


also makes it a great time to explore nearby attractions like the Integratron and the Noah Purifoy Outdoor Desert Art Museum.



alibu, known for its coastline, celebrity sightings, and laid-back yet luxurious atmosphere, is home to some great food and drink. magine you wake up one morning, stand at the mirror, and literally peel off any of your looks you don't like — with only movie-star beauty remaining.

How would it change your life? How SHOULD it change your life?

That's a question for Edward, protagonist of Aaron Schimberg's fascinating "A Different Man," featuring a stellar trio of Sebastian Stan, Adam Pearson and Renate Reinsve.

The very title is open to multiple interpretations. Who (and what) is "different"? The



original Edward, who has neurofibromatosis, a genetic disorder that causes bulging tumors on his face? Or the man he becomes?

When we meet Edward, a struggling actor in New York (Stan, in elaborate makeup), he's filming some commercial. We soon learn it's an instructional video on how to behave around colleagues with deformities. But even there, the director stops him, offering changes.

On Edward's way home, people stare. Back at his small apartment, he meets a young woman, in the midst of moving to the flat next door. She winces when she first sees him, as everyone does.

But later, Ingrid (Reinsve) tries to make it up, coming over to chat. She is charming and forthright, and tells Edward she's a budding playwright.

Edward goes for a medical checkup and learns that one of his tumors is progressing over the eye. But he's also told of an experimental trial he could join. With the possibility of a cure.

So Edward, spurred by frustration at not being able to get closer to Ingrid, joins the trial. These scenes take on the sudden feel of a sci-fi fantasy film.

As for the medication, it starts working sooner than anyone had hoped. Soon, Edward's skin is starting to come off in

clumps. It's terrifying. And then he finds himself at the mirror, disintegrating. But suddenly, Edward looks like — well, he looks like Sebastian Stan.

Naturally, life changes. When he goes back to the same bar in which he'd been stared at, he becomes everyone's buddy. A woman even wants to have sex with him. He catches his own eye in the mirror, as if to say: "What's happening to us?"

Edward makes a momentous choice. He simply disappears from his former life and becomes a "different" person. Now his name is Guy, and he lives in a nicer place. He has a job as a real estate agent — the ultimate face-forward career.

But Guy is not comfortable in his own skin. One day, he sees Ingrid walking into a theater. She's holding auditions for the play she's written—about a man just like Edward. In fact, it IS about Edward. And he becomes obsessed with playing the role.

In the auditions, Edward runs into another actor with deformities who says, poignantly, "I was born to play this." Guy of course cannot say why he disagrees — which is that HE is Edward. Here Schimberg is tapping into the thorny discussion over casting, and whether disabled roles should only be filled by disabled actors, trans roles by trans actors, and so on.

Ingrid does both. As playwright — and here, the superb Reinsve acquires an edge that her initial, sweeter incarnation lacked — she seems to understand instinctively that Guy, despite his dashing looks, has a connection to the character.

Enter Oswald.

We can't say too much about Oswald without veering into spoiler territory, because Oswald (Pearson) is the indispensable part of the last act. Oswald is (as is Pearson) an actor who has neurofibromatosis, but in all other ways he's extremely different. He's outgoing, engaging, brimming with effortless wit — British, too — and interacts with the world in ways Edward could only have dreamed of. Obviously, this will throw Edward/Guy for a loop.

What is Schimberg trying to say? He throws out questions about authenticity in life and art. Then, he shocks us with head-spinning developments that feel like they come out of nowhere.

But it's absorbing, and Schimberg works with confidence and brio. His cast is so good, you want the story to go on and on.



he tension in "Wolfs," starring George Clooney and Brad Pitt as rival fixers brought in to clean up the same crime, isn't the threat of police arrest or Albanian mob assassination — both of which are concerns. It's that Clooney and Pitt aren't pals.

The two start out as strangers. It's a testament to Clooney and Pitt's jovial on-and-off screen chemistry, and their bond in shared movie-star charisma, that it's genuinely discombobulating to hear Pitt tersely call Clooney "sir" as he does in the opening scenes.

Pitt and Clooney first acted together in 2001's "Ocean's Eleven." And like that remake riff on the Rat Pack original, "Wolfs" is as much, if not more, about its movie stars as anything else. The movie's appeal is in their charm and chemistry — the eye rolls and games of one-upmanship that accrue until, finally, they're buddies.

Clooney is 63 and Pitt is 60, and there are few bits about back pain and Advil. But "Wolfs," is designed to show you that they can still get the job done.

When their characters meet, they are both standing in the penthouse of a luxury New York hotel where a tough-on-crime district attorney (Amy Ryan) is in need of a cover up. A young, nearly naked man is dead on the floor. She's frantically searched her phone for a number once given for such emergencies. That brings the first never-named fixer (Clooney). Not long after, the second, also unnamed fixer (Pitt) knocks. After a moment of confusion, he points to a small camera at the ceiling. He's been dispatched by the hotel owner (Frances McDormand) who doesn't want bad press.

The two fixers are spiritual descendants, you might say, from Harvey Keitel's Winston Wolfe, the fast-driving cleaner of "Pulp Fiction." Each is a specialist, supposedly the only man who can do what they do. "Wolfs" is a little bit like the pointing Spider-Men meme brought to life. Fitting, then, that it comes from Watts, director of the three Tom Holland Spider-Man films. He also wrote the script.

There are more movies that "Wolfs" has kinship with, too, like Tony Gilroy's "Michael Clayton," a high point for Clooney. "Wolfs" doesn't measure up to "Michael Clayton" — what does? — and isn't trying to, anyway. This is more of an old-school movie-star-driven entertainment featuring two actors with skills as rarified as their characters'.

Informed that they have to finish the job together, the two fixers begin to go about the business of getting rid of the body. They eye

each warily, disinterested in giving away any tricks of the trade. This mostly falls to Clooney's character, whose creative way of lifting the body onto a luggage rack begins to earn the respect of Pitt's character.

They turn out to have much, maybe everything, in common. Slowly, reluctantly, they inch toward a partnership. It's a credit to Watts' keen sense of rhythm and his stars' subtlety that it more or less takes the whole movie to get there. Once outside the hotel, "Wolfs" unspools over the course of one night, shot sleekly in the shadows of downtown Manhattan by cinematographer Larkin Seiple.

Things get a jolt when the body in question turns out to be alive, and kind of a hoot, too. The kid, credited only as "Kid," is roused from a drug-induced stupor, and quickly, in tighty whities, goes escaping down the street, forcing the two fixers on an extensive chase leading up to the Brooklyn Bridge. The kid is played with a lot of goofy moxie by Austin Abrams ("Euphoria," "The Walking Dead"), and his account of how he got into this mess, delivered in a cheap motel, may be the film's



best sequence. Along with Sean Baker's upcoming "Anora," it's turned into a surprisingly good season for New York nocturnal odysseys propelled by mop-haired kids who end up in Brighton Beach.

But the kid's perspective on his two captors also pushes "Wolfs" along. He's naive enough to think they're his friends, even though they would seem duty-bound to dispatch him. Regarding Clooney and Pitt, both in leather jackets, from the back seat of the car, he otherwise correctly assesses them, calling them "like the two coolest people I've ever met."

Thankfully, someone has come to the not-hard-to-deduce realization that Clooney and Pitt are good together. A sequel has already been announced. "Wolfs" turns out to be both the beginning and the coda of a beautiful friendship.

Literally. Sean Edward Uribe, 35, was arrested on Sept. 12 in the wake of two incidents over the summer at Miami clothing stores, The Smoking Gun reported. During the first encounter, at a Ross Dress for Less in June, Uribe allegedly used a medical syringe to squirt a substance on the back of the shorts of a juvenile as he recorded with his phone, police said. Witnesses alerted store employees and the victim as Uribe fled the scene. In late August at a Marshalls store, Uribe allegedly struck again, this time targeting an adult woman to "spray an unknown substance on the victim's left buttocks area," police said. When Uribe was taken into custody, he confessed and said the liquid in the syringes was moisturizing lotion. Then he called his father, as police listened, and instructed him to go to his house and remove hard drives. "Put them under lock and key," he said. Officers got there first and seized the drives, along with loaded syringes. So far, he's been charged with battery on a child, two misdemeanor battery counts and tampering with evidence.

A Scandinavian Airlines flight from Oslo, Norway, to Malaga, Spain, was diverted to Copenhagen, Denmark, on Sept. 18 after a mouse crawled out of a passenger's in-flight meal, the BBC reported. Jarle Borrestad, who was sitting next to the passenger whose meal harbored the rodent, told the BBC that people on board remained calm, but he put his socks over his pant legs so the mouse couldn't crawl up his leg. Ovstein Schmidt, SAS spokesperson, said such events happen "extremely rarely"; passengers were transferred to another plane and went on their way.

On Sept. 24, as the Kamloops, British Columbia, city council met in the council chambers, someone zooming in online queued up a pornographic video clip while sharing their screen, the CBC reported. The council's public participation segment of the meeting allows people to ask questions or comment on agenda items, but councilman Bill Sarai said Tuesday's incident was the final straw for him. "It's really swayed far, far away from what it's meant to be," Sarai said. He wants to eliminate the public portion of the meeting and ask the public to interact through email or in-person meetings.

-- In November, Stack's Bowers Galleries in Boston will offer an extremely rare three-pence coin from 1652 for auction, CBS

News reported. The coin, which was minted in Boston at the Hull Mint, was purchased from a shop in the Netherlands. It is one of only three known coins like it, one of which was stolen and hasn't been seen since. Store manager Stanley Chu expects it to fetch well over \$1 million.

-- Student volunteers were helping out with an archaeological dig in Eu, France, when one of them found a small glass bottle inside an earthenware pot, United Press International reported. Inside the bottle was a message, written in January 1825, from one "P.J. Feret, a native of Dieppe, member of various intellectual societies." Feret was carrying out excavations at the same site and left the message for future explorers. "It was an absolutely magic moment," said Guillaume Blondel, head of the town's Regional Archaeology Service. Local records revealed that Feret was a well-known archaeologist of his time. Blondel said such finds are rare: "Most archaeologists prefer to think that there won't be anyone coming after them because they've done all the work."

A 27-foot-tall puppet in the shape of a seated baby has been installed in the center of the town of Rochdale, England, the BBC reported on Sept. 25. The baby, named Lilly, with a mouth and eyes that open and shut, is part of a council project to encourage schoolchildren to talk about the importance of the environment. Ostensibly, the kids will speak to Lilly; their conversations will be recorded and broadcast from the baby at an event on Oct. 24 at Hollingworth Lake Nature Park. But townsfolk aren't warming up to Lilly, calling it "the ugliest baby I've ever seen." One said, "It's creepy with its eyes shut, never mind open." No telling how school-aged kids will react to it.

-- A 58-year-old Simcoe, Ontario, Canada, woman, Wendy Washik, was taken into custody on Sept. 1 and charged with assault with a weapon, the CBC reported. The charges stemmed from an incident at a backyard party when Washik, who was playing with a child, accidentally shot a neighbor with a water gun while he mowed his lawn. Washik said she apologized repeatedly, but the "victim" "wouldn't listen to me and ... was screaming at me." She said police "didn't ask me a single question. They didn't ask to see the water gun." Washik was due in court on Sept. 24.

TOOTH FAIRY TRADITIONS FROM AROUND THE WORLD

A Global Journey Through Childhood Magic
