and out, while the Guardians attract one forlorn figure after another.

HOM MUCH **DOES** A DRONE LIGHT SHOW COST

rones create a visual spectacle. But a drone light show can cost anywhere between \$500 and \$30000, depending on the complexity, the length of time and whether or not you want to hire a professional.



Factors That Affect The Cost

Factors include: Number of drones you need. Type of event: A small get-together might only last two hours while an extravagant gala could go three days straight! Consider how much time there'll be between setup/preparation and performance.

Equipment Cost

Lights range depending on quality and how many you need. A gimbal is an attachment that allows your camera to be stabilized while mounted on your drone. They're essential for anyone who wants steady video footage — expect to pay upwards of a few hundred dollars. Battery life is also a huge factor.

Software Cost

Software is the most expensive. You'll need software compatible with your drone. If you want to hire someone, there are options-from free solutions like Aerobo or Skylum Flocktivity all the way up through high-end professional systems. **Operating Costs**

Operating costs include flight time, fuel, and crew. You can reduce these costs by using shared fleets. **Drone Shows For Small Events**

The cost of a drone light show ranges on how long you want the show to be, what type of music playing, and how many people are attending.

Ask yourself: What is my budget? Do I have specific expectations? How many people are coming? How big is my space? Am I willing/able to do all of the work myself or would I rather hire someone? Does The Show Have To Be Outside?

Drone light shows must be outside. If you want your light show inside, we suggest using LED ropes and string lights instead.

Is There Any Facility Too Big Or Too Small?

Determine the size of your facility. The bigger the facility, the more drones will be able to fly at once. Consider whether or not you want a precise drone light show or one that is more natural looking. **How Long Does It Take To Setup?**

Setup time is dependent on the size of the show and how many drones are used. It will take about 2 hours to set up a small drone light show with 10 drones. For large shows, it can take up to 4 hours! **How Much Space Do You Need?**

That depends on the size of your event. At least two drones are required, but more is



better. We recommend that at least 10 feet separate each drone.

Are Drones Waterproof?

Yes! Drones are waterproof, but you should make sure to cover the propellers.

Fritz Coleman returns to solo comedy with the release of "Unassisted Living" on Tubi

Fritz Coleman returns to solo comedy with the release of "Unassisted Living" on Tubi, reflecting on growing old in the era of social distancing and social media

In his latest solo comedy show "Unassisted Living," now airing on Tubi, Fritz Coleman reminds audiences why he's been

welcome in people's homes for nearly four decades, whether as a legendary Los Angeles weatherman or as a tireless comic always developing new material for his act. "This one is about getting older," says Coleman, "and, as always, it's just the truth of my life lately."

As a young-ish 70-something who has dealt with aging in the time of Obamacare, big pharma and the pandemic, Coleman was actually eager to get back to a "regular" comedy routine after two years of pandem-

ic-era entertainment. He continued to co-host the Media Path Podcast with Louise Palanker, trading observations on pop culture with a variety of guests from Pat Boone to Henry Winkler to Congressman Adam Schiff, but was eager to get back to performing comedy in front of an audience, even as nightclubs were still closed. Fortunately, his age and peer demographic started working for him. "Most baby boomers don't really go to comedy clubs anymore, but I started to get invited to speak at a lot of lunches and dinners as Covid wound down. That gave me a chance to really work on some material in front of good audiences, so it's been almost two years' worth of developing this show."

Coleman and his production team on

"Unassisted Living" also took advantage of a Covid-era bingeing – in this case, the acclaimed HBO series "Hacks" – for inspiration. Delighted by the episode where Deborah Vance (Jean Smart) "revives" her tired act in a small nightclub, they sought out the same venue ("The Marilyn Monroe

Forum" room at the El Portal Theatre) as a location. "It was a great cabaret-style setting, about 80 people, and we staged it the same way, lit it the same way, because it was perfect for the act."

In an hour-long routine about dealing with aging in the era of social distancing and social media, Coleman delights in serving his loyal demographic in their current frame of mind. It's the same generation of

comedy fans who grew up with the hilarious extended riffs of George Carlin, Robert Klein, and Richard Pryor – but Coleman delivers with a gentler touch developed over years of working on local television news. 

Greenfield sets up a compost toilet in a busy area and gives his spiel: "Hey, did you know you can grow your own toilet paper? I want to show people that another way is possible. We just buy (toilet paper) at the store and we never think twice about it." Each leaf is about the size of a piece of toilet paper, and the plant supplies an abundance of them. They can't be flushed, but they can be thrown in the trash or buried in the yard. Passersby who get sucked in will also hear Greenfield's views on composting human waste rather than using flush toilets.

Field Report

Nina Jochnowitz was alerted on April 26 by a fellow citizen in Old Bridge, New Jersey, about an odd deposit near a stream, NJ.com reported. When Jochnowitz investigated, she found 500 pounds of cooked pasta -spaghetti, ziti and elbow macaroni -- dumped along a 25-foot-wide area. She posted photos on Facebook and alerted the town administrator and public works department, and two days later, the carb-y mess had been cleaned up. Jochnowitz pointedly remarked that Old Bridge is the only town in the county without bulk garbage pickup. Days later, the mystery of the pasta's origin was solved: A man moving out of his mother's home after her death discovered a stockpile of dry noodles and allegedly dumped them there. A weekend's worth of heavy rains softened the pasta, making it look as if it had been cooked. Old Bridge's mayor declared no harm, no foul, and the few stray noodles left on the ground are the only sign of the great pasta caper.

Fine Points of the Law

The Ohio Supreme Court ruled on May 3 that a man who was serving eight to 12 years in prison did not, after all, commit a burglary. In September 2020, Donald Bertram

approached the home of Timothy Huff as Huff was working in his yard, The Columbus Dispatch reported. Bertram walked into Huff's open garage, picked up a \$500 leaf blower, got in his car and drove away. But the court said that because Bertram committed the act without "force, stealth or deception," it wasn't a burglary. Instead, justices told Scioto County Common Pleas Court that he could be charged with misdemeanor criminal trespassing. Sentences for misdemeanors typically result in less than a year in jail.

Awesome!

From the too-good-to-pass-up file: Photographer Ken Pretty of Dildo, Newfoundland, had the extraordinary luck on April 27 to capture a 30-foot-tall iceberg floating in Conception Bay. (Nearby towns include Spread Eagle and Placentia.) Live Science reported that the berg, "a column with a domed head protruding up from two oval rafts of ice," resembled a phallus. "I knew I'd get a lot of comments," Pretty said, "but I didn't expect this much." Sadly, the "dickie berg," as locals named it, didn't last: It collapsed the next day.

Recurring Theme

It's happened again. Minnesota state Sen. Calvin Bahr of East Bethel garnered some unwanted attention on May 1 after he cast a vote via Zoom -- camera on, lying shirtless in bed with, inexplicably, an "I'm Just a Bill" character from "Schoolhouse Rock!" on the wall behind him. The Associated Press reported that immediately after casting his vote, Bahr switched off his camera.

Suspicions Confirmed

On April 29 in Groningen, the Netherlands, police pulled over a driver who had mowed down a post on a sidewalk, Oddity Central reported. The unnamed 35-year-old man refused a breath test, but he did produce a Ukrainian driver's license with a familiar name and photo: Boris Johnson, the former prime minister of the United Kingdom. The license had Johnson's correct date of birth but had an expiration date of 3000. Apparently, such fake licenses are popular at Ukrainian souvenir shops.




