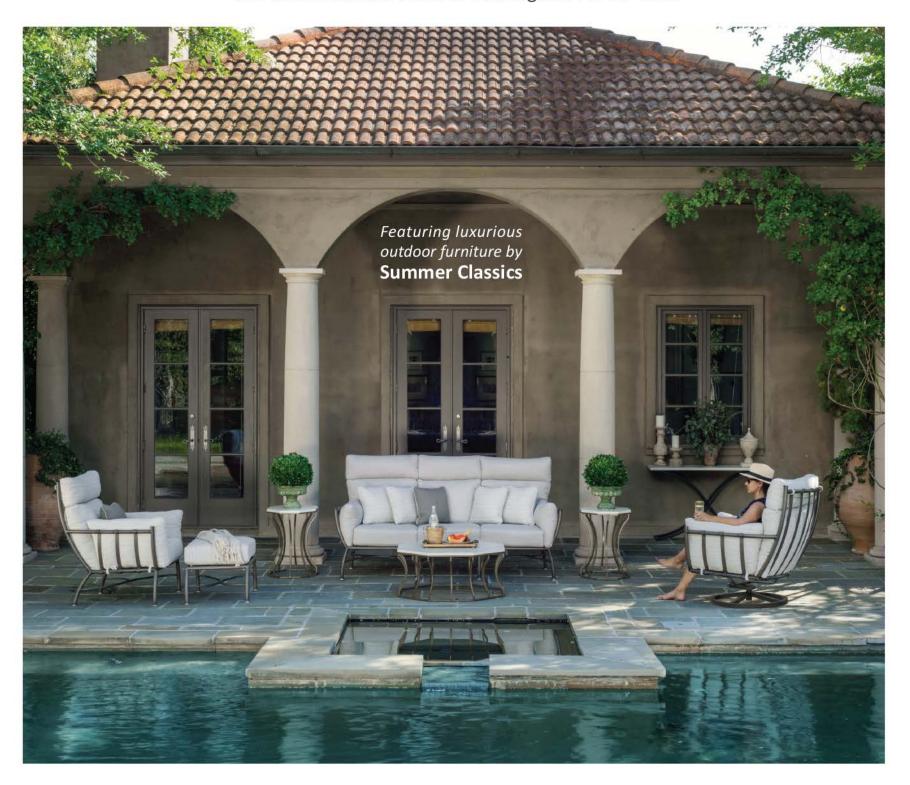




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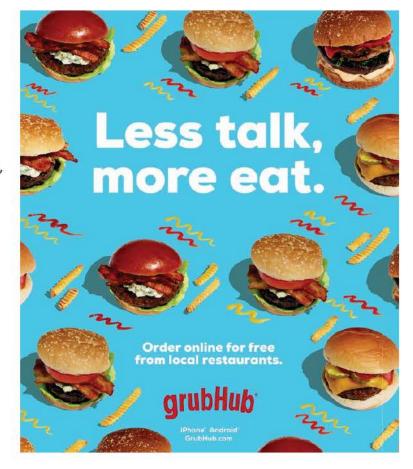
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JANE AUSTEN UNSCRIPTED

Cuba is calling at La Taverna Cubana (www.lat-avernacubana.com) in Valley Village. "This place slaps!" say foodies of its authenticity. The Traditional Sandwich Cubano is the best! Packed with delectable shredded pork, ham, cheese, pickles, dripping with mustard. Also not to miss: Tostones Rellanos fried plantain cup filled with your choice of Carne Molida, Lechon (pork) or Ropa Vieja (shredded beef). And plates like heavenly Camarones Al Ajillo shrimp in garlic sauce with white rice, plantains and beans. Cuban coffee, of course! The Cortadito, half-steamed milk, espresso, cinnamon powder, sweetened with brown sugar, is perfecto. Even cold beverages are house-made: Aguas Fresca, lemonade and Tamarindo. For dessert, Cascos de Guayaba (guava with cream) takes the cake.

Hole-in-the-wall bliss for soup-lovers. The Gourmet Soup Kitchen (www.thegourmetsoupkitchen.com) in Canoga Park handcrafts more than 30 varieties —Italian, American, Indian, Asian — of steamy, hearty natural vegetarian and mostly vegan soups from the kitchen of Chef/founder Amy Caplan and contributing chef/partner Daniel Tout to yours. Savor favorites like French Onion. Or explore. The African Peanut soup is crazy delicious! A heartwarming concoction of onions, carrots, celery, yams, filtered water, Napa cabbage, Golden Lentils, tomatoes, green beans, organic lite peanut butter, lite coconut milk, fresh herbs, spices, sea salt, olive oil, garlic and ginger. The Dharamsala Green is magic, too, with onion, celery, broccoli, spinach, kale, lite coconut milk, potatoes, lemon juice, garlic, ginger, spices, sea salt and olive oil.

in Italy -- at UOVO (https://uovo.la/) in Santa Monica. It's the only spot outside of Italy where you can eat fresh pasta made IN Italy! True! UOVO hand-makes the pasta daily in their kitchen in Bologna, Italy and overnights it to the restaurant!!!! (And sister restaurants in Marina del Rey, Mid-Wilshire and Studio City). The flight gives the pasta time "to rest," they explain. Not just any pasta. It's made with a type of egg only available in Italy and only used for pasta-making. Making their signature Carbonara, Cacio e Pepe and Bolognese pastas deliciously different. No surprise, the tomatoes and 24-month-aged Parmigiano-Reggiano and Pecorino Romano cheeses arrive direct from Italy, too.

Can't decide between Italian or Asian? Head to Caprese Restaurant (https://www.capreserestaurants.com/) in Chatsworth for classic Italian with a side of Chinese. Fans say it's "the best Italian in town," serving fresh, tasty classics with an emphasis on Caprese. The signature Caprese salad is a must, and melt-in-your-mouth Caprese Fish, featuring sautéed white fish (of the day) brushed with Italian herbs and extra virgin olive oil, with broccoli and garlic lemon tomato caper sauce. Out of nowhere, the menu also offers tasty deep fried Chicken Pot Stickers, veggie egg rolls and

Asian Sesame Chicken Salad. Go figure.

Latin fusion inspires a loyal following at Aro Latin (www.arolatin.com), a friendly corner hangout in South Pasadena. Crafted by husband-and-wife owners originally from India and El Salvador, the menu highlights Mexico, South and Central America, backed by handcrafted cocktails. Signature favorites include the flavor-packed Chufa de Pollo, a Peruvian-style fried rice, with shredded chicken, egg, bell peppers, onions and seasonal veggies. Ask the waiter to add shrimp – muy delicioso! And Salmon con Esparragos Cream, perfectly seared salmon over rice, with frothed asparagus cream and roasted asparagus. Vegetarian? The Esquites, roasted sweet corn and chipotle aioli with queso fresco, hits the spot.

Not your usual Chinese. It's worth the drive to Jiang Nan Spring (https://guide.michelin.com/en/california/al-hambra/restaurant/jiang-nan-spring) in Alhambra, an unpretentious restaurant that — wow! — received the prestigious Michelin Bib Gourmand award in 2021 for its focus on the cuisine of Shanghai, a region mostly overlooked by Chinese restauranteurs. The Michelin reviewer recommends, "Sweet vinegars and fresh seafood figure prominently, most apparent in plates such as the Shanghai Chicken, imbued with sweet wine sauce; and in the irresistible Seaweed Flavored Fried Fish platter of tilapia fried in a tempura-like batter flavored with seaweed."

If you're a Chinese soup fan, you'll be over the moon at the New Moon (https://www.newmoonrestaurants.com/locations) serving contemporary Chinese in Montrose. Enjoy the comradery of the light and airy bar. And deliciousness of the Sizzling Rice Soup's intense chicken broth, chicken, shrimp, crisp Chinese veggies and rice that keeps on sizzling. Insider secret – ask to add fresh long noodles.

Looking for healthy joints? India leads the way for veggie, vegan, gluten free and more. Glamor, and we're told celebrities, go hand-in-hand with authentic Punjab fare prepared with unconventional flair at Electric Karma (https://electrickarma.com/), a funky/upscale haunt showing Bollywood movies in West Hollywood. Order the signature (gluten free) Malai Kofta, tasty mixed veggie dumplings cooked in fresh saffron sauce. And naturally vegan Aloo Gobi cauliflower and potatoes sautéed with tomatoes, ginger and spices. Finish with Rose Donuts, milk balls in cardamom-fused rose water. Delicioso!



Healthy Mediterranean? Look no further than Lusy's Mediterranean Cafe & Grill in Valley Glen. Healthy, freshly-prepared cuisine, homemade sauces, unique takes on traditional recipes all made with select fresh vegetables, meats and seasonings. The recipes were taught to Chef Lusy by her grandmother when she lived in Armenia and have been passed down through generations of her family with Syrian, Lebanese, and Mediterranean influences. www.lusyscuisine.com



Don't trek to the Himalayas. Do drive to Pasadena and the Tibet Nepal House (www.tibetnepalhouse.com) for the best authentic Himalayan, Nepalese and Indian eats since 2001. They're passionate about getting it right, using only the finest fresh herbs and spices common to the region including Jimbu and black and white cardamom. Baigoon Aloo (naturally vegan) eggplant and potatoes sautéed in Nepali spices is a favorite. Also their signature,

Himalayan Tandoori chicken marinated overnight in indigenous spices, then roasted in a clay oven. Be sure to order the Phing. It's regarded as an auspicious dish because the long transparent phing noodles (made from bean flour) represent long life. Vegetarian phing sautéed with mushrooms, veggies and spices. Or chicken or lamb with onions and spices.

Food trucks gone wild. Specialists on wheels are taking alternative tastes to the next level. Transport yourself to New Orleans at The Beignet Truck (www.thebeignettruck.com), serving – only – this handmade Big Easy delight hot and fresh dusted with confectioners' sugar and drizzled with sauces from Nutella and Salted Caramel to Strawberry and dark chocolate. Find them at special events, and often on weekends in East Hollywood at Western and Franklin, and Atwater Village.

Meet the young East coast couple so dedicated to bringing high quality authentic East coast soft serve ice cream to LA they bought a food truck to do it! Look for CVT Soft Serve (https://www.cvtsoftserve.com/) in the San Fernando Valley. They partnered

with a local dairy to insure perfection – and purposefully have minimum toppings to showcase the creaminess and flavor of their custom-mix ice cream.

El Salvador gourmet pupusas (handmade thick corn tortillas filled with amazing combos) are the mouth-watering specialty of Vchos Food Truck (www.vchostruck.com). Naturally gluten free, choose among eight tasty stuffings like vegetarian spinach & cheese, dairy free pork & bean, and chicken, spinach & cheese, all with a side of house-made curtido (pickled cabbage) and house salsa. Please, order the caramelized Columbian plantains. Truly inspired. Check the website for locations.

Fusion fun rears its dinosaur head at Kim-Bob Rex Sushi Burrito (https://twitter.com/kimbobrex) usually in Burbank and Granada Hills. "Best sushi burrito in the galaxy," they claim, and we agree. The Sashimi Burrito with fresh, flavorful tuna, salmon, avocado, masago and sushi rice is a must. Go ahead and try the "Crunch Eel," fried freshwater eel, cream cheese, avocado, onion, crab meat, eel sauce and sushi rice. You'll be surprised how tasty it is.

Come on baby light my fire! Think you can stand the heat? Prove it by taking the "Dynamite Challenge" at Jitlada Thai Restaurant (www.jitladala.com) serving Southern Thai cooking in Los Angeles. Accept Chef Tui's challenge to finish his spiciest dish – stir fry with your choice of meat, and bell peppers, green beans, Thai basil slathered with mind-bending fresh and dried Thai chilies. Caution – you must be 18 years of age! Yes, really. And you must eat EVERYTHING on the plate to win and be eligible to sign the Dynamite Challenge book.

Looks can fool. It may be just a dip, but the Nam Prik Neum ground pork chili paste at the Spicy BBQ Restaurant (https://www.spicybbqtogo.com/) featuring Northern Thai in East Hollywood will bring sweat to your brow.

And rice cakes. The signature Yup Dduk rice cake at Korean eatery Yup Dduk LA (https://us.orderspoon.com/YUPDDUKLA/) in Koreatown is the spiciest rice cake ever. Not for the faint of palate. They come in "mild," "original" and "challenge." But even "mild" brings tears.

For seriously hot wings, order the "Chicken Lollipops" with ghost peppers at Bhanu Indian Cuisine and Market (https://mybhanu.com/) in San Gabriel. The



peppers are in addition to nearly 24 spices and a peppy house-made chutney. Country Style Jamaican Restaurant (https://www.yelp.com/menu/country-style-jamaican-restaurant-inglewood) in Inglewood is a contender, serving the hottest Jerk Chicken Platter (with peas and rice, caramelized plantains, cabbage) this side of the Caribbean.

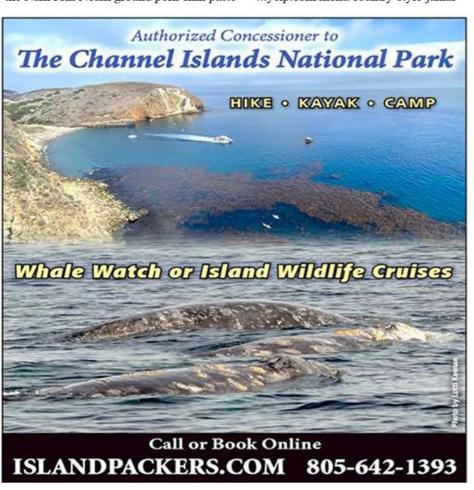
Devilish hot beef? Sri Lankan cuisine star Apey Kade Restaurant (https://www.facebook.com/Apey-Kade-146500275463867/)

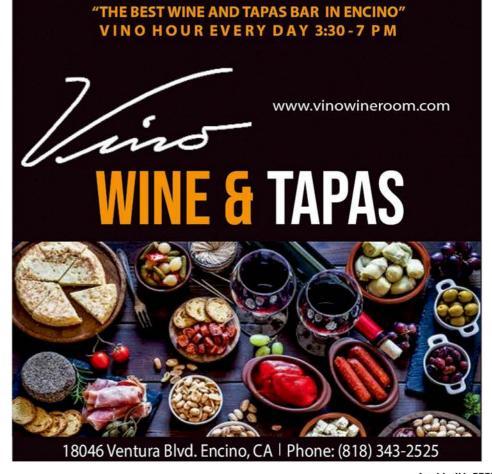

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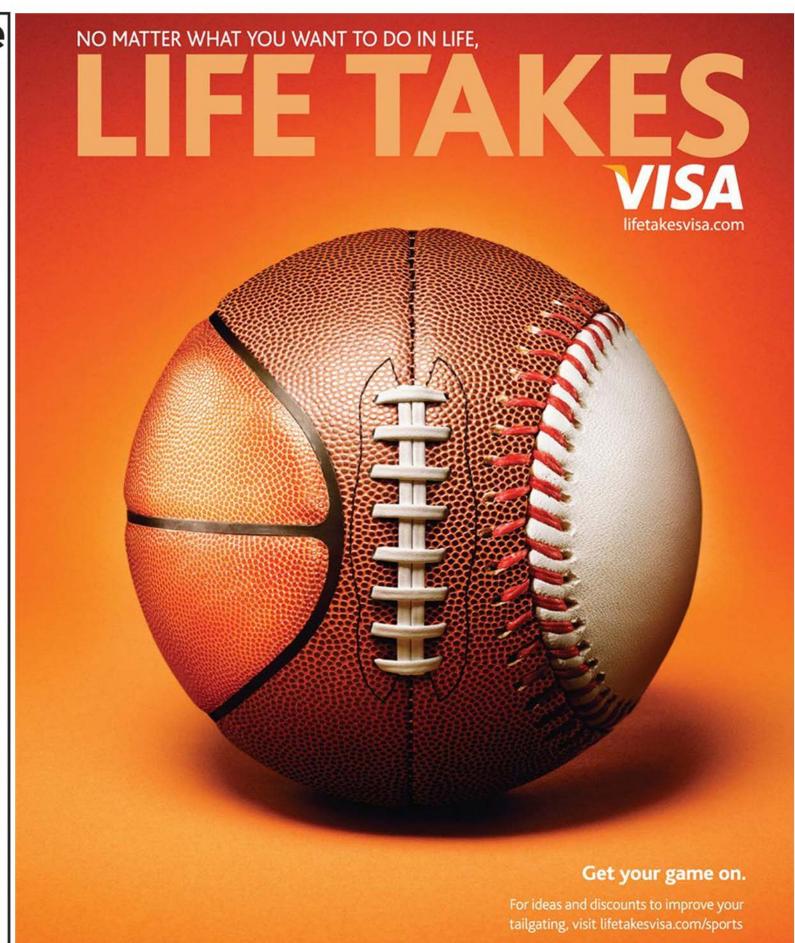

KNOW YOUR LIMITS

One of the most dangerous things you can do in the outdoors is overestimating your own abilities. Getting exhausted or pushing yourself too hard makes it all too easy to have an accident.

PLAN BEFORE YOU GO

Speaking of leaving your plan with someone, try to stick to the plan as much as possible. Stopping for a while to admire a view is perfectly fine, but your hiking plan is what will let others know if something has gone wrong.

When hiking in remote areas, there isn't always solid cell service or communication methods. Often times, the only way someone might know something has gone wrong is if you don't show up on time.

PACK THE ESSENTIALS

There are certain items that you should always keep in your hiking backpack. You can use the checklist below to make sure you're bringing what you need.

- · Navigation (Map, compass, GPS)
- · Sun Protection, Glasses, hat
- Insulation (Jacket, Hat, Gloves, Thermal Clothing, Rain Gear)
- Illumination (Lantern, Flashlight,
- Illumination (Lantern, Flashlight Headlamp)
 - · First Aid Kit and Supplies
 - Fire (Matches, Lighter, Fire Starters)
- Repair Kit and Tools (Duct Tape, Knife, Screwdriver, Scissors)
- Nutrition (Food, Preferably Non-Pershable)
 - · Water (Water and Water Purification

Supplies)

• Emergency Shelter (Tent, Tarp, Space Blanket, Bivy)

You should also customize the first aid kit you take. Fill it with things specific to you, such as medications, an EpiPen, or braces for old joint injuries.

DON'T GO ALONE

Hiking is a great activity to do withfriends. You can bond while out in nature, talk through issues in life, and the companionship makes the overall experience better. It's also much safer to hike in a group.

STAY ON THE TRAIL

One of the easiest things you can do to stay safe on a hike is to stay on designated trails. Even though trails can be long, checkout the trail map at the beginning of the trailhead, some are in and out trails, but often times there maybe loops as an alternative route. If you do have an emergency, the trail is the first place people will look for you. Going off the trail makes it much harder to find someone who needs help.

BE PREPARED FOR AN EMERGENCY

Do a little research and practice basic first aid. Learning CPR, how to bandage wounds or stop bleeding, and having a plan for reacting to inclement weather can all make a major difference in the event of an emergency. Safety is always first!!

JESSE AND THE ELF BOY

essie and the Elf Boy is an enchanting fairy tale, whereby a young girl befriends an elf boy, Ghillie (Huck Whittle), in the woods outside her home. We have no backstory for either character, nor are we given a name for the girl, we are just asked to follow them, as they joyfully galavant throughout this girl's childhood years, playing with a horse they have stumbled upon, and having adventures near Ghillie's woodsey fairylike cabin, until one day the

girl surprisingly moves away, against her will; Ghillie is distraught and begins to search for her.

We immediately fast forward to Jessie (Julia Brown), now in her young adult years — a hair stylist, looking for a job. She lands employment in one of a series of salons owned by her well-known, yet distant mother, Valerie (Gail Watson), who treats Jessie more like a slave than a daughter. Through conversations and facial gestures, we quickly understand that the mother has been rejecting her daughter for years; disappointingly, we never learn why. Jessie is also rejected by her boss, who resents her for being the daughter of the owner and so makes her life miserable. Jessie struggles to succeed as a hair stylist on her own, and to be happy, until Ghillie appears, and tries to help, instead creating mischief that turns Jessie's life upside down. There are Cinderella-like qualities to Jessie who does not remember Ghillie.

Regardless, Jessie and the Elf Boy is a fun film for children. Ghillie creates a good deal of mischief and suspense, as he attempts to help Jessie be a success, and seeks to protect her from those who wish her harm, and since no one can see him, unless wearing a necklace that only Jessie possesses, it appears as though magic is happening throughout. Although much of the escapades are fairly comy from an adult standpoint, I can imagine several



laugh-out-loud moments for young children, especially with the comical hairstyles that Ghillie comes up with and that Jessie takes credit for.

Where this film really shines for all ages, is in the end. Aside from the comical stunts, Jessie and her roommate have been helping Ghillie acclimate to the modern world, and circumstances occur that drive the mother-daughter narrative forward, so when a major twist happens the viewer is in absolute

shock! I sat bolt upright in my seat, simply amazed by a sudden realization, which was emotional and deeply significant for several characters, and the acting was so powerful in that moment that it made me cry. The acting is, indeed, solid by all main characters in this film, and the direction is on point as well. With the surprise ending intact, Jessie and the Elf Boy is an adventurous and heartfelt ride for all who believe in modern fairy tales.

CYRANO

ow the many pairs behind 'Cyrano' made music for the movie's lovelorn couples

Cyrano is deeply in love with Roxanne, a longtime friend who admires his spirit and his way with words. But Roxanne has fallen for Christian, a dashing young soldier — played by Kelvin Harrison Jr. — who's just joined Cyrano's regiment. Cyrano takes on the role of a go-between and even goes so far as to write impossibly eloquent love letters to Roxanne, passing them off as Christian's.

At the climax of this romantic triangle, Roxame stands at her bedroom window while the hopelessly inarticulate Christian tries to woo her, with some much-needed prodding from Cyrano. At a certain point, Cyrano takes over, and he gives full voice to his passionate feelings in a lovely duet between him and a still-unsuspecting Roxanne.

Fun fact: Dinklage and screenwriter Schmidt are a couple, as are Bennett and the film's director, Joe Wright. Think of it as a romantic behind-the-scenes footnote to a movie that's unabashedly romantic. Wright's filmmaking has a pleasing sumptuousness, courtesy of production designer Sarah Greenwood and costume designers Massimo Cantini Parrini and Jacqueline Durran, who were Oscar-nominated.

As he did in past films like Pride & Prejudice, Wright controls the camera with grace, letting us see the actors and dancers moving through space with none of the busy cutting you get in so many movie musicals. Bennett is a trained singer, and she delivers the movie's strongest musical performance; her Roxanne really comes to emotional life when she's called on to sing.

Dinklage has musical experience, too he was the frontman of a '90s punk band called Whizzy — and he expresses Cyrano's every longing with a deep, soulful baritone. He's an inspired choice for the role: Cyrano is always the smartest person in the room, easy to underestimate but hard to defeat in a battle of wits or weapons.

But Dinklage shows you the deep ache at Cyrano's core, and makes you feel the sting of his unrequited love. Some purists may miss that big nose, but there's something about the lack of prosthetic enhancements that makes Dinklage's performance all the more poignant: What you see onscreen is all him, nothing more and nothing less.

That disarming sincerity applies to the movie as a whole. It's not always the most graceful



retelling of this oft-told tale, but it's hard not to admire Wright's conviction and sometimes his crazy audacity. Only a truly committed director would have opted to shoot a climac-

tic battle scene at 16,000 feet above sea level on the side of Mount Etna, a live volcano. It's a showy flourish, for sure — but also a fitting one for a story of such grand, operatic passion.

s SLASH FT. MYLES KENNEDY & THE CONSPIRATORS wrap up their nationwide "The River Is Rising" U.S. tour with sold-out shows, the group have released their new single "April Fool" off their new album 4, which is available everywhere now via Gibson Records (in partnership with BMG), and in limited-edition bundles The group will celebrate the release of the new album by sharing it with fans around the world via a global streaming event to be held Friday, April 15, 2022, at 12 PM PT in an exclusive partnership with premium concert livestream platform Veeps.

"Slash Ft. Myles Kennedy & The Conspirators - Live From Boston," shot on location this month during the group's sold out House of Blues show, the full production, multi-camera streaming concert event will give fans around the globe the chance to see SMKC's electrifying live show which The Chicago Sun-Times heralded "a rock-solid powerhouse" and "a curated,



21-song salute to some of their own best material" adding, "As long as Slash is still standing, rock music will always be alive and well" (3/3/22). The set list will include classic favorites, as well as brand new songs from their new album 4, released last month on Gibson Records/BMG. Tickets for "Slash Ft. Myles Kennedy & The Conspirators - Live From Boston" are on sale now at Veeps; the show will be available for viewing for 48 hours after the event airs.

Fueled by the explosive Top 10 rock song "The River Is Rising" its high energy live

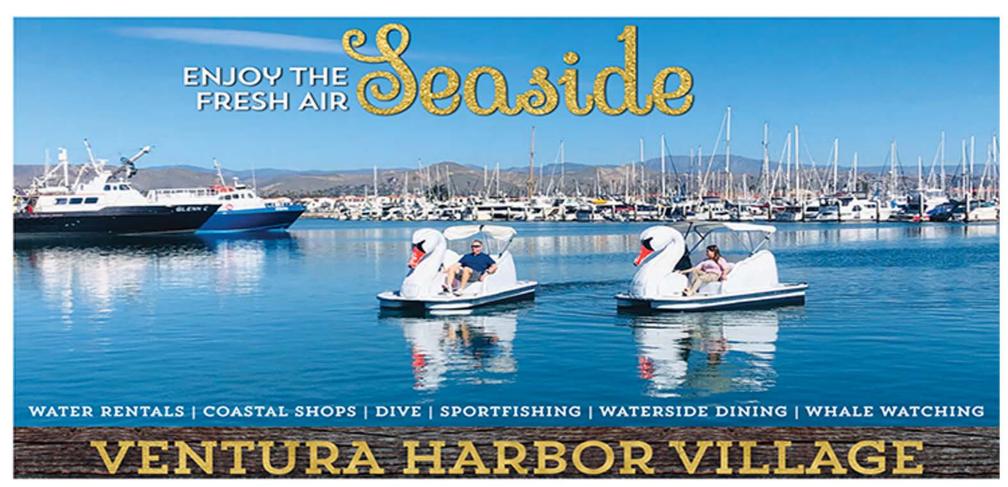

performance video, as well as the best critical acclaim of their career (see below) the new album 4 (available now via Gibson Records/BMG) debuted as the #1 Most-Selling Hard Rock Album during release week. The first single "The River Is Rising" reached #7 on the Active Rock Charts, marking SMKC's 8th consecutive Top 10 single at radio. SMKC performed "The River Is Rising" which Rolling Stone hailed as "raucous" and Billboard described as "euphoric" with "a surging main riff, dissonant hooks, an infectious chorus, and a guitar solo that conjures images of a rowdy bar brawl" on Jimmy Kimmel Live! Slash also did an interview with Jimmy Kimmel during the show.

A decade and four albums into their career, the new full-length album 4 marks the first new music from SMKC in four years and fifth solo album overall. SLASH and his bandmates MYLES KENNEDY (Vocals), BRENT FITZ (Drums), TODD KERNS (Bass & Vocals) and FRANK SIDORIS (Guitar & Vocals) aka SMKC, partnered with producer Dave Cobb (Chris Stapleton, John Prine, Jason Isbell, Rival Sons), for the new album 4 resulting in the

band's strongest collective statement to date. Recorded at RCA Studio A in Nashville, TN, Cobb shared the band's desire to lay down the tracks live in the studio--including guitar solos and vocals--a first for the group, revealing a stunning, vital sound and style all captured live.

4 is SMKC like vou've never heard them before. 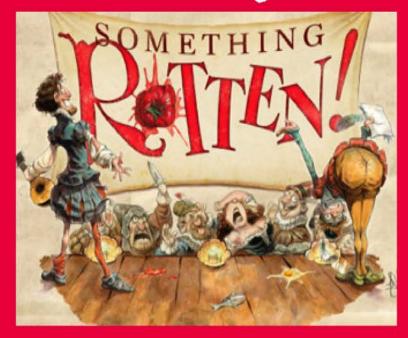

Bring Back The Classics!

Springtime is the perfect time to indulge in a refreshing cocktail on a balmy night. But before you reach for that minty mojito or sweet sangria, consider stepping out of your modern-day comfort zone and going back to the drinks of 100 years ago.

"Some of the best cocktails that we think about today — the martini, the daiquiri, the Manhattan — those all came out between the 1860s and Prohibition," says Derek Brown, an award-winning mixologist who has studied the history of alcohol in America.

Historians have dubbed that time span the Golden Age of Cocktails, an era when bartenders got pretty inventive. Brown tells NPR's Audie Cornish that these bar staples were originally simpler — but perhaps better tasting— than the versions modern-day cocktail lovers are familiar with.

Take, for instance, the daiquiri.

"Most people expect to get a daiquiri when they're going through a drive-through window in New Orleans ... and it's going to be full of grain alcohol and red coloring and things like that," Brown says. In other words, it's got a bad rap. But the original daiquiri, he says, "is really something so simple — it is rum, it's lime and it's sugar."

American engineer Jennings Cox is credited with inventing the daiquiri while working in Cuba in the late 1890s. The story goes that he played around with Bacardi rum to get the perfect flavor, then named the drink after the small town where he worked.

The daiquiri stayed in Cuba until U.S. Navy Adm. Lucius Johnson discovered it. Enthralled with the cocktail, the admiral introduced it to Washington, D.C.'s Army and Navy Club in 1909. It spread like

wildfire from there, eventually becoming a favorite of Ernest Hemingway and John F. Kennedy.

Another cocktail of the era, the martini, would probably be unrecognizable to barflies who order it today.

"Today you could walk into a bar and you could order a martini, and you might just get warm vodka with a bunch of olives in it," he says. "[This] masks the real character of the martini. The original martini at its invention was gin, vermouth and orange bitters."

Bartenders — then and now — would sometimes refer to a martini made according to the original recipe as a "silver bullet" or a "crisp cocktail," Brown says, because of its incredibly clean and fresh flavor.

The origins of the Manhattan ...

In his book Imbibe!, liquor historian David Wondrich writes that the cocktail was probably invented at the Manhattan Club, a social organization for Democrats in New York.

Another story points to more elite origins: It suggests Lady Randolph Churchill not only was mother to Sir Winston, but also begat this cocktail — she is said to have ordered a combination of rye and vermouth for a toast during a visit to the Manhattan Club.

Jerry Thomas authored the first bartenders guide in 1862. His signature drink was the Blue Blazer, a cocktail he'd light on fire and pass back and forth between two glasses to create a blazing arch.

While we don't know all the details, we do know that the Golden Age of Cocktails was a time when Americans learned to love mixed drinks.

The first bartenders guide was penned in 1862 by Jerry Thomas, who is considered the father of American mixology. "It really just marks this start of this incredibly creative period in making great cocktails," Brown says.



Thomas is famous for making bartending an entertainment. His signature drink was the Blue Blazer, a cocktail he'd light on fire and pass back and forth between two glasses to create a blazing arch. (That description reminded us of this "highlight" from the Tom Cruise cinematic oeuvre.) Oh, and he'd do it all with two white rats perched on his shoulders.

This sort of theatrical presentation — and the new savory blends — helped build enthusiasm for alcohol. But it was also blamed for encouraging the kind of rampant overdrinking that inspired women's suffragists to denounce the societal ills of alcohol, and eventually led to Prohibition in 1920, Brown says.

This spring, the National Archives in Washington, D.C., kicked off Spirited Republic: Alcohol in American History, an exhibit that explores how Americans have both enjoyed and denounced getting tippled throughout history.

As chief spirits adviser for the archives, Brown organized a number of boozy but educational public seminars to go along with the exhibit, including a discussion of the Golden Age of Cocktails, where guests got to sample the original drinks.



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ICONIC LOS ANGELES MATRE D' OPENS HIS OWN RESTAURANT IN BEVERLY HILLS

It's been a decade since hospitality veteran Tommy Salvatore started charming diners at Craig's in Los Angeles. "He's the ultimate maître d'," Tracey Tran says. "He knows everyone."

And now he's got his own restaurant that reflects his big vision and even bigger personality. Tommy's Beverly Hills in Beverly Canon Gardens (formerly the Bouchon space) opened in February to serve Californian Italian cuisine from Salvatore's strong point of view.

"I'm an Italian American from a tight-knit community in New York City," Salvatore says. His heritage inspired everything about the new restaurant from his endearing way with the guests to the menu. Chef Vartan Abgaryan filters this inspiration through a California lens. Think: everything you love about Italian food but a little bit lighter and brighter.

The restaurant encompasses several distinct spaces with their own vibe, but

Salvatore's presence as host ties them all together. "I have to admit that he's in control of the dining room," general manager Tran says.

"Over the past ten years, I've made a lot of good friends, and at any given time, 75 percent of the restaurant's guests are my friends," Salvatore says.

Tommy's is almost like three venues in one: the cafe, the dining room, and the living room.

The cafe, on the ground floor, is open during the day as a casual lunch spot. It's largely outdoors, with tables set up in the garden amid tiled porticos and shades of green with pink accents. Inside, there's a bar and some additional seating. "It's friendly and approachable; a neighborhood place," Tran says.

By contrast, the dining room is more of a special occasion venue you'd plan for in



advance. "Very Old Hollywood meets 1970s New York," as Tran puts it. "In one corner there's a navy blue sofa with cheetah-print pillows like you'd see at a friend's house, and then there's an ornate chandelier that looks like something out of a luxury hotel. Somehow it all really works together."

"The atmosphere here makes it stand out from other Beverly Hills restaurants. We built it to satisfy the community. We want people to feel comfortable," Salvatore says.

Though there are separate menus for the cafe and dining room, both share the same Italian-Californian sensibility. "Vartan Abgaryan is an incredible chef of many talents, and California cuisine is his speciality," Tran says.

The cafe menu features quintessentially Los Angeles dishes such as avocado hummus, hamachi crudo with passion fruit and citrus, and a salad of farmers' market lettuces beside Italian staples like an antipasti platter, cacio e pepe, and housemade cavatelli.

DINING \$

It's a concise menu compared to the upstairs dining room menu, which includes more elaborate preparations. "The cafe is for a quick power lunch," Tran says.

On the dinner menu, starters include beef carpaccio with porcini mushrooms, fennel, mustard seeds, and arugula as well as other light bites. The pasta section features standards like potato gnocchi with lemon and parmesan plus more creative interpretations, such as a seafood-centric riff on carbonara that combines squid-ink shells, uni, trout roe, bottarga, basil, and chipotle.

Salvatore's favorite dish is a hearty wagyu pot roast with cannellini beans, horseradish, and gremolata. "The flavors are absolutely amazing," he says.

Holding true to the Old Hollywood spirit, the beverage menu excels at classic cocktails such as manhattans, negronis, and martinis. "A lot of locals come by at 5 o'clock for a drink and to wait out the traffic," says Tran. The wine list is evolving, but there's currently a focus on California wines.

Consider doing lunges to a rear-foot balance, too. This helps you maintain your balance as you throw your ball. It can improve your accuracy.

Wrist Flexions

The wrist faces a lot of punishment while you're bowling. It carries the brunt of the weight of the ball when you throw it down the lane.
Unprepared wrists can face dislocation or fractures when they're introduced to a ball that's too heavy.

Incorporating wrist flexions to your workout routine is a great way to counteract this. This workout strengthens everything in your throwing arm. It helps your wrist, fingers, and your forearm becomes much stronger.

Burpees

Doing a full-body workout is optional but recommended. Burpees are ideal since they're easy to execute and will strengthen key points of the body for bowling. They also improve your body's coordination when performing different actions.

It will become easier for you to carry the ball close to your chest when you do this. This is important so you can have a more accurate shot. Side Planking

Your arms should also be stronger if you want to improve your game. Doing side planks is a great way to do this. This puts all the weight of your body on either hand, strengthening it.

Doing this makes it easier for you to carry the ball. This means you won't shake as much when throwing it.

Squeezing Hand Grippers

Your grip will also matter when you're bowling. Professional bowlers have a solid grip and it helps them have better accuracy when they throw the ball. A weak grip makes it harder for you to throw straight.

The ball may veer to the left or right if you have a bad grip. Squeezing hand grippers is an easy way to resolve this. These strengthen your grip, meaning you'll have a better hold on the ball.

Someone in Royton, Oldham, England, woke up on March 20 and felt like something was missing from their life. And maybe breakfast was particularly difficult that morning. The Manchester Evening News reported that at the Barclay Pizza & Prosecco restaurant, as workers cleaned up after Saturday night's festivities, they found a full set of dentures on the floor in the bar. Barclay owner Emma Whelan posted a photo of a plastic bag containing the false teeth on Facebook, hoping to locate the owner. "We get a lot of things left behind after a night in the Barclay ... but this is a new one," Whelan said. "It must have been a cracking night." [

The Roller-McNutt Funeral Home in Little Rock, Arkansas, is facing a lawsuit on behalf of the family of Harold D. Lee of Pauline, South Carolina, who was hoping to be buried next to his parents at a Quitman, Arkansas, cemetery after his death on Thanksgiving Day 2019. Lee's body was transferred to the Roller-McNutt facility and arrangements were made for the casket and funeral, KNOE-TV reported, but according to the lawsuit, the funeral home alerted the family on Dec. 10, 2019, that they had "accidentally cremated the body." Lee was extremely religious and "stickily (sic) desired not to be cremated, as he believed his body would be raptured following the second coming," the lawsuit stated. His wife, Eunice, was violently shaking in shock when she got the news. The funeral home waived the cost of the funeral and returned \$5,000 after the mistake was made, the lawsuit noted. [

Kristin Wiley, 49, was pulled over by Indian River County (Florida) Sheriff's officers after she barely missed hitting their stopped vehicle on March 20, The Smoking Gun reported. When they approached the car, they saw her 9-year-old son in the back seat, crying. The officer noted that Wiley's eyes were "watery and red in color," and he smelled alcohol on her breath, so he asked if she'd been drinking. She replied, "No," but her son piped up from the back seat, "Mom, you can't lie to the police. You did drink." He told the officer that his mom had been drinking at a party and said he was "very scared while Kristin was operating the vehicle," the officer reported. A breath test recorded her alcohol content at nearly three times the legal limit. Along with DUI, she was charged with child abuse.

When Steve Nichols and John Winn of Indian Trail, North Carolina, saw a TV news story about a dog whose owners abandoned him because they thought he was "gay," they knew they had to do something. The couple of 33 years told The Charlotte Observer that they drove to Albemarle on March 23 to adopt the dog, whom they named Oscar, after the Irish poet Oscar Wilde. Oscar's previous owners had surrendered him for humping another male dog, which, Nichols said, "was one of the stupidest things I've ever heard. That's just pack behavior." Nichols noted that the dog hadn't been neutered and was suffering from heartworm, which led him to believe that "the owner apparently didn't do anything to take care of this dog." Oscar is getting the care he needs and will join the couple's other dog, Harry, at their home. [

In the London neighborhood of Richmond, an unusual property that's been dubbed the "Invisible House" is attracting attention -- or flying under the radar -- of passersby, MyLondon reported. The front of the home sits on a busy thoroughfare and is almost completely covered with one-way mirrored glass, which reflects a roundabout across the road and the busy sidewalk in front. The family, who wanted to remain anonymous, said the architect wanted the mirror to "make the house 'talk with its environment.' We really liked the idea and ran with it." The back of the house sits on a quiet lane and features traditional architecture.

And Their Little Bird, Too!

In a scene eerily reminiscent of "The Wizard of Oz," the Castellanos family of Arabi, Louisiana, took a wild ride on March 22 as a destructive tornado ripped through the area, ABC News reported. Dea Castellanos was sitting on a couch in her living room when the house began to spin, whipping her into a bedroom. Her daughter, who has muscular dystrophy, was in another bedroom. The one-story home was lifted from its foundation and crashed down in the middle of the street, where neighbors called 911 and the girl was taken to the hospital. One of the Castellanos' pet birds stood among the rubble as they salvaged what they could; family members were "doing fine" after their ordeal.

ABOUT RUBIES

One of the most popular traditional jewelry stones, ruby is exceptionally durable. Its colors - always red - can reach vivid levels of saturation. Fine-quality rubies are some of the most expensive

Asterism

Rubies as well as sapphires can display asterism, the "star effect," due to rutile inclusions in their hexagonal crystal matrix. If this rutile is sufficiently abundant and precisely arranged, proper cabochon cutting can create star rubies.



gemstones, with record prices over \$1,000,000 per carat. However, rubies are also subjected to more treatments than almost any other gem.

The vast majority of rubies are "native cut" in their country of origin. High-value ruby rough is tightly controlled and rarely makes its way to custom cutters. Custom-cut and recut stones usually have higher values per carat than native or

commercial-cut stones.

Few other gems have as much myth, lore, and romance surrounding them as rubies. Over the centuries, many cultures have associated them symbolically with wealth and power.

Many historically important rubies, such as the famed Black Prince's Ruby of the British crown jewels, proved to be other red gems, most often red spinels.

Synthetics

Lab-created ruby can be manufactured by several different methods, including flame fusion, the Czochralski process, flux, and hydrothermal.

Corundum gemstones, both rubies and sapphires, were first synthesized in the late 19th century. In 1904, the French chemist Auguste Verneuil published his work on the flame fusion process, still known today as the Verneuil (vair-NAY) process. As a result, the production of synthetic rubies and sapphires skyrocketed.

Ruby Enhancements

Rubies have a long history of enhancement. Unless the seller specifically states the stone is unheated, you should assume that some kind of heat treatment has been used. Usually, high temperature heating and controlled cooling clarify the stones. This process dissolves silk (rutile inclusions) and can also improve color tone and saturation.

Myanmar

Stones from Myanmar generally command the highest prices. They have the coveted, near perfect coloring known as "pigeon's blood red," which is a very slightly purplish red with vivid saturation and dark tone. They also have extreme red fluorescence.

Mogok

A fabled deposit known for over 1,000 years, a mining tract in the Mogok region has been the primary source of gem-quality rubies. It's home to some of the finest rubies ever found. Mogok rubies hold color in virtually any lighting condition, which contributes to the demand for these gem-quality stones.

Sri Lanka

Some of the world's finest rubies have come from Sri Lanka's gem gravels. Top-grade Sri Lankan reds are virtually indistinguishable from their Mogok brethren, but most tend towards purple or pink. As with Sri Lankan sapphires, color accumulates in large stones. Stones of five carats or more can be quite magnificent.

Thailand and Cambodia

The main attraction of ruby from Thailand and Cambodia is its high clarity, but the flat crystal shapes generally yield overly shallow stones. Due to a high iron content, which quenches fluorescence, most of these rubies tend to have a garnet-red color.

In Thai/Cambodian rubies, only those facets where light is totally internally reflected will be a rich red. Thai stones are actually less purple than most Myanmar rubies. However, Myanmar-type rubies _appear red all over the stone.

Care

Corundum has a hardness second only to diamond among natural gems. Plus, it has no cleavage. These physical properties make ruby a superb jewelry stone.

For rubies reasonably clear of inclusions or fractures, no special wear or care precautions are necessary.

On the other hand, heavily included or fractured rubies have less durability. Clean these by hand using only warm, soapy water and a soft brush.

Hire a Good Photographer

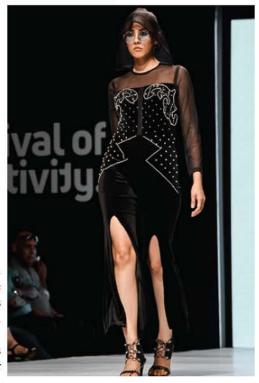
Top-quality photos require a good photographer. Research different photographers. Get to know their style. And of course, see what their prices are and what they're willing to offer.

It's crucial that you keep your portfolios updated. If you participate in newer photoshoots and campaigns, include the best shots.

Look for the Right Agency or Agent

Working for a modeling agency makes it a lot easier for you to find job opportunities.

Do your research by reviewing their websites and online reviews. Check out what models they signed for and what kind of work they have to offer. When searching for an agency, be sure they meet your needs and requirements. Don't Pay High Fees

If an agency asks you to pay upfront for any service fees such as portfolio creation, training, don't be overly surprised. Legitimate agencies do have fee's that come attached to them, so expect to budget that if you are trying to get signed.

Read the Contract

Read carefully before agreeing to anything. Consider is seeing what the "exit clause" is. It's always smart to know how to get out of the agreement.

Ask how the agency operates in terms of booking and setting up photoshoots.

Stay Alert

Not everyone you encounter in the modeling career can be trusted, If any interaction makes you feel uncomfortable, walk out promptly. Never pay for a modeling job or accept a check prior from someone you have not met in person.

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
