

Make it simple! Enjoy a day in the park. Pedaling through beautiful 80-acre Balboa Park in Van Nuys. Valley Salt Cave

hat is the best mineral for your body? Salt. A crystalline mineral, salt offers a myriad of health benefits.

Enter Valley Salt Cave in Woodland Hills. Valley Salt Cave works to improve its clients' health through natural, holistic methods. They offer salt treatments in a salt-infused "Cave" and "Rooms". Once inside the cave, you will be surrounded by



six tons of pure pink Himalayan salt. Cocooned in a soft blanket, you will sit back in a zero-gravity chair and float away for a relaxing forty-five minutes of Halotherapy, or Dry Salt Therapy; the infusion of salt into the air.

Dry Salt Therapy began in Eastern Europe over 250 years ago. A Polish doctor realized that miners working in the salt mines were not dying of the same lung diseases as the rest of the population. He did research and realized that it was due to the salt that they were breathing in.

Valley Salt Cave has a Large Community Salt Cave which is 45 Minutes long at \$35 per person. This session can accommodate up to 12 guests. Valley Salt Cave was started in October

So I was looking for something like what she had here in Los Angeles," says Kari. "I wanted to go to a similar place. And I looked around and there wasn't anything. So I said, almost as a joke, 'Why don't we open a salt cave?" And that's exactly what they did.

In the Salt caves, microscopic particles of pharmaceutical grade salt are pumped into the air. You breathe it in, and it acts like a toothbrush for your lungs. It also assists with inflammation, helps detox, and assists with stress and anxiety. Because salt is a natural mood elevator, it supports people with sleeping issues, because it lets you relax. "It helps with anything from allergies to asthma to sinus issues," says Kari. "It's also great for people who are recovering from mold in their lungs. We also have firefighters who come in after big fires."



INDIANA JONES AND THE DIAL OF DESTINY


oodbyes don't mean much in Hollywood. Death isn't reliable for characters or even actors. Technology, nostalgia and the value of brands and IP have created a nightmarish cycle of resurrection, curdling what we love.

And yet when Harrison Ford says he's hanging up Indiana Jones' fedora, you believe him. "Indiana Jones" producer Frank Marshall has also said that they won't recast the character, which seems dubious and, though well-intentioned, something he won't be able to guarantee.

Not that it would work. Any self-respecting movie fan knows the truth: The magic of Indiana Jones belongs to Harrison Ford. Apparently, he doesn't even need Steven Spielberg behind the camera, though, the foundation was well-laid for a veteran like James Mangold to step in. But there is no Indy without Ford.

It's hard not to go into "Indiana Jones and the Dial of Destiny," without a sense of melancholy - not exactly the ideal state of mind for a fun summer blockbuster. But it certainly adds poignancy to the whole endeavor.

If only it didn't start with that pesky de-aging technology giving us a 45-year-old Indiana Jones



being thrust back with a nearly 80-year-old Ford

(he's 81 in July) playing a 70-something Indy.



doing some of the wildest stunts we've ever seen atop a speeding train to boot. This sequence is there to introduce the film's MacGuffin, Archimedes Antikythera, a real celestial calculation machine with extraordinary predictive capabilities.

But we know the real reason: It's there to let us gaze at that familiar face and to go on one last adventure with the Indy we grew up with, before

something alcoholic in his hand and threadbare boxer shorts on. He's depression personified, retiring from the university where the kids barely pay attention to him anyway.

We'll have to see him work back up to his adventuresome self. No training montages required, just a plane ticket, his classic uniform and his improvisational spirit. The cumbersome plot (script is credited to Jez Butterworth, John-Henry Butterworth, David Koepp and Mangold) strains to justify and give meaning to the search for the Antikythera: The FBI is on the hunt, as is Nazi scientist Jürgen Voller (Mads Mikkelsen) for whom the war hasn't ended, and the daughter (Phoebe Waller-Bridge) of Indy's late partner Basil (Toby Jones) who was driven mad by the gadget. It's a bit much, as are many of the elaborate and murky-looking action sequences from the train in 1944 to a deep-sea diving sequence with killer eels. The movie hits its action high notes when it sticks to the tactile classics.

Waller-Bridge's Helena is an enormously enjoyable character, too — a brilliant archeologist who chose a more glamorous, dangerous and decidedly black market kind of existence, selling stolen antiquities to the world's wealthiest and working her way out of debt. She's introduced as a wild card and a lot of the tension is derived from whether Indy should trust her. It's a very good non-romantic pairing of sharp-witted old souls, a generation apart. But you'd think there might have been more time for one of our returning favorites, like John Rhys-Davies Sallah (he does get a few good moments).

"Indiana Jones and the Dial of Destiny" might not be "Raiders" or "The Last Crusade" but it's solid, swashbuckling summer fare and a dignified sendoff to one of cinema's most flawless castings.

n a saner world, we would have had a dozen Jennifer Lawrence comedies.

When aliens arrive they will go directly to IMDB to survey her filmography and wonder why one of Hollywood's funniest and charismatic stars spent the first decade of her career in dystopias, action movies and whatever it is you call "Mother!"

Lawrence has in "No Hard Feelings" made the kind of R-rated teen comedy that has usually launched young actors. She plays a 32-year-old Uber driver who, desperate for money after her car is towed, is hired by the wealthy parents (Matthew Broderick, Laura Benanti) of a timid 19-year-old (Andrew Barth Feldman) to take his virginity.

In 'No Hard Feelings,' Jennifer Lawrence relishes playing a 'messy and chaotic' character.

We've had plenty of movies about teenagers trying to get laid. But "No Hard Feelings," directed and co-written by Gene Stupnitsky, may be the first in which the teen in question has no desire to do so. Lawrence like this is potentially a good way

to sever any possible connection the audience has with one of your main characters. It's like having him smack a child. Some things are unforgiveable. Maddie and Percy go on

a series of increasingly intimate dates, and Percy vows to eventually "put out."

The basis all around, is fairly untenable. Even less believable than Percy's response to Maddie is her involvement in this scheme in the first place.

Maddie, forced to rollerblade to her bartending job, may be desperate. But, say what you will about the gig economy, it offers plenty of alternatives to earning money besides sleeping with teenagers.

And yet, "No Hard Feelings" works better than it ought to. The preposterousness is part of the joke. Feldman, who resembles the awkward Linguini of "Ratatouille" brought to life, brings sensitivity to the role, and good comic timing. So uncomfortable is he on their dates that at the sound of a nearby game of pool, he jumps Skinny dipping in the ocean, he doggy paddles.

And while the role forces Lawrence into raunchy situations, "No Hard Feelings" gives her room to showcase her talent. She delights in undercutting her own sexiness.

While "No Hard Feelings" finally gives Lawrence a platform for slapstick humor, it also feels like she's been inserted into the framework of a male coming-of-age rom-com/fantasy. Big-screen comedies are few and far between, so it's temping to applaud that "No Hard Feelings," simply exists.

Another way to beat the summer heat is with a refreshing cucumber cocktail, so take



1 pound farfalle pasta; 3 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt, plus additional for cooking pasta, divided;

Coat pork medallions with olive oil, salt and pepper then add to saucepan over medium heat. Add thick apple wedges to saucepan.

Add rosemary to saucepan and cook 2-3 minutes. Flip pork and cook 2-3 minutes until pork is slightly golden and cooked through. Let pork rest 3 minutes then slice into strips.

In serving bowl, toss thin apple sticks, carrots, red cabbage and green cabbage. Mix honey, mayonnaise, mustard and vinegar. Add salt and pepper, to taste. Mix dressing and cabbage; refrigerate at least 1 hour prior to serving. Top tortillas with pork, slaw, sour cream and squeezes of lime. Top with thin apple wedges.



ine tasting. Tasty cuisine. Stylish accommodations. Hot air ballooning. Now you can add "Wine-Bottle Art" and "Blend-Your-Own-Wine" to reasons to visit Southern California's award-winning wine region.

Sitting under a grape vine-covered arbor at Wilson Creek Winery (www.wilsoncreekwinery.com), I wielded a paintbrush, designing wisteria blossoms around the neck of an empty wine bottle. Seemed appropriate. This was spring in Temecula - and wisteria was everywhere. I was enjoying a "Paint & Sip with Pinot's Palate Temecula" (www.pi-

notspalette.com/temecula) session. Part of a fun-filled getaway arranged with custom luxury wine tour operator Tour del Vino (www.tourdelvinotemecula.com). A great way to enjoy "insider" Temecula without driving.

Guided by the owner, artist Ann Blount, we alternated between brush strokes and wine sips. Once the paint was dry, Blount inserted twinkling lights into our bottles and a faux cork with a light switch. Voi la - a "useful" keepsake. Afterward, we tried Wilson Creek's famous Wine Slushy, invented by second-generation owner Bill Wilson, and served in the Wilson Creek

Courtyard Bar & Grille. We also sampled their acclaimed "white" Cabernet, and Almond sparkling wine in the Tasting Room. Six tastings for \$25 and \$30.

Next, we blended our own wine. And learned something new! At The Cave, Southern California's first and only mined subterranean wine cave, 104 feet underground, at Oak Mountain Winery (www.oakmountainwinery.com). "Are you Right Bank or Left Bank?" our worksheet asked. Huh? Turns out this is French Bordeaux lingo, with "Left Bank" meaning wines that are mostly Cabernet Sauvignon with some Merlot; and "Right Bank" with more Merlot and less Cab. I went "Right Bank," blending

what a Cabana! With an outdoor/indoor bar, stools in the water and in the dining area, a kitchen, two BBOs, and a roof-top water fall!! "Dinner is served." Alex Prestifilippo, owner of Bottega Italia (www.bottegaItaliaTemecula.com), Gourmet Italia Ristorante & Lounge (www.gourmetItaliaTemecula.com), and Spuntino pizzeria, delicatessen & bar (www.spuntinopizzeria.com), was catering for us. We raised a glass - of vino from his Temecula Poggio Leano Winery & Vineyard - and dug in! A feast that demonstrated why his restaurants are Temecula favorites. From his amazing "Poached Pear" in port wine sauce to triangular-shaped Cannoli, with chocolate bits!

In true Temecula style, the next day we took a hot air balloon ride with A Grape Escape Hot Air Balloon Adventure (www.hotairtours.com). Acknowledged as SoCal's best ballooning conditions 365 days a year, ours was no exception. A glorious birds-eye view floating slowly - silently over wineries, citrus groves, estates, framed by the Santa Ana Mountains. After landing, I made another discovery. Journey's End restaurant (www.penchanga.com/eat/journeys-end), overlooking the Journey at



Pechanga golf course. The "Bananas Foster Stuffed French Toast" was one of the best breakfasts ever! French toast, stuffed with vanilla custard, whipped cream, candied pecans, banana brulee, topped with a banana and caramel drizzle.

The perfect end to a perfect stay.



6 oz. Merlot and 5 oz Cabernet Franc, for a spicy, tart, sweet taste. Afterward we enjoyed wine among the casks in The Cave Tasting Room, \$20 to \$25 for six pours.

We went luxury for dinner. A catered affair at the Vaquero Private Resort Vineyard (www.vaqueroresort.lodgify.com/en/overview). A great value at \$3,000 a night for this stylish eight-bedroom, eight-bathroom estate that sleeps up to 20 guests. The owners thought of everything. The infinity pool has a 53-foot water slide - but it's out of sight behind a hedge and empties into the lower-level pool, also out of sight. And

Angela Bassett And Mel Brooks To Receive Honorary Oscars

ngela Bassett may have gone home empty handed at the Oscars, but the two-time nominee will be getting a golden statuette this year after all – and in very good company.



Bassett, Mel Brooks and film editor Carol Littleton will receive honorary Oscars at the Governors Awards, the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences said.

Michelle Satter, the founding senior director of the Sundance Institute's Artist Programs, will also be given the Jean Hersholt Humanitarian Award.

"The Academy's Board of Governors is thrilled to honor four trailblazers who have transformed the film industry and inspired generations of filmmakers and fans," Janet Yang, the academy's president, said.

Most recipients of the honorary awards have not won competitive Oscars. Brooks, is an exception, having won an original screenplay Oscar for "The Producers." At the ceremony, in 1969, he said he wanted to "thank the academy of arts sciences and money for this wonderful award." In his speech, which had the audience in stitches.

The 96-year-old, who began his career writing for Sid Caesar's "Your Show of Shows," and over the next 70 years would write, direct, act, produce for film, television and Broadway and write books, including a

memoir, is the rare breed of EGOT-winners. He also received two other Oscar nominations, for the lyrics to John Morris's "Blazing Saddles" song and another screenwriting nod for "Young Frankenstein." which he shared with Wilder.

"Mel Brooks lights up our hearts with his humor, and his legacy has made a lasting impact on every facet of entertainment," Yang said.

Bassett, whose credits include "Boyz N the Hood," "Malcolm X," "Waiting to Exhale" and "How Stella Got Her Groove Back," received her first Oscar nomination for her portrayal of Tina Turner in "What's Love Got to Do With It" and her second this year for playing the grieving queen in "Black Panther: Wakanda Forever."

Yang said in a statement that, "across her decades-long career, Angela Bassett has continued to deliver transcendent performances."

Littleton's name might not be as immediately recognizable as the celebrities being honored alongside but has been working behind the scenes with top filmmakers for five



decades. The 81-year-old worked frequently with both Lawrence Kasdan and Jonathan Demme, editing films like "Body Heat," "The Big Chill," "Swimming to Cambodia" and "The Manchurian Candidate." She received her first and only Oscar nomination for "E.T. The Extra-Terrestrial," the only film she's edited for Steven Spielberg.

The honorary awards are given, "to honor extraordinary distinction in lifetime achievement, exceptional contributions to the state of motion picture arts and sciences, or for outstanding service to the Academy."

Satter has led the Sundance Institute's famed artist programs for more than 40 years, helping filmmakers at the earliest stages of their careers, from Paul Thomas Anderson to Ryan Coogler.

The Governors Awards will be held on Nov. 18 at the Fairmont Century Plaza in Los Angeles.

Grapes, Nuts, And Your Dogs Health

Foods That Fido Should Avoid

Magoo was a playful Labrador retriever who got himself into sticky situations..."

So begins a story in the latest report from the ASPCA on foods that may be toxic to dogs. Magoo got into the pantry and snagged himself raisins. The ASPCA never mentions Magoo's fate. But they do tell us that raisins can impair a dogs health. Who Knew?

Growing up, I regarded our family dogs as "the first cycle of the dishwasher". They were good about waiting their turn for whatever we left on our plates, and we weren't concerned about offering them "people food". It never crossed our minds that our dogs health

Why Are Grapes Harmful?

could be affected by table scraps.

As far as grapes and raisins, no one is sure why they're harmful. It's been confirmed that even grapes grown without fertilizers or pesticides can be toxic. But not to every dog, and not every time.

What we do know is that the end result in cases of grape or raisin toxicity is acute kidney failure. The dog ultimately can't produce urine, which means they can't filter toxins out of their systems.

So, your dog just scored himself a box of raisins. What to do?

The first line of defense is to induce vomiting and administer activated charcoal (it absorbs toxins). Vomiting is also the first sign that your dog is in trouble, so skip to the activated charcoal if vomiting has occurred. (you can make

your own charcoal by charring a piece of toast until it's blackened and crumbles.) Then call your vet.

Can't reach the vet? Call ASPCA Poison Control: 888-426-4435

The vet will keep your dog on intravenous fluids for at least 48

hours and monitor blood chemistry. Normal blood work after 3 days means your dog is in the clear. Nuts

Keeping a watchful eye out, of course, is the best way to keep your
In fact most nuts are not good for a pet out of trouble. Like children, dogs have a knack for getting into mischief. It's Not Just The Grapes...

There are other foods your dog should be kept away from: Chocolate

Who can resist chocolate? Like it your not, your dog. Chocolate is made with cocoa beans and cocoa beans contain a chemical called Theobromine, which is toxic to dogs. So you're actually being kind to your best buddy if you eat all the chocolates yourself! Cocoa Mulch

Cocoa bean shells are a by-product of chocolate production and are popular for landscaping. Homeowners like the color and scent, and the fact that the mulch breaks down into organic fertilizer. **Fatty Foods**

Fatty foods are hard for a dog to digest and can can overtax the pancreas, leading to pancreatitis.

Macadamia nuts should be avoided. dogs health since their high phosporus content leads to bladder stones. Mulch

Mulch isn't food, but there's one type tempting enough for dogs to eat. Some dogs are attracted to cocoa mulch, and will eat it in varying quantities. The coca bean shells can contain from 0.2% to 3% theobromine (the toxin) as compaired to 1-4% in unprocessed beans.

Onions

Onions, especially raw onions, have been shown to trigger hemolytic anemia in dogs. Potatoes

Potato poisonings are rare but have occurred. The toxin, solanine, is poorly absorbed and is only found in green sprouts and green potato skins. **Artificial Sweeteners**

Xylitol is used as a sweetener in many products. Ingesting large amounts may cause a drop in blood

sugar in dogs, resulting depression, loss of coordination, and seizures. Turkey

PETPOURRIE

Turkey skin is currently thought to cause acute pancreatis in dogs, partly due to it's high fat content.

Other foods listed by the ASPCA as harmful:

Alcoholic beverages; Avocado (the only "fatty" member of the vegetable family); Coffee (all forms of coffee); Moldy or spoiled foods; Salt; Yeast dough; Garlic

The Bottom Line

Thanks to a more educated public, fewer fatalities from foods are being reported. But it's important to keep up with what's known about foods and their effects on dogs health. Grapes and cocoa mulch, for example, were only discovered very recently. Of course, being alert and getting your pet to the vet promptly will help assure a happy outcome if something unfortunate should happen. Here's to your dogs health and good nutrition!

The Agony of the Heat

The hopes of Bangkok residents were slightly deflated on June 9, as a long-awaited art installation in Victoria Harbor lost steam. Dutch artist Forentijn Hofman's giant rubber ducky installation, which tours cities around the world and captured the affections of Bangkok residents when it visited there back in 2013, returned to the city earlier this month, this time with two giant rubber duckies, which the artist said would bring "double luck." Unfortunately, Yahoo News reported that rising temperatures put one ducky -- and residents -- at risk. The "rubber duck skin had become strained because the hot weather has caused air pressure to rise," organizers said in a statement. They deflated the duck as a precaution.

Two Paws Up, Way Up

Theatergoers in Thailand have a new pet-friendly place to bring their furry friends. Yahoo News reported that the country's largest movie theater chain, Major Cineplex Group, started offering weekend showtimes for patrons who want to bring Fluffy or Fido with them. Of course, there's a catch: Pets must weigh under 11 pounds and either wear a diaper or be kept in a carrier. Visitors turned out in droves for a pets-welcome showing of "The Little Mermaid," cosplaying their creature companions as Sebastian the crab and Ariel the mermaid. Not everyone's a fan, however; as one former resident said, "It's so ridiculous dogs are not allowed in (most Bangkok) parks but they can go to a movie or cafe. What comes next, you bring your dog or cat to a massage parlor?"

Almost exactly 34 years after it was thrown into the sea in Newfoundland, a message in a bottle was recovered in Quebec. "I was so excited. I mean, what I'm looking for all the time is a note in a bottle," Trudy Shattler told Saltwire of her discovery. After some social media sleuthing, she learned that the bottle belonged to one Gilbert Hamlyn, who was known for writing messages on cigarette packs, stuffing them in bottles, and setting them to sea. Sadly, Mr. Hamlyn passed away two years ago, but his son, Rick, was all too happy to hear of the bottle's recovery, and intends to place it at his father's grave.

A Florida scientist who calls himself "Dr. Deep Sea" resurfaced on June 9 ... after spending 100 days underwater. CNN reported that Dr. Joseph Dituri, 55, a biomedical engineer who teaches at the University of South Florida, began his research mission on March 1, when he dove to the bottom of the Emerald Lagoon in Key Largo, Florida. Dituri stayed in Jules' Undersea Lodge, an underwater hotel, during his record-setting stint below the surface, and he hopes that the data gleaned from all that time underwater will help researchers understand the effects of compression on the human body. "My greatest hope is that I have inspired a new generation of explorers and researchers to push past all boundaries," Dituri said in a news release.

Police in Clintonville, Ohio, are on the hunt after brazen thieves used a U-Haul truck to rip a safe out of a drive-thru ATM in the early hours of June 15. WCMH-TV reported that the suspects used a chain secured to the truck to pull the safe free of the machine, then absconded in a getaway vehicle, leaving the U-Haul behind. Authorities had no description of the other vehicle or how much money the thieves stole, but they believe at least two suspects were involved.

Emerald Downs racetrack in Auburn, Washington, switched things up on June 25 with a Grandparents Race, WMTV reported. It was part of Grandparents Weekend, where nanas and pop-pops received free admittance and could participate in prize drawings. About 25 grandparents competed in the race, charging out of the horse gates toward a finish line about 40 yards away. Two of the racers stumbled and fell during the sprint, but no one was hurt. Steve Butler of Everett, Washington, was declared the winner.

The Cotehele medieval house in Cornwall, England, was all set to be the site of a five-day cherry-picking festival starting on June 28, the BBC reported, but blackbirds foiled the plan. Laura Jarman of the National Trust said that 80 trees were full of the fruits on June 19, but two days later "the gardener came to tell me they'd all gone ... feasted on by the very cheeky blackbirds. They're so cute, we don't mind too much," she added. The site plans to host an apple-picking event later in the year.

MAKE A SAND ART PICTURE

e're going to make some art using sand from the beach! You can create all sorts of patterns and pictures without using paint.

Take a look at the art that interests you. What do you want to include in your picture? How about a boat, a fish or even your favourite ice-cream? Everything you want to paint is at your fingertips. So get started with your creative sand art!

You Will Need

PVA glue

Sand

Pencil

x2 Pieces of coloured paper (one bigger than the other)

Spoon

It's Time To Begin

Draw your picture on the smaller piece of paper. Go over your drawing with glue. Cover the glue with sand and leave to dry for 10 minutes. Gently shake the extra sand off the paper. Use the glue to create a pattern on the border of the big piece of paper. This makes a frame for your picture! Cover the pattern with sand and leave to dry for 10 minutes. Shake the sand off to reveal your pattern. Stick the small piece of paper in the middle of the big piece of paper. Ta-da! You've made a sand art picture.

For The Next Time

You could try using different coloured paper to create your picture. Don't they look good on the beach?!

It's time to take your sandcastle game to the next level this summer. For larger and more detailed designs, ditch the traditional tools you're familiar with and try these tricks of the trade instead.

Build a Better Sandcastle

Leave those flimsy plastic shovels at home and opt for the real deal instead. With these gardening tools, you can quickly set the perimeter of your castle and add a nice moat as well.

PVC Pipe

Use a PVC pipe if you want the base of your spires to look crisp and smooth. Fill a plastic cup with sand and dump it into the PVC pipe that you have placed strategically on the sandcastle. The trick is to add a little water just before you top off the PVC pipe and then finish with more sand on top. The water will help the sand hold its shape.

Funnel

Spires are an unusual shape, which makes them extremely difficult to replicate out of sand. There's a trick though. Fill a small funnel with sand and use the putty knife to help you drop the sand on top of the base you just created with the PVC pipe.

Kitchen Spatula

This is the perfect tool for blending your castle spire so that it looks like one natural structure made out of sand. Feel free to use it elsewhere on your castle that needs some finessing to look more realistic.

Spray Bottle

As you probably already know, wet sand is much easier to work with. It holds its shape better and you can do more with it. Use a spray bottle to keep the sand moist as you work. It can be the difference between a masterpiece and a lot of frustration.

Putty Knife

We mentioned earlier this can be used to help create the spires but it's also handy when it comes to building mini-stairs. Use it to carve out a grand stairway and don't forget to smooth out your lines to make it look as natural as possible.

Measuring Spoons

Want to add a unique design element to your castle? Top off your measuring spoons with sand and carefully place the half-circle embellishments at the top of your sandcastle.

Wooden Skewers

We're not done with the finishing touches quite yet. To really stand out, use



wooden skewers to add fun designs to the side of your castle. If you can draw it, you can carve it. Straws

You'll likely have some excess sand from your wooden skewer designs, and maybe elsewhere too. Reusable straws are a great way to blow the loose sand away from your designs so that they really stand out.

Paint Brush

It's time to put the finishing touch on your castle. Use a paint brush to make the base of the castle as

smooth as possible and free from any loose sand. Stick two mini-flags into the sand and you're all finished!

Shane's Inspiration - Griffith Park

Shane's Inspiration opened on September 21, 2000, in memory of Shane Williams who died of Spinal Muscular Atrophy. It is the first West Coast Universally Accessible Playground created by the Los Angeles Department of Recreation & Parks in conjunction with the Boundless Playground Resource Center West. This is a fully accessible disabled children's playground (Universally Accessible Playground) and it has plenty of super fun features for everyone.

Polliwog Park

The focal point of Polliwog Park is a large pond bordered on one side by a natural wildlife refuge, home to migratory birds and other wildlife. The large covered kids play equipment includes a large lighthouse inspired play apparatus with several slides including a spiral tube slide, water misters, a small sand area and three separate areas for younger children filled with colorful and imaginative climbing and exploration equipment.

Coldwater Canyon Park

July 7 - 20, 2023

Coldwater Canyon Park offers the best park experience in a gorgeous setting. The kids will love the wading stream to splash in during the warm summer months, and you'll love the chance of spotting a celeb tot or two under the shady trees.

Anthony C. Beileson Park - Lake Balboa

The accessible playground at Anthony C. Beilenson Park has two separate play areas, one section for two to five-year-olds and two sections for five to twelve-year-olds. All of the areas have a "Maritime" theme and feature swings, ladders, a variety of
