Opa! The Valley Greek Festival is back! The 47th Annual Greek Festival takes place Memorial Day Weekend, May 27 through 29, 2023 at Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church. The Festival evokes the sights, sounds, and tastes that define the Greek way of life.

Greek culture is one of the earliest civilizations in the world. Truthfully, some say the Greeks invented just about everything. After all, the Mediterranean diet, democracy, medicine, and the alphabet come from Greece. "Greek culture is rich in history, rich in family, and rich in gatherings and food," says Jimmy Nikolopoulos, Chairman of The Valley Greek Festival. "It is something to be acknowledged and

celebrated - plus we're a fun group of people!"

The Festival began as a small community fundraiser to have a good time and raise money for the church. It has continued to grow year after year and now hosts people and families from all walks of life, religion, and background. "Everybody can come and enjoy the Festival," says Jimmy. "Come and be Greek for a day!"

Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church sponsors the Festival and there will be church tours that take place where you can learn about the church, the religion, the iconography, and the Greek belief system. The Festival is a fundraiser for the church and all staff booths will be manned by church volunteers. "Being Greek Orthodox is a very big part of being Greek," says





Jimmy. "We're proud of our history and where we come from in terms of the Bible."

What can we expect at The Valley Greek Festival? Food, fun, entertainment, culinary exhibitions, Greek folk dancing, games for the kids, and independent vendors that sell merchandise such as jewelry, art, olive oil, cookbooks, and gifts. There's even a honey vendor that sells local drone honey. As well there is wine tasting, food from all over Greece, a limited leg-o-lamb carving dinner, cooking demonstrations, and a huge pastry section with homemade pastries! Music and dancing are also a lot of fun. Learn to Greek line dance and join hundreds of people on the dance floor where live music from authentic Greek band Synthesi is pumping. For the kids, there is a children's zone with bouncers and slides, jumpers and swings, games, goldfish from the fishbowl toss, and ceramic painting - everything that a kid

would want to do. Don't forget to sample the food! There will be everything from gyro sandwiches and Greek fries to Calamari, Dolmades grape leaves stuffed with rice and spices (vegetarian), Greek salad - ripe tomatoes, onion, green pepper, Greek dressing with extra virgin olive oil and feta cheese (vegetarian), Loukaniko - Greek sausage with a citrus flavoring, Paidakia flame-grilled Greek lamb chops, Pork Souvlaki - Greek seasoned

bread, and Tiropita - baked phyllo filled with cheese. There is also Greek coffee (hot and iced), Greek wines, Greek Ouzo and Metaxa as well as Greek beer. For your sweet tooth, Greek Loukoumades - Greek cinnamon honey donut holes and a massive assortment of homemade Greek desserts where you'll find Bakalava, Diples, and Kataifi to name a few.

Close to Home

Poppies galore! Blooming right now in Wildwood Regional Park (www.crpd.org/park/wildwood-regional-park/) in Thousand Oaks. Don't miss this wildflower-filled opportunity to enjoy the park's spectacular 40-foot Paradise Falls, Arroyo Conejo Creek, and the Indian Cave. Hike and bike along 14 trails (with benches) encompassing 27 miles. Pack a picnic or have a BBQ. Admission is free. Open daily, 7 a.m. – dusk.

Take the family to the Conejo Valley Botanical Garden (www.conejovalleybotanicgarden.com/) also in Thousand Oaks. While the wet winter has closed some of its 33 acres of natural terrain until July 4 – the Kids' Adventure Garden is open, open, open! Serving as a teaching laboratory to discover plant sustainability within the Conejo Valley. Plan now to enjoy the full experience in summer: sweeping vistas, and 15 hillside gardens including a native plant garden and meadow, butterfly garden, Mediterranean garden, bird habitat, rare fruit orchard, oak tree grove, Trail of Trees boasting more than 50 tree species, and mile-long trail beside an oak-shaded canyon stream. Admission is free. The Kids' Adventure Garden is open Sundays, 11 a.m. – 3 p.m. The Nursery is open Wednesdays, 9 a.m. – noon.

TULIP MANIA! At Descanso Gardens (www.descansogardens.org/) in La Canada Flintridge. OMG! Its thousands of tulips are in Peak Bloom! A sight to see with

endless rows of reds, yellows, pinks, striped, with smooth, and with ruffled petals. Then ooh and ahh at the gorgeous cherry blossoms, crabapple blossoms, azaleas, iris, and wildflowers. Admire nature's beauty in the Rose Garden, Japanese Garden, spectacular Camilla Collection, the Oak Woodland, Nature's Table edible flower garden, and Ancient Forest, of cycads and other plants that were around when dinosaurs roamed the earth. Plan to be there



for the Earth Day Displays, April 18 to 22, celebrating the importance of our majestic California oak trees and the habitat they create. And the free plant give-away on Earth Day, April 22! (While plants last.) Open daily, 9 a.m. – 7 p.m. General admission, \$15; ages 5-12, \$5; seniors/students, \$11. Free Spring Bloom Tours will be offered at 11 a.m. on April 21 & 22 and May 19 & 20.

Day Trippin'

Flower power wow! Thrill to more than 40 acres of Giant Teclate Ranunculus in blazing colors at The Flower Fields of Carlsbad Ranch (www.theflowerfields.com/), three hours south in North San Diego County. The spectacular display has delighted families for more than 60

years with florals and fun including tractor rides, a Sweet Pea Maze, Artist Garden with flowers as the art medium, Orchid Greenhouse and demonstration garden. Open through May. Tickets online: adults, \$23; ages 3-10, \$12.

Inland, near Temecula, visit the Santa Rosa Plateau Ecological Reserve (wildlife.ca.gov/Lands/Places-to-Visit/Santa-Rosa-Plateau-ER) and experience what California's native lands were like 200 years ago. Termed a

"living museum," the native oak woodland, chaparral, grassland, and vernal pools (seasonal wetland) are unchanged from nature. It's one of few places you can hike on a boardwalk into the vernal pool habitat, populated by tiny fairy shrimp and turtles. Trails including an interpretive trail offer access throughout its 7,500 acres.

For free drive-by floral extravagance – head north an hour from LA to The Flower Fields of Lompoc (explorelompoc.com/flower-fields/). Wildflowers (predominately yellow wild mustard) carpet the hills, while fields of commercial blooms – stocks, larkspur, delphinium, sweet pea, Bells of Ireland, Queen Anne's Lace – create spectacular patches of color just west of Old Town Lompoc. The best viewing is along Central Avenue from Floradale to Union Sugar avenues. Photograph and admire all you want. But don't walk into the fields. These posies are privately owned. Mark your calendar for the Lompoc Valley Flower Festival (explorelom-

poc.com/event/lompoc-valley-flower-festival/), June 22-25. Details to come.

While you're in Lompoc, consider hiking to nearby Nojoqui Falls explorelompoc.com/directory/nojoqui-falls-park-trail/) in Nojoqui Falls Park, 1.5 miles east of Highway 101. Cascading 80 feet over the rock face into a clear, calm pool, these stunning falls are seasonal – dependent on the rain – so now they should be spectacular! The 15-minute hike up the wooded canyon, past streams, and giant rocks with sweeping views of the surrounding landscape is a perfect way to appreciate the beauty of the Santa Ynez Mountains. Admission is free. Open daily, 8 a.m. – sunset.

Celebrate our state flower by the millions at the Antelope Valley California Poppy Reserve State Natural Reserve (www.parks.ca.gov-/?page_id=627), 15 miles west of Highway 14, near the city of Lancaster. See the poppies up close along eight miles of trails through the gently rolling poppy fields. There's a paved section for wheelchairs - and plenty of benches. Pop inside the reserve's Jane S. Pinheiro Interpretive Center, open through May 14, to see wildflower and wildlife exhibits, an orientation video, Jane's botanical watercolor paintings, and the gift shop. Open daily, sunrise to sunset. Parking: \$10 per vehicle.

Truly awesome – the natural beauty packed into 37-acre Ganna Walska Lotusland (www.lotusland.org/) in Santa Barbara. Acknowledged as one of the world's most breathtaking public gardens – you won't know where to look first. The exquisitely manicured gardens include



The Water Garden of magnificent lotus, Tropical, Orchid-cacti, Topiary, rainforest Shade Palm, California Palm Tree, Japanese, Fern, Dragon Tree, Cycad, Bromeliad, Aloe, Australian, and Insectary gardens, plus the Blue Garden with only blue-hued plants, and Olive Tree Allee. Amazing! Advanced reservations daily, 9:15 – 9:45 a.m. and 1:15 -1:45 p.m. Adults, \$50; ages 3-17, \$25, ages 2 and

under, free.

Make it a Vacay!

Show the kids the desert isn't empty. It's alive with brilliant blooms in Anza-Borrego Desert State Park (www.parks.ca.gov/?page_id=638), two hours from Palm Springs and San Diego in Eastern San Diego County. Look for Brittlebush, Heliotrope, Chuparosa, Barrel Cactus, Beavertail Cactus, Desert Dandelions, Sand Verbena, Dune Primrose, Desert Lily, Desert Sunflower, Fishhook cactus, Cholla, Parish's poppy and Emory's Rock daisy. Open daily, 7 a.m. – 7 p.m. \$10 per vehicle.

Plan to visit the Living Desert Zoo and Gardens (www.livingdesert.org) in Palm Desert between now and April 23 and learn how to start your own pollinator garden, during the "Pollinator Plant Party." Take home seeds of beginner-friendly, drought resistant, pollinator-attracting plants including sand verbena, desert milkweed, desert marigold, Mojave lupine and desert bluebell. Then stroll among the desert gardens and hike the view-filled trails through natural desert woodland of Smoketree, Palo Verde, desert willow,

desert scrub, creosote bush and white bursage. Join the Earth Day Celebration, April 22, 9 a.m. – noon, with hands-on activities, animal encounters and limited-edition trading cards featuring iconic desert species like the desert tortoise, Western Bluebird, and monarch butterfly. Open daily, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. Adults, \$29.95; ages 3 to 15, \$19.95, under 3, free.

Yosemite! It's a natural. So impressive it was granted National Park (https://www.yosemitethisyear.com/itineraries/yosemite-in-a-day-spring) status October 1, 1890 - the nation's third; behind only Yellowstone and Sequoia. Nestled in the Sierra Nevada mountains six hours northeast of LA, its icons are spectacular in person. The Mariposa Grove of Giant Sequoias. Bridalveil Falls. Half Dome. Tuolumne Meadows. But they're not the only natural wonders. Hike to Sentinel Dome for arguably the best panoramic view! Visit the park's lesser known Hetch Hetchy Valley and Rancheria Falls, at its fullest in spring. For the winning photo follow directions to the "Tunnel View," and capture Bridalveil Falls, the granite cliffs of El Capitan and Half Dome - all in one shot!

Hit the road! No drive compares to our gorgeous Highway 1 (www.visitcalifornia.com/experience/highway-ones-most-scenic-stops/), showcasing the power and beauty of nature with the beach and ocean on one side and rolling hills on the other. Impressive anytime, now in spring, the awe is heightened by wild flowers! Poppies, wild radish, lupine, yellow mustard, and sticky monkey flowers make Highway 1 a watercolor painting come true. Maybe stop in Cambria. At the Fiscalini Ranch Preserve (highway1roadtrip.com/things-to-do/fiscalini-ranch-preserve/) and explore 17 miles of trails through densely wooded coastal plain and rugged coastline.

Big Sur (www.bigsurcalifornia.org/) for sure! Winding for 90 miles, this panorama of ragged coastline stretching to the horizon is nature at its awesome best. Big Sur begins north from San Simeon up to Carmel, with amazing stops along the way. Pfeiffer Beach (https://www.californiabeaches.com/beach/pfeiffer-beach/), aka "Purple" beach, is a photo op must, where tiny bits of purple quartz give the sand a purple hue. And



the "Key Hole" rock showcases the creative side of erosion.

Maybe plan your trip to coincide with Earth Day, April 22, in Carmel-by-the-Sea (www.carmelcalifornia.com/). Appreciate the tree-shaded (and protected) fairytale-like ambiance, fine wine, and iconic 17 Mile Drive (www.pebble-beach.com/17-mile-drive/) with natural standouts like The Lone Cypress, and Bird Rock. Then join the Earth Day Celebration (ci.carmel.ca.us/post/earth-day-2023) at Devendorf Park, 10 a.m. – 2 p.m., and learn about green products, how to live



sustainably and Carmel's forward-looking Climate Action Plan.

Don't miss the Calabasas Earth Day Festival/ Green Expo (www.cityofcalabases.com), April 23, 2 – 5 p.m. at the Las Virgenes Creek site on Agoura Road. Give-aways, learning booths, a wild life presentation and kids' fun eco-learning activities. Admission is free.





The Super Mario Bros. Movie

pril is the cruelest month, breeding lilacs out of the dead land, mixing memory and desire, stirring dull roots with spring rain. But it is also Mario Time.

"The Super Mario Bros. Movie," with its primary colors, is here to brighten spring, T.S. Eliot be damned. That there is enthusiasm for a Mario Bros. movie is a once-unthinkable development. The last time Mario hit the big screen was in 1993 live-action film with Bob Hoskins as Mario, John Leguizamo as Luigi and Dennis Hopper(!) as Bowser.

But a lot has changed. A once widely derided genre is now a cash cow. "The Last of Us" is a massive success. Pokémon and "Uncharted" are box-office hits. With Sonic the Hedgehog already two movies in, Mario is playing catch up.

And "The Super Mario Bros. Movie" is a spirited attempt to race to the front of the pack. A collaboration between video-game designer and Mario creator Shigeru Miyamoto and Illumination founder Chris Meledandri it's a sincere effort to capture the fun and spirit of the game.

Visually, it's a dream. Directors Aaron Horvath and Michael Jelenic and their animators have rendered the Mario universe with cartoony splendor, matching the game's simplicity with a robust and delightful day-glo palate. If the appeal of playing "Super Mario Bros." and its many offshoots has always been to be immersed in a sunny imaginary world — plus the bouncy compositions of composer Koji Kondo — the movie has successfully mirrored that mushroom-stomping pleasure.

That's because as nice as it is to look at "The Super Mario Bros. Movie," it's not anywhere near as fun as it would be to play it. It's a-him, Mario, but it's no a-masterpiece. The storyline is only a touch above the interstitial bits of plot you get between gameplay. With the exception of Jack Black's grandly lovesick Bowser, there's nothing here that deepens these characters beyond their 2-D adventures. Mario may be a modern-day Mickey Mouse but his kingdom is on the console.

"The Super Mario Bros. Movie" begins in a Brooklyn pizza parlor. There Mario (Chris Pratt) and Luigi (Charlie Day) are struggling to get their plumbing business off the ground. There are a few moments of stereotypical Italian life before the brothers' attempt to fix a water main drops them through a portal and into the fantasy realm of the game.



On the other side, Bowser lords over a Koopa Troop army in scenes that can feel like the most surreal imitation yet of "Triumph of the Will." But while shrinking or enlarging are possible on this other side of the green pipe, there's never any mention of the possibility of lives being lost as Mario makes his way through mushroom patches and question-mark boxes. His predicament is just as clear as in the game: He's been separated from Luigi and he must help save Princess Peach (Anya Taylor-Joy) from being forced to wed Bowser.

Game logic dictates Mario's movements. The shells of the turtle-like Koopas can be slid around like ammo. And choosing a Mario Kart vehicle is just as difficult a decision. Sometimes, the overlap is less consistent. An invincibility star is the most sought-after item in this adventure, greatly exaggerating its typical usefulness. Those things last for like 10 seconds.

None of this is likely to be enough for anyone to exclaim "Oh, yeah!" while hopping up and down. But it is an hour and a half's worth of superlative marketing that will whet your appetite for more Mario back home on the couch. If anything, the — as Mario would say — "okey dokey" "Super Mario Bros. Movie" only reinforces the distance between two wholly different mediums. It may be game-on for video-game adaptations but the Mario main event is still back on Nintendo.

the first "Murder Mystery." And, yet, it was good.

"Murder Mystery," one of Netflix's most-streamed films, was full of exotic settings and mysterious murders. But the only thing that mattered, really, was Jennifer Aniston and Adam Sandler. Their married couple was a throwback to a long-ago movie era. Audrey and Nick Spitz, a pair of working-class New Yorkers turned amateur detectives, might as well be Nick and Nora Charles, the 1930s cocktail-swilling crime solvers.

"Murder Mystery" and its sequel don't have anywhere near the sparkle of the "The Thin Man" movies. But like those films, everything in "Murder Mystery" and "Murder Mystery 2" is secondary to the comic rapport between the Spitzes, a bickering but lovingly connected couple. "Murder Mystery 2" is built on star power and the interplay between Sandler and Aniston.

Whether "Murder Mystery 2" meets that bar will probably depend on how casually you're watching it. For many, it may be enough to say that "Murder Mystery 2," fits the bill as background noise.

And this one, in which Jeremy Garelick takes over directing with James Vanderbilt returning to write the screenplay, starts out like a new season to a TV series, with a recap of what the Spitzes have been up to. After luck solving their first case, they've made themselves full-time private eyes. The clients aren't lining up, though, so it's welcome when a friend, the Maharajah (Adeel Akhtar), calls to invite them to his wedding.

For those who have accused Sandler of using movies as an excuse to hang out with friends in beautiful locales, the "Murder Mystery" movies won't disappoint. This time, the action has been turned up, especially once the Maharajah is kidnapped. Strong's potent presence lends some credibility, but he also gives Sandler and Aniston a straight man to bounce jokes off of. Some of the gags are pretty dusty including one Sandler line comparing marriage to hostage negotiation.



All of this may lend scale to "Murder Mystery 2" but it's no help to the comedy. Despite that, comic chemistry can be hard to come by, and Aniston and Sandler keep these films entertaining.

In recent years the movies have struggled to figure out what do with bright, funny women. Even in these decent-at-best comedies, her natural sense of timing is lively, and she and Sandler make a charming, easy-flowing duo.



TEQUILA REPOSADO VS ANEJO: HOW THEY'RE AGED

Tequila is one of the oldest types of alcohol in the world, with its origins stemming back thousands of years to religious rituals and special ceremonies in Mexico. This sharp yet smooth drink was born and bred in Mexico from the blue agave plant, which grows in certain regions of the country.

The making of tequila is considered an art, with longstanding traditions and recipes that have been passed down for generations. It did not become popularized as a distilled drink (especially in America) until the 1900s, specifically after World War II, when the demand grew exponentially.

The process of making tequila begins with a ripe agave plant, which gets shredded and its juices extracted. It then goes through four steps before the final aging process: cooking, fermenting, distillation, and filtration. After these steps are complete, tequila is ready to be aged.

All tequila, regardless of the type, is aged the same way. The tequila is stored in wood barrels (oftentimes oak), where it is kept for a certain duration of time. The difference between tequila reposado and tequila anejo is simply how long they are aged in the barrels. The aging process affects two things: the color and taste of the tequila.

Tequila anejo is darker because it is aged for 12 months or longer (up to three years), whereas tequila reposado is aged for at least two months, but no more than 364 days. At the end of the day, your taste preference is the only thing that matters. For those who prefer a stronger and more flavorful tequila that can be enjoyed on its own, tequila anejo is a great choice.

TYPES OF TEQUILA REPOSADO

As we mentioned, tequila reposado is a younger variation of tequila that is aged for at least two months, but it cannot be aged for more than 364 days. Otherwise, it will move to the tequila anejo category. Tequila reposado is used in cocktails and shots, along with tequila blanco or silver.

Casamigos: This reposado tequila is aged for seven months. It is a light amber color, almost tan, with hints of caramel, cocoa, and oak. It is very silky and smooth. Casamigos also makes other varieties of

tequila, with its silver/blanco being the most popular.

1800: This tequila is perfect for sipping neat. It is 80 proof and comes straight from

Mexico. It has hints of fig and dried grasses that make for a deep overall flavor. It goes down smooth.

Espolòn: This tequila begins as a blanco before being put into American oak barrels. The barrels are charred in order to add an element of smokiness.

This particular tequila is recommended for cocktails that need a little extra something.

TYPES OF TEQUILA ANEJO
This type of tequila must be aged
for 12 months but cannot be aged
longer than three years. Tequila
anejo can be used in cocktails that
are darker and smokier, but many
people swear by drinking it neat.

Typically, if the tequila is darker and aged, it is served neat rather than in a cocktail.

Don Julio Añejo Tequila: An even bolder version of the original Don Julio. It tastes sweet with a hint of caramel, but ginger and pepper are also noticeable. Overall it is light, refreshing, and warm.

Patrón 7 Años Extra Añejo: This is actually an extra anejo variety that is aged for seven years. It is the rarest version this brand offers. It is made from 100% blue agave and aged in French oak barrels.

Tequila is a delicious yet strong liquor that comes in a few varieties. It is used in a range of cocktails and mixed drinks, most notably the classic margarita and the tequila sunrise. Originally used in ancient times, it quickly became popular in the United States and Europe in the 1900s.

The aging process for all tequilas is the same. The tequila is put into a wood (typically oak) barrel where it is left for specific durations of time, ranging from two months to three years depending on the type. If it is tequila blanco/silver, it is not aged, and the tequila is instead bottled after the distillation and filtration process. If the tequila is extra anejo, it is distilled for a minimum of three years and sometimes longer.

Tequila acquires its flavor profile and color depending on how long it is aged. It can be anywhere from clear to a dark amber color. Gold tequilas often have a caramel color added to them, but this is not always the case. The natural color variation of aged tequila is shades of amber, not gold.



A Noise Within's 'Daring to Love' season closes with a love letter to life in the theater: 'The Book of Will'

A Noise Within's "Daring to Love" season fittingly closes with a love letter—to William Shakespeare and a life in the theater. Geoff Elliott and Julia Rodriguez-Elliott co-direct The Book of Will, a comically outlandish but true story of love, loss and laughter by Lauren Gunderson. Performances begin May 13 at A Noise Within and continue through June 4, with previews taking place May 7 through May 12.



You don't have to love Shakespeare to enjoy The Book of Will, Gunderson's re-imagining of the desperate search to find, preserve and print Shakespeare's words that otherwise might have disappeared forever. Three years after the Bard's death, John Heminges (Elliott) and Henry Condell (Jeremy Rabb), former friends and colleagues from Shakespeare's acting troupe, the King's Men, contend with egotistical actors, bootleg knockoffs and a ticking clock to ensure that the First Folio gets published, and that the works of William Shakespeare don't end up on the

trash heap of history.

Backstage comedy meets detective adventure as this group of aging actors race against time to reassemble their repertoire — including Lear, Macbeth and Hamlet — some of which exist only in the lines they have memorized.

In addition to Elliott and Rabb, the cast includes A Noise Within resident artists Stanley Andrew Jackson, Nicole Javier, Kasey Mahaffy, Trisha Miller, Deborah

> Strang and Frederick Stuart, and guest artists Chuma Gault and Kelvin Morales.

"This is the perfect play for A Noise Within because it's about a company just like ours," says Elliott. "It's hard to find a play that's as brilliant, well-written and funny as this one, and it's all about a group of resident artists, an artistic community who have been working together for years, and how well they know each other, and the memories they share."

"It really shows how all-encompassing a life in the theater really is," adds Rodriguez-Elliott. "It's like religion. There's a moment in the play where one of the characters is experiencing





Can All Dogs Swim? ex

How to Teach a Dog to Swim

oes your dog run with excitement to every body of water? Maybe you can't walk past a creek or pond without your pup diving in. Or maybe your dog treats water like the enemy. Every dog is different. But can all dogs swim?

Depending on the breed, your dog might be a natural or swimming might be challenging. However, it's essential for safety that your dog learn to be comfortable around water. You might want to go boating together, go to the beach, or enjoy a cottage vacation. You might even have a backyard pool or visit somebody who does. Not Every Breed Is a Natural

Swimmer

If you think about a breed's traditional purpose, it becomes obvious that some will be drawn to the water. Certain breeds were born to swim because they were developed for water jobs. Consider the Labrador Retriever or the Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retriever. These dogs were bred to retrieve water birds. Some breeds even have water in their name like the Portuguese Water Dog who was developed to work in the water as a fisherman's helper or the Irish Water Spaniel with the distinctive water-repellent coat. These dogs have the physical structure to be excellent swimmers.

According to Michele Godlevski, NADD Dock Diving Judge, Certified Professional Dog Trainer, Certified Canine Behavior Consultant, and owner of Teamworks Dog Training in Raleigh, NC, some breeds seem to know how to swim from the moment they see a body of water whereas others just don't see the point. "There are also some breeds who have a weight distribution that would not make it possible for them to swim very well without a life vest." Short-legged, long-bodied breeds like Dachshunds can also struggle So, can all dogs swim? With a life vest and some swimming lessons, every breed should be able to get in the water.

comfortably. You always want that first experience to be fun, and not scary."

Which means never tossing your dog in the water and letting him figure out on his own. According to Godlevski, "Throwing a puppy in the water is not only terrible,

Godlevski says a life vest is always a good idea. She advises, "Buy a doggie life vest that fits your dog but it may, in fact, damage the dog's courage about swimming." Godlevski strongly believes that dog swimming is all about courage. Which is another reason for the life

jacket. A first-time swimmer in a life vest will have more confidence.

Even dogs who seem confident can end up in trouble. Godlevski says, "They often just chase into the water without realizing that the surface has changed." You don't want your dog to panic.

Godlevski says, "Dogs who run into the water for the first time, do so like a cartoon character running off a cliff. The drop-off is a surprise." Dogs in a life vest will float while they get their bearings and realize they can paddle. But the dog without a flotation device might panic, gulp water, and drown. Choosing a Dog Flotation Device

Whether your dog is a swimming breed just starting out or a breed who needs extra buoyancy, be sure to choose the most suitable life jacket. And even the experienced swimmer should have a properly fitting life vest. Your dog might become tired and the extra buoyancy will help. Finally, a doggie flotation device is essential for boating. If your dog falls overboard, there could be rough water or strong currents.

Look for a life jacket that is durable and waterproof. It should also be adjustable so you can ensure a snug fit. Consider reflective trim if you plan on evening activities. Brightly colored fabric is a bonus for visibility. You might also look for an extra flotation piece under the chin to help keep your dog's head above water. Ensure the device has a handle. This can help you lift your dog out of the water. Teaching Your Dog to Swim

When you start dog swimming lessons, it's key you entice your dog into the water. Godlevski suggests, "Bring a toy. If your dog will come to you from the shore or edge, you can carry the dog around in the water, holding the handle of the life vest, to allow your dog to paddle." Be sure to wear a life vest of your own. If your dog panics, he might climb on you.

Another method is finding a friend with a dog who is a confident swimmer. "Arrange a time for your dog to watch the other dog swim." With this technique, your dog can watch and learn, but even more importantly, see how fun the water can be.

Why Buy Expensive BBQ Grills

BQ grill manufactures are not going to make a gas grill or charcoal grill that doesn't have curb appeal. Why would they when that's pretty much all they have going for them other than the cheap price. While curb appeal goes a long way you need to open the lid and take a look at the most important parts like the cooking grids, burners, the device that's in between the burner and cooking grids and what material the inside of the BBQ is made of. Most gas grills, even the cheap ones, will have a decent set of cooking grids made of stainless or cast iron. Try to stay away from porcelain grids because the coating will eventually wear off and rust.

Cast iron grids require a little more maintenance like seasoning and keeping

them oiled but they hold their heat and sear meat better than any other grids. Stainless steel is the easiest to maintain and will still make nice sear marks. Burners are the most important part of gas through resulting in lower temperature and hot spots on the grilling area. Stainless steel tube style burners are used in the majority of BBQ grills manufactured and if made of high quality 304 stainless they

will stick to the burner do not
expect it to last more than one
season because they will rust
through quickly due to the heat,
salts and grease. Some cast iron
burners are alright if made from quality
iron but the burner ports will still have to
be cleaned out every so often because cast
iron will rust causing the port to not allow

will last 5 to 7 years depending on how often you cookout. The best is a cast stainless steel burner found in Fire Magic Grills and a few other brands.

Cast stainless will never rust and the heat, salts and grease will not affect the performance. The device between the burner and cooking grids sometimes called a rock rack, lava coals, flame tamer, flavor grid, heat diffuser and so on will

take the most wear and tear because it has high heat from the burners below it and salts and grease dripping from the food above. If this device is made of porcelain coated steel do not expect it to last over a year at best. Look for a high quality thick stainless steel product that has at least a 2 year warranty. Back to curb appeal, if you see an all stainless steel gas grill that does not mean that the inside of the grill

is stainless. Most all inexpensive stainless models will have a porcelain coated steel lining inside the BBQ and will only last about a year and then rust through. That will leave you with a pretty grill on the outside and not so functional on the inside.

Being in the BBQ industry I have carried a large number of BBQ grill brands including the inexpensive big box curb appeal grills. I now only carry brands that are made in the USA and that I'll be able to get parts for and parts that are under warranty when the time comes. There is no worse feeling to have a customer come back to buy parts for their inexpensive BBQ that they had purchased just a year ago and me finding out that the manufacture doesn't offer the parts anymore. So the question is, is it the cost or the price? If it's the cost you will pay more for the inexpensive BBQ Grill over time. If it's the initial price of a high quality expensive gas grill you do not like you should keep in mind that you will only have a onetime price and will not have to spend money keeping it up. And the most important part to me is keeping the same grill for years because I already know how it cooks.

Tony Saunders of Steelton, Pennsylvania, led state troopers on an odyssey on April 4, WTAJ-TV reported. Early that morning, officers stopped Saunders on suspicion of a burglary the day before. In the trunk of his BMW, he had a dead deer; when a trooper went to open the rear door, Saunders sped away and eventually got stuck on railroad tracks. He left the car and ran into a wooded area. Later that day, a school bus was reported stolen from Abbottstown, and again, police gave chase. Saunders finally ran away from the bus and through parking lots, shedding his clothing as he fled. He was nude when arrested. At some point, he had transferred the dead deer into the school bus: he told them he was going to use it for garden fertilizer. He faces multiple charges.

It's Come to This

"There will be no plans to hunt eggs again." So proclaimed Jessica Baer, the assistant manager of The Greene in Beavercreek, Ohio, after an Easter egg hunt went awry there on April 2. The Dayton Daily News reported that the activity, which was planned as a well-choreographed event for children, was ruined when people didn't listen to directions. Instead, during the time period restricted to 1- and 2-year-olds, adults ran out to hunt eggs, which prompted a free-for-all. Some people even allegedly pushed children out of the way or knocked them over. "This is absolutely unacceptable behavior," officials said. "We feel the community will be better without the hunt."

Siva Moodley, a pastor at The Miracle Centre near Johannesburg, South Africa, died on Aug. 15, 2021, Oddity Central reported. But until recently, his body lay at a funeral home -for almost 600 days -- because his family members were convinced he would come back to life. The mortuary couldn't move forward on a burial without consent from the family, who at first came to the facility to pray for his resurrection. "He was a well-known man and does not deserve this kind of treatment," the mortuary owner said. Finally, he took legal action to further the pastor's burial. In response, the Gauteng High Court authorized a mandatory burial or cremation, and on March 16, Moodley was finally laid to rest.

Compelling Explanation

In Dallas, grocery worker Coby Todd, 21, is sure that a "mischievous child ghost" pushed a shopping cart into his car as he was leaving work, Fox News reported on March 30. The day before, Todd had gone "ghost hunting" at a home in Frontier Village, Texas, and had sensed the presence of a "little boy" spirit, he said. He thinks the spirit followed him home and to work the next day. "Maybe he was trying to play with me," Todd said. He checked out the store's security footage to see who might have pushed the cart, and it does appear to suddenly turn and roll on its own toward Todd's car. The damage amounts to about \$25,000, and Todd said "it upset me. It's not fake." [Fox News, 3/30/2023]

As Meyers packed his son's lunch that morning, he loaded in a can of Guinness -- because the black can looks a lot like Liquid Death sparkling water. "It looks like sparkling water, but it's definitely not sparkling water," Meyers said. Other parents weighed in, with one admitting they sent "two packs of cigarettes in a bag of paper plates and napkins to my daughter's class." A teacher soothed the guilty parents, saying it's a common mistake. [Daily Mail, 4/3/2023]

Suspicions Confirmed

The Environmental Protection Agency released the findings of a study on April 4 revealing that more than 9 million lead pipes carry water into homes across the United States, the Associated Press reported. The survey also ranked the states in order of how many lead pipes are still in use; Florida was first, with more than 1 million pipes underground. Erik Olson of the environmental group Natural Resources Defense Council was surprised at Florida's position on the list because lead pipes were installed mostly before Florida's population rapidly grew. "We look forward to hearing an explanation," he said. The survey will be used to distribute funds from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.


